They're not typical looking. They appear a little strange to some people. Others may say, "They're a little too modern for my taste." I'm talking about the Stations of the Cross at St. Peter Church. When he was building our church, Monsignor Westhoff kept with the artistic expression of the time. He chose local sculptor Rudy Torini to execute a unique set of figures for this Catholic form of devotion. A 1978 booklet commemorating the church's 25th anniversary says this: "The original Way of the Cross was placed on an eighteen inch band [on the west side of the church] with continuously changing colored background. These sculptures, very primitive and esoteric in style, caused such controversy that they were removed a few short years after the opening of the church building." When renovations Fr. Matt O'Toole were made to the church in the early 2000's, Fr. Brennell had the Stations reconfigured on the east wall as we see them today.





Whatever way they are depicted artistically, the purpose of the Stations is to help the faithful make in spirit a pilgrimage to the chief scenes of Christ's suffering and death. It has been one of the most popular of Catholic devotions, and its evolution has an interesting history.

The origin of this devotion is traced to the Holy Land. In Jerusalem the Via Dolorosa (or "the Way of Sorrow") was reverently marked out from earliest times and has been the goal of pilgrims since the days of Emperor Constantine. St. Jerome speaks of the crowds from all countries who used to visit the holy places in his day. There was no set form for the devotion in the first centuries. A desire to reproduce the holy places in other lands for those who could not travel to the Holy

Land, seems to have manifested itself at an early date. At the monastery of San Stefano in Bologna, Italy a group of connected chapels were constructed as early as the 5th century, intended to represent the more important shrines of Jerusalem. These may be regarded as the germ from which the Stations afterwards developed.

In 1342 guardianship of the sacred sites in the Holy Land was entrusted to the Franciscans. When the Church began attaching indulgences for pilgrims who visited the places associated with Christ's Passion. we find a more defined program developing that looks similar to the Stations as we know them. The earliest use of the word Stations, as applied to the stopping points on the way of the Cross, comes from the English pilgrim William Wey, who in the mid 1400's describes how the devout walked Jesus' sorrowful journey. Interestingly, it seems that up to that time it had been the general practice to start at Mount Calvary, the place of the crucifixion, and proceed backward in the storyline to Pilate's house where Jesus was condemned to death. By the early part of the 16th century this was reversed, and the more reasonable way of traversing the route was regarded as more correct.

With regard to the number of Stations, it is not easy to determine how they came to be fixed at fourteen. The devotion varied considerably at different times and places. Wey's account gives fourteen, but only five of these correspond to the Stations we know today. When one pilgrim visited Jerusalem in 1515 seeking to obtain the correct details for his set of Stations of the Cross, two friars told him there ought to be 31! The variations continued. And they are not all inspired by Scripture. For instance, the gospels do not tell us the number of times Jesus fell under the cross, and there is no mention of a woman named Veronica who wipes Jesus' face. Suffice it to say, the Stations of the Cross familiar to us are likely derived from the pious traditions that developed over time.

In 1742 Pope Benedict XIV exhorted all priests to enrich their churches by erecting this devotional item. Today, one can hardly go into a Catholic church and not find the Way of the Cross adorning the walls. The meditations on Jesus' suffering and death is also expressed outside of buildings and even with acted-out prayerful reflection. You may consider joining us at St. Peter this Good Friday at noon when we walk a living Stations of the Cross beginning on our parking lot.


