

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

As many of you may have already heard by now, it was earlier this morning that Father Jack Costello left this world and entered into his heavenly reward. It's a mournful Eucharist for many of us to gather this morning. So beloved by this parish was Father Jack. Present with us this morning are some of his family, his siblings, and others. On behalf of St. Peter, we extend to you our profound condolences and sadness. Thank you for sharing him with us all these years.

Yesterday afternoon, having the privilege of being at his bedside and praying with him, his brother Pat identified three families Father Jack had. His first family is *his* family: his parents, his siblings, the nieces and nephews who adored him so very much. He was proud of them and proud of where he was from. *Where was he from?* New Jersey? Or was it Chicago? Or is it Kirkwood? He claims so many homes! But truly our sadness goes out to you for losing your brother, your uncle, your beloved family member.

The second, big family for him was his family of priests. And that's the family from which I knew him, even before coming here to St. Peter. For years, any opportunity as a priest to be in Jack Costello's company was a delight because you'd hear stories. (I don't know if you knew this, but he could tell stories. (a) To hear him tell a story about another priest was devilish, and he would get into it so enthusiastically. He'd start one story, then another story would come up about another guy. "I'll tell you *that* story when I finish this one! But let me get back to what I was saying." I feel cheated now that I won't hear from him more of those stories about the legends that went before us in the priesthood.

And of course, this third family is you, St. Peter Parish Kirkwood. Certainly, he's beloved by many other parishes he has served, but St. Peter has been in the majority of his life as a priest. And he would clarify it wasn't just the past 16 years he was here as pastor. "I was also an associate pastor in the 1980s, so that counts too!" he'd say. So, over 20 years here at St. Peter. I look out at you this morning, and I can't imagine how many more stories you have of him and the love he showed you and the inspiration you took from him, the direction, the counsel he gave to you, the company he kept with you, the encouragement he provided to you, the challenges he posed to you.

This coming May, he would have celebrated his 50th anniversary as a priest. 50 years! Can you imagine how many children he baptized, how many people whose sins he absolved, how many bodies he anointed with the sacrament of the sick, how many couples he witnessed their exchange of vows, how many people he laid to rest, and how many times he did this – preside at the Eucharist?

So we make our Eucharist today a truly thanksgiving liturgy: thanksgiving for the life and service of this servant of God, this successor of Moses, this priest of Jesus Christ. We give thanks for all he's been to us. If there are tears, it's not for him, it's for us, that we couldn't hear one more story or enjoy one more smile from him, or one more sacrament ministered to us from him.

Thank you, Father Jack Costello!




