





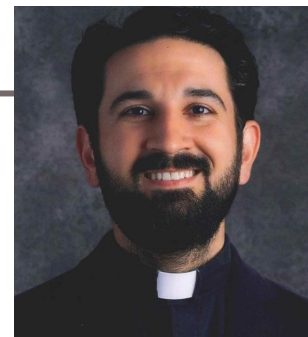

Clergy Bulletin Letter



Dear St. Joseph family,

Happy Feast Day of St. Joseph! I want to congratulate the group who completed the 33 Day Consecration to St. Joseph. Because it was such a meaningful experience, another group is being formed to begin the consecration on March 29, so as to finish on May 1, the Feast Day of St. Joseph the Worker. If you would like to join, please fill out the registration form [here](#). This group plans to meet weekly, instead of daily, to pray and reflect on the short daily meditations that you will read on your own from the book written by Fr. Donald Callaway. We have some books available to purchase for \$15.

Moving on to returning to the Basilica for in-person Mass, I'd like to remind you about my bulletin letter from a couple of weeks ago. In that letter, I highlighted a couple of important aspects of attending Mass in person and asked you to reflect upon your physical capacity to return to Mass, even if only outside. I invite you to continue to consider this invitation, as the schedule for returning to a regular schedule for indoor services continues to clarify. In the next week, expect to see a schedule for Holy Week and Easter.

In preparation for indoor Mass, we will be holding a training for ushers on Saturday, March 27th, from 12:30 pm to 2:00 pm. At this meeting, we will walk through the protocols, which are not complicated. I am asking you to consider coming to this meeting, even if you are not a current usher. Just so you know, I am asking that 7-9 ushers be present at each Mass. If we want to resume a normal schedule of 4-5 Masses on a weekend, that will require about 35-45 ushers. Right now, we have a committed team of about 25 ushers. So, you see the need.

On a more spiritual note, as the season of Lent moves toward completion, I invite you to take some time to reflect on how these last weeks have been. Has your prayer, fasting, and almsgiving led you to a deeper awareness of your need for Christ, and His desire to satisfy that need, like the woman at the well? If not, you still have a couple of weeks left. Come to the Basilica for prayer, especially on the next two Fridays from noon-7pm, and spend time before the Blessed Sacrament. Come to Confession on a Monday from 6-7 pm or Saturday from 3:30-5 pm. Do something out of the ordinary for someone, even something very simple, and you will find joy. Then you will be ready for Easter.

HE MADE HIS DWELLING AMONG US

The Annunciation and the Gospel of Life

The Annunciation celebrates the visit of the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of Jesus. On this great feast day of the Solemnity Of The Annunciation Of The Lord (March 25), we not only recall Mary's courageous "yes" to God, but we also celebrate the Incarnation of Christ, our Savior. For it was there, in the womb of a woman, nine months before the celebration of the manger, that "the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14).

The celebration of the Annunciation coincides with the anniversary of the papal encyclical [Evangelium vitae](#) (The Gospel of Life). This prophetic document on the dignity and inviolability of every human life was put forth by Pope John Paul II on the Solemnity of the Annunciation in 1995. The intimate connection of these two events highlights a profound reality about the identity and value of every human person.

Luke's Gospel tells us that by the power of the Holy Spirit, Christ would be conceived within the womb of Mary. It was there, in the womb of the Blessed Mother, that Christ first took on human flesh and made his dwelling among us. Like us, the unborn child Jesus grew and developed beneath the shelter of his mother's loving heart. Through Christ's Incarnation, God chose to share fully and intimately in our humanity and bridge all distance between God and man, so that we may dwell together.

The Church teaches us that "by His incarnation, the Son of God has united Himself in some fashion with every man." God desired to dwell among us, as one of us, in order to bring us salvation. This truth "reveals to humanity not only the boundless love of God... but also the incomparable value of every human person."

Each of us is made in the image and likeness of our Creator, to share in the very life of God himself. This reality "reveals the greatness and the inestimable value of human life." The human person is "a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory." Created through the love of the Father, each one of us bears "an indelible imprint of God." By sharing in our humanity, Christ invites us to share in his divinity, that we might dwell with Him for eternity.

Therefore, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel." Through Christ's descent to earth God desires to raise each one of us to the heights of heaven. May we recognize that to proclaim the Gospel of Life is to proclaim Christ, the one who made his dwelling among us.

