A Word from Our Pastor | 3



With the issue of whether or not to allow the use of vernacular languages in the rites of the western Church decided, the bishops at Vatican II proceeded with the schema – or proposals - for changes to the Eucharistic liturgy. There were other issues in this matter that also proved to be contentious. One had to do with the reception of Holy Communion under both forms - bread and wine. Since about the Fr. Matt O'Toole 12th century, it had been customary for the



laity to receive only the Body of Christ. Drinking from the chalice was reserved exclusively to the clergy. The schema proposed

restoring to worshippers full reception of Communion, in keeping with the words of Christ, "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." (Jn 6:53) Some bishops, like Cardinal Godfrey of England, feared that a return to the practice of Communion from the cup would be interpreted by some people as the Catholic Church giving in to the Anglicans and other Protestant traditions who retained this practice. Other expressions of reservation were based on concerns about hygiene,

prohibitionists and reformed alcoholics.

Another restoration to the liturgical rites proposed was the concelebration of the clergy. In the narrow sense of the word, concelebration refers to several priests acting together in the administration of the same sacrament. Cardinal Spellman of New York was against such practice. He saw no need for such an innovation when, from his experience, parish priests had to celebrate several Masses on the weekend along with funerals and weddings. Spellman was on less solid ground in the judgment of theologians when he argued that concelebration would precipitate a loss of graces in the Church. His logic: when 100 priests concelebrated, the Church was 99 Masses "short." As before, the ancient traditions of the Oriental (or eastern) rites of the Catholic Church proved to be a valuable educator. These parts of the Church had always maintained the option of concelebration for their clergy, and its occurrence was not uncommon.

At this second session of Vatican II in 1963, the reputations of the American prelates were starting to come to the fore. On one side was those who seemed uninterested in the basic issues or were quite content with the way things were in the Church. This attitude was reflected, for example, when a fellow bishop questioned the unbending opposition to all liturgical reform by Cardinal McIntyre of Los Angeles. To this, the cardinal snapped back, "You must be a reader of Worship!" (A reference to a monthly journal published by the Benedictines which had been influential in spreading knowledge of the liturgical movement and was widely read by younger clergy. St. Louis' Msgr. Martin Hellriegel was a founding associate editor.)

On the other side of the aisle were leaders like Cardinals Ritter of St. Louis and Meyer of Chicago. Their Midwestern pragmatism was reflected in their calls for reform, and it caused them to gain stature among the American bloc. The dispositions many bishops had for what was happening at Vatican II was carried home with them and reflected in the degree of enthusiasm they showed in enacting the changes. This was especially true in the Archdiocese of St. Louis where Ritter fostered the liturgical renewal and prepared for the changes that were coming to the Mass. Already contemporary churches were being built with the encouragement of Ritter, many of them in the Mid-Century Modern style like St. Peter in Kirkwood. Other examples include Resurrection Church in south St. Louis, St. Ann Church in Normandy, St. Martin of Tours Church in Lemay and the Benedictines' Priory Church in west county. These sacred buildings reflected an aesthetic that would be suited for the new liturgy.



Coming in September 2023




As a person of faith, are you looking to challenge your thinking about racism, its causes, and its impact, while discerning practical ways to address it? If so, St. Peter has a program for you.


