

Our Father, Sign of Peace, Communion

Last week I took a short detour from writing about the Mass to discuss the Triduum of Hallowtide in observance of Halloween, All Saints, and All Souls. We're now back to the Mass, but we'll soon be coming to the end since next week's column will be my last article on the topic. We left off by finishing the Eucharistic Prayer, and now we move onto the Our Father, Sign of Peace, and Communion. The whole trajectory of the Mass leads us to communion, but before we step out of our pew into the communion line, there are three rites that help the assembly prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist: the Lord's Prayer, the Rite of Peace, and the Fraction Rite.

The Lord's Prayer, or Our Father, is probably the best known prayer in all of Christianity. The priest cues the assembly to start the prayer by saying or chanting, "At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say." We are given the words to the "Our Father" in both Luke's Gospel when

one of Jesus' disciples asks him to teach them how to pray, and in Matthew's Gospel during the Sermon on the Mount. In Luke's account, the prayer is preceded by the words, "When you pray, say..." The use of the word *when* indicates that Jesus is commanding us to pray, and to pray this prayer specifically. He didn't say *if* you pray, he said *when* you pray. This prayer is the only prayer specifically given to us by Jesus, and so it is prayed at every Mass.

Following the Our Father is the Sign of Peace, whereby we extend peace to those around us. The assembly greets each other "symbolizing their unity in Christ and love for each other." (Mass Explained, Dan Gonzalez, pg. 481) The Sign of Peace serves to express that "the peace shared in the liturgy is a direct result of the sacrifice present on the altar – the very body and blood that we will soon share. The peace we exchange with our brothers and sisters is not our peace but the culmination of Christ's mission as "Prince of Peace."" (Mass Explained, Dan Gonzalez, pg. 482) On our own, we cannot offer true peace, but we can extend the peace that Christ gives to us.


We then come to the Fraction Rite, which is performed right before the priest receives the Body of Christ. There is usually one larger host that gets fractured during this rite, which symbolizes the breaking of the bread at the Last Supper, and the breaking of Jesus' body during his torture and death. As the Fraction Rite takes place, we sing "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us," followed by the priest saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." Both references to Jesus as the "Lamb of God" indicate that Jesus is the sacrifice for us. In the ancient world before Jesus, the Jews sacrificed animals as offerings to God. To say that Jesus is the "Lamb of God" during their time would have been very clear messaging that Jesus was the sacrificial lamb. We don't continue animal sacrifice today because Jesus' sacrifice was perfect and fulfilled all sacrifice. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "This sacrifice of Christ is unique; it completes and surpasses all other sacrifices." (CCC #614) In light of the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus willingly takes on for us, we humbly reply, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." We acknowledge that nothing we can do will make us worthy to receive Jesus' body and blood, but at the same time we need it! Our spiritual needs are met even though we aren't worthy because Jesus knows our human state and lovingly pours out his grace and mercy so that we can receive him.

The priest then receives the Body of Christ and drinks the Precious Blood, thereby fulfilling Jesus' command to "do this in memory of me." (Luke 22:19) Priests follow in the line of apostolic succession, which means they have been ordained by bishops which can be traced back to the apostles. The book *Mass Explained* states that, "Today's bishops and priests – through apostolic succession – have inherited Christ's command to "do this.""



GROWING CLOSER TO CHRIST

Zeal with Purpose

In today's Gospel, John recounts the story of Jesus cleansing the Temple by driving out the money changers. Passover was near, and pilgrims were coming to Jerusalem for worship. They needed to exchange money and purchase animals for sacrifice, but the money changers were taking advantage of them, adding exorbitant fees. (The modern-day equivalent might be buying an international SIM card at an airport kiosk!)

Mark's account of the cleansing tells us that Jesus first looked around at everything and then returned the next day to act. (Mark 11:11-15) John's Gospel, by contrast, shows Jesus acting immediately.

In both accounts, His zeal is deliberate, not impulsive. Jesus' passion is ordered toward reclaiming sacred space and defending His people from exploitation. His emotions serve His mission. The disciples, witnessing this, remembered the words of Scripture: "Zeal for your house will consume me." (Psalm 69:10)

Jesus' example challenges us to focus our own passion and zeal toward mission; not ego, control, or "winning" an argument. We can be assertive without aggression, firm yet purposeful.

Feelings of anger at injustice or frustration over what's wrong in the world, or even in our own homes, can be holy when they are ordered toward love. The key is to pause long enough for prayer and discernment before acting. Sometimes it's as simple as taking a deep breath and praying, "Lord, enlighten me and help me to do Your will in this moment."

