

A WORD FROM FR. LEVI



Grace, love, and joy to you in Christ Jesus our Lord!! Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent and we are just days away from celebrating the birth of our Lord! I pray that today your heart is filled with anticipation and excitement as we prepare for the one of the greatest celebrations of our Catholic Faith! Today is all about anticipation!

The Gospel today starts off by saying, "this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about." When we first read this, we might say, "wait, it is not Christmas yet!" As the Gospel goes on, we hear about a number of things leading up to the birth of our Lord, but the birth is not yet proclaimed. It reminds me of the time right before a wedding when everyone is so filled with anticipation they feel like they are going to explode! As children we were filled with anticipation to get new toys on Christmas Day! As adults, our anticipation turns toward the sacred mystery of the Incarnation!

Mary does not conceive a merely human child, but the Son of God! It is the Holy Spirit who overshadows Mary and bring about in her the child to be born on Christmas Day! What an awesome mystery?! Jesus Christ is both 100% God and 100% human!! What sublime teaching is this?! What an awesome invitation for the human race?!

St. Athanasius says that God became man so that man could become God! What he was saying is that in Christ, humanity and divinity are perfectly joined together! All of us through baptism are joined to Christ, and thus receive a share in both his humanity and divinity. Jesus humbles himself and becomes man in order to share the riches of his divine nature with all of us! Now that is something worth anticipating, celebrating, and pondering for a lifetime!!

If the above paragraph just made your head explode, I would encourage you to read the prayers of the liturgy from the Roman Missal for the celebration of the Incarnation! May our Lord grant you every grace and blessing that you need in this Advent Season as you prepare to celebrate the Incarnation of the Living God!

LITURGY PREPARATION

Fourth Sunday of Advent

The two penitential seasons, Advent and Lent, both lead to major solemnities of the Church, and call us to prepare by entering into the season in particular ways. During penitential seasons, the Church asks us to "fast" from things in the liturgy in order to make the upcoming "feast" more special. You may have noticed that we haven't been singing the Gloria during Advent (with the exception of the Immaculate Conception). We "fast" from the Gloria while we're waiting for our Savior to arrive. In fact, the first phrases of the Gloria come from the angels that appeared to the shepherds to announce the birth of Christ: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace to people of good will." It's most appropriate that during Advent we refrain from singing those words so that when we sing the Gloria again on Christmas, we are able to fully embrace the truth and joy of those words with renewed vigor!

You might also have noticed that until this weekend, we haven't yet sung "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." This beloved Advent chant is based on the "O


Antiphons," which are antiphons that are used during Vespers (evening prayer) from December 17th - 23rd. Each antiphon begins with the word "O," and expresses a title given to Jesus. (see graphic below)

To maintain liturgical coherence, we hold off on singing this chant until at least December 17th, when the O Antiphons begin to be prayed during Vespers, which is usually around the 3rd or 4th Sunday of Advent. When the O Antiphons are used during Vespers, only one antiphon is sung per day, but in the chant "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," all seven of the antiphons have been combined to create the seven verses of the chant. Interestingly, the first verse begins with the 7th and last antiphon, but once you get to verse two, they all follow in order.

The chant is especially appropriate for this weekend's liturgy since throughout mass we'll hear the phrase, "the virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." That phrase will be found in the first reading, the gospel acclamation, and the Gospel passage.

I hope the wait for everyone's favorite Advent chant leads to singing with great fervor at Mass this weekend!

GOSPEL

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son


Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.




GROWING CLOSER TO CHRIST

Today's Gospel gives us another angelic appearance and another fiat. A *fiat* is an immediate, total, and obedient yielding to God's divine will. In the Church, we often meditate on Mary's Fiat, her perfect *yes* at the Annunciation, when she responds to the angel Gabriel with, "Let it be done to me according to your word" (*Luke 1:38*) and consents to bear the Messiah.

