

Clergy Corner

Dear St. Joseph Family,

A quick facilities update as this is the first Sunday of the month when we take up our maintenance collection. I'm sure you have seen the work being done around the foundation of the rectory. If ever the proverbial saying about opening a can of worms wasn't true before, it is now. We dug around the foundation to detect



the source of water leaking into the basement. What we found is that it is most likely being caused from irrigation. The plan is to change the irrigation lines to support landscaping that requires less water. What we did not expect was to find termite damage. Some of the wood siding at ground level had to be torn out and replaced, which meant tearing off some of the plaster façade. Now that the wood is repaired, the exterior plaster is being repaired too.

I continue to work on getting bids for security cameras and will make a determination soon. Stan, our business manager, and I are also working on getting bids to repair several sections of leaky roof. Thank you for giving to the maintenance fund. If anyone has experience in overseeing projects like these and would be interested in forming a facilities maintenance committee, please let me know. This would be a great help to me.

On to more substantial topics. November is the month we devote to praying for our beloved dead. It is a fitting month to do so since it coincides with the seasonal change in the Northern Hemisphere when trees lose their leaves as daylight wanes and darkness sets in quicker. That's symbolic on a natural level. On a spiritual level, the end of the liturgical year is upon us. As we look to the final Solemnity of the year, the Solemnity of Christ the King (Nov 20th), we are reminded of the end of time when Christ will restore all things. This is why we keep the reality of death before us now (memento mori in Latin, "remember your death"), and pray more fervently for those who have gone before us in death, with the hope that we will see them again. Our faith tells us that in death, life is not ended, but is indeed changed. So, do not be afraid of death; it is merely the doorway we will all walk through – in imitation of Jesus, the victor over death – as we make our way to our heavenly homeland.

To assuage any trepidation over death, I'd like to share a "poem" by Henry Van Dyke, "Gone from my Sight." My sister sent this to me, and I have begun to use it at funerals. People have commented on how the image has helped them grieve. Feel free to cut it out of the bulletin or pass it along.

P.S. Here are my expectations again for the month. Continue to work on #4.

- 1. Read the Sunday Mass readings during the week to prepare yourself to hear them proclaimed at Mass.
- 2. Wear your "Sunday best" to church. If we prepare the exterior well, the interior will follow.
- 3. Arrive to Mass early to calm your heart and mind with prayer.
- 4. Participate at Mass by singing and saying all the responses with boldness. This means every "Amen" "And with your spirit" "Thanks be to God" etc.
- 5. Have some kind of devotion to Mary; e.g. pray the Rosary weekly as a family, or daily if you can.
- 6. Stay close to the Eucharist.

Reflection: ETERNAL LIFE

What happens after we die? Most religions and philosophies provide some notion of this, but we are confounded by the mystery of it all. Today's readings give us a glimpse through the faith of martyrs and in the words of Jesus. In the Old Testament reading, the Maccabee brothers assert with total confidence that the God who gave them life would also raise them to eternal life. This was not universally accepted in ancient Israel. The Sadducees, who denied any resurrection of the dead, try to trap Jesus with a hypothetical riddle. Jesus, known for turning such things around, dismisses their unbelief, noting that even Moses knew that all are alive in God. Saint Paul tells the Thessalonians that we live in everlasting encouragement and hope, and Psalm 17 echoes this with words of faith that we will see God's face, waking in God's loving presence.