Zeal for God's house consumed Jesus, but it did not consume His peace. May we cultivate that same balance: hearts on fire, hands guided by holy wisdom.

Where do I need to bring holy order to my own inner temple?

Parish Food Bank: A Beacon of Hope in Challenging Times

As we step into the holiday season, our parish food bank stands as a vital lifeline for families across our community. For more than 20 years, our legacy food bank has faithfully provided monthly distributions of dry goods, nonperishables, and household products. Over time, this ministry has grown into something much larger—a true community hub of compassion and care.

Through partnerships with Catholic Charities and the Washington Area Humane Society, we now provide diapers for more than 80 children each month and food for over 1,000 pets. These additions ensure that no member of the family—two-legged or four—goes without. In 2025, our reach expanded further through a new monthly distribution in Charleroi with the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, serving more than 700 people each month with fresh, nutritious staples: two meats, eggs. milk, grains, potatoes, onions, and a variety of fruits and vegetables.

Our collaboration with 412 Food Rescue brings additional monthly distributions, and in response to today's realities—job losses, program cuts during the government shutdown, and the rising cost of basic needs—both 412 Food Rescue and the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank are stepping up with supplemental product to meet the

This holiday season, our food bank will also provide extra holiday items at distribution, while supporting our parish Thanksgiving meal and our senior activities around Christmas. These efforts ensure that the joy of the season is shared with every neighbor, especially those who may be struggling.

We are also blessed by our partnership with Hunters Share the Harvest, who began donating in 2024. This month, in November 2025, they provided an extraordinary 1,500 pounds of ground venison—all of which will be distributed very quickly. The speed with which this gift is received by families underscores both the depth of the need and the generosity of the hunters who share their harvest.

None of this would be possible without our extraordinary volunteer team, led by Chris Janney, whose leadership has transformed our food bank into a hub of generosity and connection. Chris ensures that when we have surplus food, it is shared with other food banks, churches, youth organizations, veterans' groups, and the Charleroi School District's Harvest Bounty program, so that nothing goes to waste. Her networking has also brought in new donations, including recent gifts from the Ringgold Boosters and supplies of soap and shampoo. Today, our team has grown to more than 40 dedicated volunteers, whose commitment makes this ministry possible.

With all of these distributions and efforts combined, our parish food bank is now helping to feed more than 1,200 people each month—a remarkable testament to what can be accomplished when faith, generosity, and community come together.

This ministry is sustained by the generosity of our parishioners and friends. Your donations—whether food, funds, or time—make it possible for us to continue serving those who need us most. As we enter this season of giving, we invite you to join us in this mission of hope.

ON FIRE FOR CHRIST



Today is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. Through this Feast the Catholic Church emphasizes that the physical church is a symbol of the living church, which is the community of believers and each individual as a temple of God. The Feast links all of today's readings, which feature Jesus cleansing the temple and prophecies of life-giving water, to the idea that the true temple is Christ's body and the living church built on his foundation.

The true temple is Christ's body: in our Gospel from John, Jesus' declares, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up," referring to his body and resurrection, not the physical building. Our second reading from 1 Corinthians reminds us, the congregation, that "you (we) are God's building," meaning believers are the living stones of the church, consecrated by God's Spirit.

The Lateran Basilica symbolizes unity: As the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome and the Pope's own cathedral, the Lateran Basilica represents the heart of the Catholic Church, and the feast is a reminder of communion with the Holy Father. Finally, in our first reading Ezekiel speaks of water flowing from the temple, symbolizing the





life-giving grace that the Church, through its connection to Christ and the Pope, provides to the world. Today, and every day, we are called to live our faith authentically, just as the Lateran Basilica has endured through history, to be living stones that reflect God's presence in the world.

Each of us is a unique creation of God and infinitely loved by Him. So many people are envious or jealous of others and wish they could be them or be like them. If you could be anybody in this world, why would you choose anybody but you?!? Think about it! If you were them, then you wouldn't exist and what a loss that would be!!!! For without you, God's special gift which He gave to this world, wouldn't have existed and all that you have and were to achieve in this world wouldn't be accomplished! So go out there and show the world what it would be missing without you! Go out and spread His Good News! Go out and form that radical love relationship with Jesus and be on fire for Christ!!

Soon it will be Thanksgiving, so start to offer thanks for everyone and everything you have been given by our awesome God. It takes 30 days to form a good or bad habit, so start today to acknowledge and love God more fully through a strong faith and persistent and humble prayer. God Bless. May God's many blessings be upon you and your family. I'll see you at His table.