Joseph's fiat, on the other hand, is wordless. In the quiet of an ordinary night's sleep, an angel appears to him and says: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name Him Jesus, because He will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:20-21)

As a righteous man, Joseph initially chooses mercy over judgment; he was planning a quiet divorce (Mt 1:19) to spare Mary from scandal. But his dream reveals a greater mercy: God's plan for the redemption of humanity. Joseph wakes up and immediately takes Mary into his home. No words from Joseph are recorded in the Gospels, yet his actions reveal a heart formed in humility, trust, and openness to God. When Joseph discerns God's will, he doesn't overthink—he acts.



During this final Sunday of Advent, ask yourself:

- Where is God inviting me to trust Him more deeply?
- Is there something good I've been nudged to do, but have been delaying or overthinking?
- How can I make space—through silence, prayer, or Scripture—to hear God's voice?

These reflections, inspired by the Holy Family's example, prepare us to receive Christ not just at the manger at Christmas, but in the messiness of our everyday lives.

Like Mary, we can offer God our willing hearts. Like Joseph, we can move when the Holy Spirit prompts us, even if our "fiat" is expressed not in words, but in a quiet, faithful action.

As Advent ends and we move into the solemnity of Christmas, I'd like to challenge you to pray the following prayer each morning: "Lord, show me where You are inviting me to say yes today. Give me the grace to recognize Your will and the courage to act on it."

By the end of the Christmas season, you'll have offered Christ not just a celebration, but an open heart that is ready to follow Him.



TEMPORALITIES & STEWARDSHIP

The Joy of Giving Back This Christmas

As we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ, our parish once again embraces the true spirit of the season: giving back. For the fifth year in a row, our community will be creating Christmas gifts for senior citizens in local nursing homes. Each gift — a blanket, cozy socks, lottery tickets, and a crossword or word search book — is a small but heartfelt reminder that they are remembered and loved. These care packages will be delivered to residents at The Residence at Hilltop, Havencrest, and Mon Valley Care, bringing cheer and companionship during the holidays. This year's efforts are being led by Michele Vidnjvich again, who has been in charge for the past few years. This is, of course, right on the heels of what she and her team accomplished with our Thanksgiving meal in November.

Our parish food bank will also expand its services this December, ensuring families can celebrate with dignity and joy. In addition to regular distributions, we will provide holiday vouchers for hams and special items to help households gather around the table in celebration. Chris Janney and her team do a fabulous job at fighting hunger and balancing the needs of the holidays.

The Giving Tree program will once again shine brightly. Hundreds of ornaments will be hung, each bearing the name and wish list of a child in need from the Charleroi and Ringgold School Districts and identified by local agencies. Parishioners are invited to take an ornament, shop for the child, and return the gift — transforming a simple act of generosity into a miracle of hope for families who might otherwise go without. This year's efforts are again led by Adele Pireaux.

Beyond these parish traditions, our wider community partners are also making a difference this December. The Dignity Robe team will be sending special deliveries to Hillman Cancer Center and select sites throughout the Allegheny Health Network, offering comfort and encouragement to patients receiving treatments during the holiday season. Meanwhile, our local Knights of Columbus hosted their **Warmth for All** clothing drive, collecting coats, jackets, sweaters, hoodies, pants, socks, shoes, and boots. These items were distributed from Marian Hall on November 29, ensuring that neighbors in need can face the winter with warmth and dignity.

Together, these efforts remind us that Christmas is not only about receiving, but about sharing Christ's love in tangible ways. Whether through a blanket for a senior, a meal for a family, a gift for a child, or clothing for those in need, our parish and partners continue to be a beacon of compassion and joy. I love how we show up for God's people.





ON FIRE FOR CHRIST



Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent. How is your Advent going? Have you been trying new ways to prepare for our Savior's coming at both Christmas and at the end of time? If not, maybe today is where you change your routine, your prayer life, your focus to be more on our Lord and Savior. Today you can become on fire for Christ!!

The first 3 weeks of Advent we journey through Hope, Peace and Rejoice (Joy). This week we complete our journey with Love. Week 1 focused on the prophecies, waiting for the Messiah. Week 2 focused on anticipating the Prince of Peace. Week 3 focused on rejoicing in the nearness of Jesus' birth (Gaudete Sunday). This week is about Love, God's immense love for humanity.