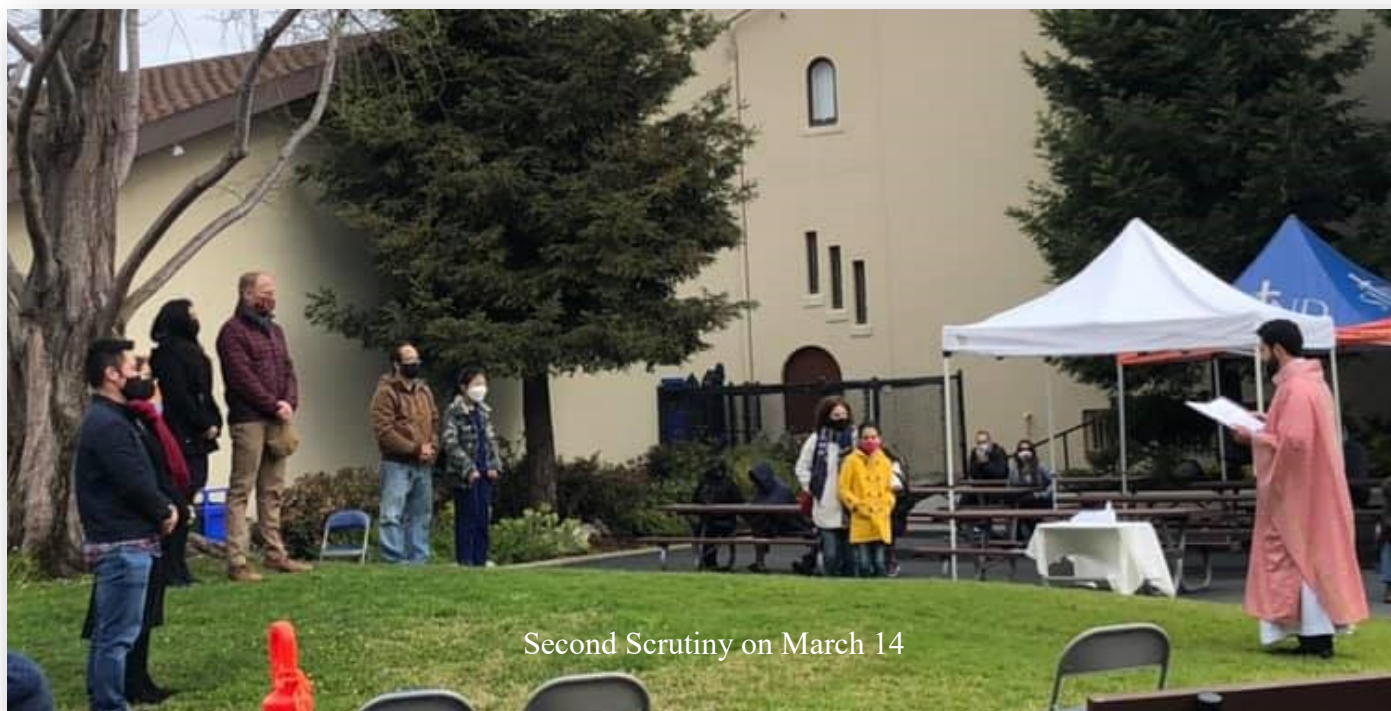

FEAST OF FAITH: The First Reading: Each Sunday, we listen to three scripture readings. The first reading usually comes from the Old Testament. "The New Testament lies hidden in the Old; the Old Testament comes fully to light in the New," we read in the Introduction to the Lectionary. "Christ himself is the center and fullness of the whole of Scripture" (5). On Sundays, these readings usually have a close connection to the Gospel. In this season of Lent, for example, the Exodus account of the thirst of the Israelites in the desert is paired with the Samaritan woman's encounter with Jesus at the well. Ezekiel's vision of the Lord raising people from their graves is paired with the narrative of Christ raising Lazarus from the dead.

The readings are taken from many sources - historical books like Judges, Kings, and the Acts of the Apostles, prophets like Isaiah and Ezekiel, wisdom literature like Proverbs or Ecclesiastes. But no matter its genre, the first reading always ends with the same acclamation: "The word of the Lord." The scriptures are written by human authors who wrote in widely different cultural and historical contexts, but these human authors are also divine instruments through whom God speaks to us. And so we say, "Thanks be to God."

Our Elect in their final preparation for Baptism this Easter celebrate the Third Scrutiny at the 9:30 Mass today, the Fifth Sunday of Lent. This formal rite of the Church “should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.” (RCIA 141). But the celebration of the Scrutinies should encourage each of us in the same efforts. Today’s Gospel (from Cycle A, required for the Scrutinies) tells of the raising of Lazarus. What prevents us from living the life to which Christ calls us? How can we help unbind others, so that they can live more fully?
