### “Our Call to Adoption”

The first time adoption came up was in the car by the Russian River in Sonoma County. We were listening to a talk on discipline, and the speaker, Dr. Ray Gurendi, mentioned his ten adopted children. Once adoption came up, it seemed to both of us the most natural thing to consider. Both Claire and I have adopted relatives, and at the time we had two friends in the midst of their own foster-adoption journeys, but it wasn’t until listening to that talk that we had ever considered it for ourselves. Through our family connections, and through our friends, God was preparing our hearts long before our heads caught up.

We read, prayed, and talked. Our son Jimmy was a year old at the time. If we were going to adopt, wouldn’t it be best if some of his siblings were adopted and some were biological, all in a beautiful mix? If we were going to do it some time, why not then?

We began the foster family program with the county. Eleanor was born midway through the process. When people saw us with Jimmy and Eleanor, sometimes they’d say, “one boy, one girl, a perfect family, are you done?” We’d joke that we were using “Providential Family Planning.” It wasn’t really a joke. Signing up to be a foster family was just a very visible representation of what is always true. Children, whoever they are, however they get there, and however long they stay are a gift of God.

There were a number of interviews as part of the registration process, and one of the questions that comes up is “how worried are you about getting a child with significant needs?” We’d get similar questions from friends and families. And though we realized that it could be and almost assuredly would be very difficult at times, we never worried about it. We felt the reassurance Jesus offers in the Gospel of Matthew: “Do not be anxious about your life...Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.” (Matthew 6:25,28-29). We believed that our families, our friends, and ultimately our Lord would see us through. We also took solace in the beatitudes. Maybe what the world was so worried about could actually be sources of blessing and happiness.

We completed the registration process after about two years. It’s not an overwhelmingly involved process, but it takes time, and we paused halfway through when Eleanor was born. One of the strangest parts of becoming a foster parent is the suddenness of it. You have no idea when you’ll get a call, but then all of sudden there’s a baby in the hospital that needs a home. All you have to do is say “yes.” You have nine months to prepare for your biological children; for Liliana we had hours. Our minds raced, but once again our hearts had been prepared. We said “yes,” with confidence and with a “peace that passes all understanding” (Philippians 4:6).

We took home our sweet 4 ½ pound Liliana. She was a dream baby, and even though we didn't know how long she would be with us, we felt blessed to welcome her into our family. In time we would learn that she needed a permanent home. We also came to learn that her older biological brother, Sirvon, was in need of a family too. We knew that bringing an older child into our home would be challenging, but Claire's mom reassured us, reminding us that "sometimes the hard thing is the right thing to do." We said yes once more.

The past two years have seen our family grow with the addition of these two wonderful children and another biological son, Isaac. At times, it has been far from Instagram worthy. We have had some wonderful highs and some disheartening lows. But throughout, we have felt the reality of the beatitudes. Even in our moments of suffering we have felt blessed.

Our friends and family have poured out support when we've needed it. Our children have grown as siblings, and we've grown as husband and wife. Our family today is like nothing we imagined before we began to talk about adoption in the car by the Russian River. There's an old joke that when we make plans God laughs. If God laughs, it's with the joy of knowing that His imagination and His plan for us is so much greater than what we plan for ourselves.

I think the contrast is stark when we consider the message of "choosing life" as opposed to "planned parenthood." Choosing life is a leap into the unknown. It's daunting, scary, and there's plenty of justifiable reasons to worry. But we're encouraged to act with faith, not fear. God is full of unplanned gifts He's just waiting to pour out. For us those gifts included two amazing children through foster care and adoption. It's our prayer that you're able to welcome whatever God has been preparing your heart for.

### Tuesday Nights Adult Formation



**MADE RIGHT BEFORE GOD:** Although the opening lines of today's first reading claim that the Lord "knows no favorites" (Sirach 35:15) and is "not unduly partial toward the weak" (35:16), the remainder of the passage makes it clear that the Lord does indeed pay special attention to the weak, the oppressed, and the orphans and widows. The psalmist reiterates: "The Lord hears the cry of the poor" (see Psalm 34:18). In the Gospel, Jesus claims that a tax collector is more justified in his prayer for mercy than the Pharisee, whose prayer was an account of his own righteous deeds. Jesus' point could not have been clearer: tax collectors in the Jewish society of Jesus' day were not just lowly; they were considered outcasts and cheaters. They collected taxes for the hated Romans and almost certainly collected enough to assure a generous income for themselves. Tax collectors were among society's outcasts; didn't this one just admit his own sinfulness? How could a tax collector be "justified" (that is, made right) before God, while the Pharisee was not? Why would God even listen to the prayer of a tax collector? This surely was a surprise, upsetting common assumption about righteousness. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
