

## Clergy Corner



Dear St. Joseph Family,

Next Sunday is Halloween, so I would like to use this opportunity to look ahead to that holiday, cherished by some, misunderstood by many.

The name of the holiday pretty much says it all. Halloween is a conglomeration of the words All Hallows Eve, which signifies the night before (Eve) the day that celebrates all the saints (hallows), which is the day that is celebrated the day after Halloween on November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints. Just like we celebrate Christmas a little early on the evening before Christmas Day, so the Church has celebrated All Saints Day the night before, on “Halloween.”

The present form of Halloween has somewhat diverted from its original intention, however. Now we see children dressing up as their favorite superheroes and villains, or characters from movies and books, and heading out into their neighborhoods to ask for candy. And there is nothing wrong with that. I hope all the families in our parish who choose to participate in this custom enjoy it and enjoy it safely. Just do not forget that at its core, Halloween is a truly Catholic holiday.

When we celebrate Halloween rightly, we celebrate the saints, which means we celebrate God, for it is through His generous mercy and love that we are made into saints. Yes, all of us are called to, sainthood, to sanctity, to holiness. The word for ‘saint’ in Latin, *sancta/e*, literally means ‘holy.’ The saints were holy people, which is not something that they did on their own. Throughout Scripture, we hear the admonition to “be holy as God is holy” (Leviticus 21:8, Exodus 19:6, 1 Thessalonians 4:7, 1 Peter 1:16), but this does not mean that God expects us to make ourselves holy. Holiness is an invitation, a gift, to undergo a supernatural, divine transformation to actually become like God, to love like Him. The thing to remember is that the invitation should not be refused, for to become a saint is not something extra, like having sprinkles on top of your ice cream. Becoming a saint is essential to who you are, and who you were made to be.

Now, this does not mean that all of us are going to be “canonized” saints, that is, those people who are officially recognized by the Church. But we are all called to sainthood nonetheless. Another way to phrase this is “beatitude,” which can be translated as blessed, or happy. Jesus called all of us to the life of true happiness. And how do we get there? The Gospel passage for All Saints Day, the Beatitudes from Matthew 5, tells us. Sometime before All Saints Day I invite you to open your Bible and read Matthew 5:1-12. This is our “roadmap” for sanctity, for holiness, for happiness. The Beatitudes teach us to reject what the world tells us will make us happy, so that we can embrace the things of God, the things countless individuals embraced throughout their lives, people who are not recorded in the canon of the saints, people we will never hear of, but who are nonetheless heroes worth imitating. Just think of all the innumerable people who, out of love of God, served their families and neighbors, the poor and the outcast, who used their gifts and resources to benefit others; these “unknown” saints are the ones we celebrate with the canonized saints on All Saints Day, a day so important to us as Catholics that we begin to celebrate it the night before, on All Hallows Eve.

So, if you haven’t picked out your Halloween costume yet, consider dressing up as your favorite saint. And when giving out treats to the kids who knock on your door, consider giving them a blessing as well. We need all the blessings we can get as we make the journey from this life to the life to come, the life of perfect beatitude.

## Feast Of Faith

### The Sound of Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion, and then there is movement, a bustle of activity, as we prepare to join the Communion procession. This holy meal does not happen in silence! Instead, we sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We must change and move to receive the Eucharist, and fittingly so, since the Eucharist is transformative—it demands action of us, internal as well as external. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is also a profession of faith: “The Body of Christ.” “Amen.” “The Blood of Christ.” “Amen.” We acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist with our “Amen” of faith, but more, our “Amen” is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. We receive him not that he may become a part of us, but that we may become a part of him—part, too, of all the others who receive him, the whole communion of believers.—*Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. ### Reminder...

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith: the most precious center point of our lives. As Catholics, we understand that the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. Therefore, receiving Eucharist must be done so with the highest form of reverence:

- Approach with a bow
- When the minister says "The Body of Christ" respond clearly with AMEN.
- If receiving in the hand, support one hand under the other. Lift your hands at chest level.
- If receiving on the tongue, slightly tilt your head, open wide and extend your tongue.
- Consume the Eucharist immediately.
- We never “take” Communion. We “receive” Communion. This verb choice will help keep us in the correct mind-set.
