
A Word from Our Pastor | 3

What a Catch! – Lenten Fish Fries at St. Peter are famous throughout our region. We had another terrific year thanks to countless volunteers – too many to name here. But I want to acknowledge the leadership of **Joe and Luke Hesse**. They are devoted to making each Friday night a success. They shared a few statistics which I thought you might be wowed by:





- Entrees: 7,320 pieces of cod and 8,736 shrimp were fried in 140 gallons of oil; and *Fr. Matt O'Toole* 432 fisherman cod sandwiches were made.
- Sides: 970 pounds of French fries and 580 pounds of hush puppies; 1,575 servings of coleslaw, 2,860 servings of mac-n-cheese, 4,200 servings of green beans (the most popular side), and 1,380 Caesar salads.
- Beverages: 150 gallons of lemonade, iced tea, and coffee each week.
- Desserts: 57 pies baked and cut into 399 slices; and 50 gooey butter cakes and 38 brownies were cut into 2,112 perfect squares.
- The Clean Up: 2,290 dinner trays along with every fork, knife and spoon washed

Increased Offertory Giving – Thank you to every parish family that participated in our recent "Companions of St. Peter" program. It was an occasion to revisit how we each fulfill the work of stewardship in our parish. We had a 45% participation rate in those who returned a commitment card. (Most parishes average 30-35%) In another part of today's bulletin you can read highlights about the results of this effort. The generous hearts of St. Peter are very evident!

He has spent this academic year coming to our parish for Sunday liturgies and has given his time working with our youth ministry. We're grateful for his presence and service. <u>Vox Populi</u> – You have probably experienced the City of Kirkwood's "demonstration" experiment on Kirkwood Road in which the lanes have been narrowed down to one in each direction. is coming. Because this issue affects traffic flow, particularly around the already busy side streets near our church and school, I believe it is an important matter that warrants the voice of the people. Whether you are enthusiastic or not about the proposed narrowing of Kirkwood Road, I encourage you to share your opinion with our City Council. These words are not intended to endorse a particular side on this issue but to encourage engagement by citizens in the directions our local government takes.

NAME Week Of April 30, 2023

Are you good with names? There are some people who are just great at names — they hear someone's name for the first time and seem to latch on immediately. They won't have an awkward encounter the next time they see that person. But others of us, well, aren't so good. We hear someone's name and seem to immediately forget it. A couple weeks later, we see them again and are stuck with the ever-so-awkward crutch of, "Hey...you!"

Jesus was good at names. He was very good. Throughout the Scriptures, He calls people by name, whether proverbially or sometimes quite literally. Names matter to Jesus, because calling someone by name is personal, intimate, and real. When Jesus calls someone by name — and when we do, too! — He sees them and truly encounters them.

In our world of quick media, infinite scrolling, and para-social relationships, we don't tend to hear our names truly spoken very often. And perhaps with humility, we can admit that we don't call others by name very much either. But what would it look like if we spent this week renewing an intentionality about encountering the people in our lives? What if we refused to have surface-level, transactional relationships this week and instead practiced radical hospitality? What if we called each other by name, really seeing each other and extending an invitation to abundant life?


