





Clergy Message

Dear St. Joseph Family,

Merry Christmas! I hope you had a wonderful holiday, and I hope you remember that the Christmas season lasts for two more weeks. Next Sunday is the Solemnity of the Epiphany, when the three wise men visited the Holy Family in Bethlehem. Then, the following Sunday is the Solemnity of the Baptism of Jesus. It is interesting that, during the Christmas Season, the Church asks us to recall a moment from Christ's adulthood. This is because Jesus'



baptism – His plunging into the waters and rising from them - was a sign of His coming crucifixion, death and resurrection, when He would offer Himself to the Father for our redemption. Thus, we can say, in an unintentionally macabre sense, Jesus was born to die, for by His death, we are set free. The Church's iconography depicts this by showing Christ in the manger swaddled like someone who is prepared for burial, bound head to toe, like Lazarus, whom Jesus raised from the dead. Ultimately, this is where our Christmas season leads us - to the Cross, and then to the empty tomb - and we would do well to remember this, as the stores will abruptly put the Christmas decorations away so as to replace them with the ones for the next money-making holiday.

The Church, however, asks us to linger in the Christmas season, to enter deeply into the mystery of God becoming man. Wow! What a thought. It can be hard for me to fathom these truths of our faith, which is why I turn to St. Paul for help, who provides us with one of the best explanations of the mystery of Christ's birth when he says, "For you know the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that for your sake he became poor although he was rich, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). The Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, Who enjoyed the fullness of perfection in Heaven, surrendered all of that, and lowered Himself, descending into our world so that we might be restored to the heights God intended us to enjoy. This is the mystery of Christmas, that "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). Christmas ultimately is about participating in this divine act of giving ourselves away for another, of lowering ourselves in order to raise someone else up. If we do this, we get Christmas right.

Thus, on this first weekend after Christmas, with two more weeks to enjoy and contemplate the reason for Christ's birth, I would like to share a letter I received from Stephen McHale, the pastor of Christ Episcopal Church, here in Alameda. Some of you may be aware that at this church our homeless brothers and sisters can shower and receive a warm meal at the "Warming Shelter." Now, this program is beginning again, and Stephen is calling for help. Our own parishioner, Monica Ballerini has stepped up to coordinate volunteers from our community. Please read Stephen's letter and prayerfully consider how you can be a part of this important ministry, which is very much a participation in the mystery of Christ's birth.

Dear Colleagues in Ministry,

Last week the City of Alameda, The Village of Love, and Christ Church struck a tentative deal to reopen the Alameda Homeless Warming Shelter in Christ Church's Parish Hall at the end of this month. The City is providing \$50,000 in funding and Christ Church has committed to raising an additional \$20,000+. All this money will flow to The Village of Love, which will staff the shelter each night. Christ Church is organizing volunteers throughout the community to provide dinner, breakfast and snacks, and volunteers to run the concurrent shower program. We're looking for volunteers from the community to help out with meals and to work at the shower program. We're also looking for donations of new sleeping bags, and new sweatshirts and sweatpants of all sizes. Shortly we'll update our Website with additional donations needed. And, of course, we're looking for cash donations to chip away at that \$20,000.

I'd be grateful if you could reach out to your communities and let them know about the volunteer opportunities. Soon we'll have a formal announcement coming out in coordination with the City and The Village of Love.


\$70,000 in funding will pay for 49 nights of shelter operations. If we can raise more money, we can operate more nights. We plan to be open every Monday and Thursday night, plus any night forecast to be 42 degrees or below, or with a 50% or greater chance of rain, until the money runs out.

Feast Of The Epiphany Of The Lord Chalking Our Doors Weekend of January 1 –2

Marking the door of you home with blessed chalk in the new year is an old Epiphany tradition reminiscent of the Passover in the book of Exodus. "Chalking" your doorway places God at the entrance of your home, entrusting your entire family to His protection.

Recite the prayer and follow by the inscription we make this year is: 20 + C + M + B + 22

The "20" and "22" stand for the current year (2022). The plus signs represent the Cross of Christ. The CMB represents the traditional names given to the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

Lord God almighty, bless + this home, and under its shelter let there be health, chastity, self-conquest, humility goodness, mildness, obedience to your commandements, and thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May your blessing remain always in this home and on those who live here; through Christ our Lord. Amen.


FAMILY LIFE

Christmas celebrates the Incarnation, the "en-flesh-ment" of God as a human person. In Jesus, God is bodily present in the human story. Today we honor the Holy Family, helping us to see that God is active in daily family life. God is near at hand, amidst the tensions, joys, and uncertainties of family life. As our Gospel passage describes, even with family miscommunications and with limited understanding of Jesus' mission, the Holy Family persevered in their life together. Like many family conflicts, there was no immediate or clear resolution of the issues raised by Jesus and by Mary. God's intentions for the family, and for Jesus, were still unfolding. They continued to stay connected with each other and with God. Within the turbulence of family life, they trusted God to actively sustain and guide them into an uncertain future. We are invited to follow their example.

Reflection question: How can I imitate the Holy Family this week?




