SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at 11:30 am. Expectant parents are encouraged to make arrangements for the program a few months prior to the birth of their child.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

In accordance with Archdiocesan policy, couples should contact a member of the parish clergy at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date to schedule your wedding date and for details regarding the preparation program.

Anointing of the Sick can be scheduled in an emergency or at an arranged time in a parishioner's home or care facility.

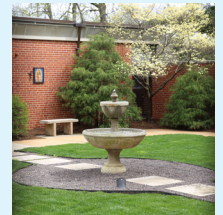

Spring, Sprang, Sprung! – Spring has already been a busy time at St. Peter (even though the season officially starts tomorrow, March 20). The **Men's ACTS Retreat** returned to the parish, highly charged with spiritual energy. The **SPICE St. Pat's Fundraiser** on Sunday, March 5, raised more than \$30,000 for financial assistance for the learning needs of parishioners in Catholic education and was also a lot of fun! Our school **St. Patrick's Day Parade**, in the tradition of Fr. Jack Costello, wound around the neighborhood on Friday, March 10, letting Kirkwood know of our parish spirit. And we continue to hold up in prayer the **candidates of our RCIA** as they prepare for full reception into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. What great vitality we know here at St. Peter! Hope springs eternal!

Prayer Garden Dedication – At the retirement celebration for **Msgr. Jack Costello** in June 2021, the parish gifted him with the naming of the prayer garden in his honor. The green enclosure of Ursuline Hall was one of his favorite places on campus. It is a serene and peaceful place that offers respite and reflection to all who visit. Next Sunday, following the 10:00 a.m. Mass, we will formally dedicate this space with a plaque. Please join us for this simple but heartfelt ceremony. Light refreshments will be provided.



Coming Up in the Faith – Please don't forget to keep our young people in your prayers as they get ready for the sacraments this spring. We have **99 First Communicants** who will receive Jesus in the Eucharist on two Sundays in April. And **89 Candidates for Confirmation** will be anointed with the Holy Spirit on May 11. I ask that you focus your prayer particularly on their parents, that they may always encourage and involve their children in the sacramental life of the Church.

Growing Pains – Since coming to St. Peter in June 2021, I have paid keen attention to the functionality of our parish facilities. The challenge of architecture is that its buildings must not only be aesthetically pleasing but also practical for the communities who use them. Structures built for one generation may not fully suit the needs of a new generation. I think you'll agree with me that we're seeing this at St. Peter: the school is at 110% occupancy, our growing ministries "compete" for meeting spaces, storage for organizations' materials is overflowing, and parish events that can't be held on our grounds sometimes have to be held at facilities off campus. I want you to know that the parish administration is seriously exploring the possibilities we may pursue in the future. Right now, we cannot do anything decisive until the Archdiocesan plans of All Things New are announced at Pentecost. Nevertheless, we are working on this issue, and I will keep you informed of developments in the coming months.

Transition in the Home Office – At the end of this month **Julie Carlson** will move on from her post as Administrative Assistant at St. Peter. Since October 2021, Julie has been the cheerful greeter to all who call or visit the parish office in need of assistance. We are grateful for her time with us and wish Julie well as she enjoys retirement with her husband and daughter. Thank you, Julie Carlson, for your service to the parishioners of St. Peter!
