I always heard one is supposed to wait until after Mother's Day. The chilly temperatures we had last weekend proves the unpredictability of the weather at this time of year. For centuries there was a lot of wisdom and folklore surrounding the prudent timing for planting crops. Farmers are keenly aware that a late frost can be devastating. In the wine-growing region of central Europe the dates from May 11 to 13 are known as the days of the "Three Freezing Saints." In sequential order, these are the feasts of St. Mamertus (d. 475), St. Pancras (d. 304), and St. Servatus (d. 384). Sometimes they are known as the ice or frost saints, and in Poland they're called the cold gardeners. Their place on the calendar comes at a touch-and-go time of

the year when the safety of tender plants in the fields could be lost to a surprise frost. If no ice showed up by this point, farmers knew they were in the clear.

Medieval Christians likened these three saints to pranksters lurking in their vineyards and orchards, capable of causing havoc with their way of life. Today we might find a new kind of menace foraging in our technology-driven culture. Such threats are the internet predators, cyber stalkers, malicious computer viruses, and identity thieves. Rather than frost stifling the life of a plant, these pernicious entities reach out from the anonymity of dark places and foil human lives. The motivation for their cruelty is beyond my comprehension. Many parishioners at St. Peter have gotten email solicitations from someone using my name asking for a favor, like buying gift cards. On a larger scale, such devious enterprises can cripple a family's finances, destroy the hard work of an honest business or even harm emotionally an elder person who innocently complies with these requests.

Like the farmer alert to the fluctuations of the weather, we must be vigilant about the technological fields so many of us now traverse. But it's not only cyber security that should have our attention. Our physical surroundings require the same vigilance. The tragic episodes of mass shootings in our country (over 170 this year, as of this writing) are happening so frequently, we risk allowing ourselves to hear of them as almost business as usual. When they happen close to home or affect particularly innocent victims like children in schools, then we are especially shaken.

In the gospel of Luke, Jesus acknowledges the wisdom of the one who takes appropriate measures to keep his worldly interests secure: "When a strong man fully armed guards his palace, his possessions are safe." (11:21) And yet, our Lord warns, there are evil powers that will try to have their way: "when one stronger than he attacks and overcomes him, he takes away the armor on which he relied and distributes the spoils." (11:22) The message: be vigilant! My thoughts here are by no means a call to arms. I'm personally not convinced that more weapons lead to guaranteed peace. Nevertheless, the element of surprise, namely that of the sinister kind, is a reality of our broken human condition with which we must contend. Some of the best armor for our security can be the invocation of God's accompaniment with us wherever we are.

It was Archbishop Mamertus who in the fifth century began the custom of rogation days – three days prior to the solemnity of the Lord's Ascension, when people processed through the fields, singing psalms and praying for good growing weather. "Rogation" comes from the Latin word *rogare*, which means, "to ask." Most of us in Kirkwood aren't planting fields of crops, but all of us have concerns about seeing loved ones grow and prosper. We do well to recognize God as the giver of life and the guardian of our daily chores. God also expects us to be good cultivators of this creation and custodians of His blessings. Let us be vigilant to the dangers of our world, calling on God's protection in everything we do, lest a cold snap surprises us and spoils what has been planted.

WORKS Week Of May 7, 2023

Have you ever heard the saying: "Preach the Gospel always and, if necessary, use words...", often attributed to St. Francis of Assisi? Well, it's quite unlikely that St. Francis ever said such thing — in fact, if you know anything about this radical preacher, you would probably come to the conclusion rather quickly that he wouldn't ever say anything like that! We *must* preach the Gospel with words — what we say and how we share it most definitely matters! But perhaps there is truth in this often quoted saying about what evangelization really is.

There are many people in this world (many that you know!) who might not be ready to listen to what you have to say. They may be hesitant, hostile, or just completely uninterested in anything you might share about your faith. And there may be even more who would be open to hearing what you have to say, but they have seemingly bigger issues in their life right now. Imagine approaching a neighbor whose house is burning to the ground and launching right into your witness story! Some people aren't ready for your preaching yet — they need to witness your **works** before they listen to your words.

You don't have to have a supernatural gift of healing to do the works Jesus calls you to do. (Though if you do have that gift, please use it!) Sometimes the works we do are small acts done with great love. Sometimes they are noticed, and sometimes they aren't. Sometimes they lead to a window opening and an opportunity to share your faith, and sometimes they don't. What matters isn't the "sale" — what matters is that you took the time to show someone who God is by continuing his works of love in the world. When you perform a work of love for someone else, you put on Christ who is always allowing the Father to work

through him. So go and preach the Gospel always — but when necessary, use works!




