

## Clergy Corner

Dear St. Joseph Family,

Keeping up the theme of Black Catholic History Month, I'd like to share a couple more saints with you. Speaking of saints, I just want to say how edified I was by Monday's celebration of All Saints Day, and Tuesday's celebration of All Souls. It was so good to see so many of you come to church on a day when you were not strictly obligated to. For me, I love those Masses the most; the spiritual energy in the place is always buzzing.



The first saint I would like to share with you is St. Martin de Porres, whose feast day was on Wednesday. Martin was born in Peru in 1597 to mixed-race parents. The son of a freed slave woman, and rejected by his father, Martin grew up in poverty. He desired to enter the Dominican Order, but because of his mixed race he was prevented from doing so, until he was eventually admitted as a lay brother. Martin worked tirelessly to serve the poor and sick, which flowed from his intense love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. People often referred to him as "Martin the charitable."

Another black Catholic we should all be aware of, as she was an American, is Servant of God (which means she is on the way to canonization), Sister Thea Bowman. Born in 1937, Thea (born Bertha), was raised in a Methodist household, but desired to become Catholic at the age of nine, inspired as she was by the Catholic mission to serve the poor. At the age of 15, she entered the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration (are we seeing a theme on the Eucharist here??). Through the turbulence of the 60s, to her death in 1990, Sr. Thea was a voice for intercultural dialogue, ending racial divisions, and encouragement for all peoples to find their active role in the life of the Church. On a separate note, during this month of November when we remember and pray for all the faithful departed, I'd like to again remind the community about the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. On Sunday morning last week, I was called to a house to anoint a man who was nearing the end of his earthly life. It was a beautiful visit, with his wife and daughter by his side. I learned that he passed away that same evening, on the Eve of All Saints.

Contrary to what many people think, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not "last rites." It pains me when families wait until the last moments to call me to come and anoint their family members (if they even call at all). It seems that some people think that if they call the priest to anoint their sick loved one that they are somehow prematurely sounding the death knell. No, do not hesitate to call for the Anointing of the Sick.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick should be administered at the moment when someone finds out that they are in danger of death, due to sickness or old age, or those preparing for serious surgery. In this Sacrament, we are praying for health to be restored. Let us remember that Sacraments are always encounters with Jesus Christ, whose ministry was bound up in healing. In this Sacrament we pray for physical health to be restored, but also the spiritual strength to endure the suffering brought on by sickness, which can be physical, emotional and even spiritual. This is why it is ideal that the anointing take place when the sick person is alert, so that they can find consolation in uniting their struggle to Christ's own, as well as experience strength which comes from the Church that prays with them in solidarity.

What this means is that not everyone should receive the Anointing of the Sick. Perhaps we have our own spiritual maladies that deplete us and make us feel wounded and frail, but for those who are healthy in body, we have the Sacraments of Confession and Eucharist to heal our spiritual wounds.

These Sacraments are a great blessing to us and have helped many people on their road to sanctity. I hope you make use of them at the appropriate time. As a reminder, Confession is available on Saturday mornings, after the daily Mass, from 9am to 9:30, or until the last person has gone to confession.

## Feast Of Faith

### Concluding Rites

The Prayer after Communion gives us a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, of which we have had a foretaste in the Eucharist. The concluding rites speak of what we are to do with this great gift of God. That includes the parish announcements, which are usually given following the Prayer after Communion. Believe it or not, the announcements, which are not an "official" part of the Mass, have been included in the Mass from as early as the fifth century! The deacon or the homilist - even the bishop - would announce coming liturgical celebrations and encourage the people to participate. Today's parish announcements include opportunities for prayer, service, learning, and community building. They should be succinct and should include only significant events and activities in the life of the parish. But even when they are long and tedious, the announcements (and the parish bulletin) flow out of the concluding rites of the Mass. They offer us ways to live the Eucharist, to become what we have received - the Body of Christ, living and active in our local community. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright

As Christians, we hear a lot about the witness and service that we are called to render to the poor among us. However, the poor also have a witness and a service to render to us. Like the actions of the widow in today's Gospel, the openness and generosity of many of those who are poor, even in the midst of their own poverty, bear witness to the fact that, ultimately, we can depend only on God. Giving one's all witnesses that God will give all to anyone who trusts in divine goodness.

The poor or disadvantaged also serve. They serve judgment on our individual and corporate ways of acting. If people are sleeping in our streets, that is a judgment on our priorities regarding others. At the same time, the poor can act as mediators of salvation. When they care for others they can redeem our indifference and insensibility, lead us to care as well, and save us from ourselves.

### Faith Formation "On Demand"