Our Gospel emphasizes Joseph's faith and obedience, the meaning of "Emmanuel" (God with us), and how God works through ordinary people in quiet ways, culminating in the fulfillment of prophecy through Mary and Joseph's trust, urging us to live with faith and expect God's presence in our daily lives as Christmas nears. This week we see God's plan unfolding in

humble situations, Joseph's decision to accept Mary's pregnancy despite confusion, and recognizing Christ's coming in the seemingly ordinary.

The Gospel highlights Joseph's silent struggle and ultimate obedience to God's will, even when it defied logic (Mary's pregnancy). He is a model of trust in God's plan, a cornerstone for family life. The angel's message to Joseph to name the child "Emmanuel" is central—God is not distant but intimately present in the world through this baby, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy. It also demonstrates the mystery in the ordinary: *Christmas isn't about grandeur; it's about God entering the world as a vulnerable baby through ordinary people.* We are called to see God's work in our own normal lives, not just the spectacular. Finally, it is about love and preparation. Advent prepares us for Christ's coming, a journey rooted in God's immense love, which brings Jesus into the world. This final week reminds us to stop, wait, and prepare our hearts, not just our homes, for His arrival. Like Joseph and Mary, we are called to accept God's promises, be open to His work in our lives, and live with faith, becoming signs of God's presence in the world.

This week I challenge you and your family to reflect on Joseph and how you respond when God's plans seem confusing or difficult. Do you trust and obey, or seek signs? Also, embrace the "Emmanuel" Spirit. Look for God's presence in everyday moments and people and be the presence of hope and love to everyone you encounter as Christmas approaches.

There's not much time left before Christmas. Don't fill your time with the hustle and bustle of last-minute shopping, buying and wrapping, decorating, or other activities that clutter your life and direct you away from God's plan for you. Take time to sit and be present with the Lord in prayer and quiet time and open your heart to His plan. I pray that you truly find our amazing Lord during this Christmas Season and may He set your heart on fire for His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Go and be on fire for Christ!

End your time together with prayer. Ask God to help your family grow in trust, just as Mary and Joseph did.

GROWING TOGETHER IN HOPE

A PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS

As someone who was raised Catholic, my family and I would go to Catholic Mass every Sunday and we would pray before we ate our meals. While this was definitely good and something that should not be taken for granted, I did not truly know or see Jesus as a real *person*. I saw going to Catholic Mass as merely a routine and something nice to do on Sunday with my family. As I got older, God began to be just part of my life. God to me was just a concept or an idea, but not a person to be loved. I was not intentionally pursuing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. But it wasn't until high school where I really began to ask deep questions about the meaning and purpose of my life and to seek the truth of who God is. During this time, I also had a false perception of who God is. I took the experiences that I had received from others and projected them onto God. By doing this, I had created a false image of God. This caused me to believe that the Lord did not love me, and that God was very distant from me.

What completely changed my life was watching the *Animated Stories From The New Testament*. Before I was even born, my mom chose to buy a set of the *Animated Stories From The New Testament* for my older brother to watch. My little sister and I would end up watching them when we were younger as well. What my mom did not know or realize at the time was that these videos would end up bringing about my interior reversion to the Catholic faith and transforming my life forever! It was by watching these animated Bible stories on YouTube that the Scriptures, the Word of God, came to life for me! It was through the Scriptures being presented on YouTube that the Lord really began to work in my heart and in my life. It was through the Scriptures that I came to understand the meaning and purpose of my life. It was through the Scriptures that I came to believe that God was real, and that God loved (and still loves) me, that Jesus Christ died on the cross and rose from the dead for me. And it was through the Scriptures that I came to know and believe who God truly is as He has revealed Himself to be in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. To

paraphrase the great C.S. Lewis, "In every other religion man seeks for God, only in Christianity does God seek for man." Just as a good father would do anything to communicate his love and presence to his child, Our Heavenly Father has communicated and revealed Himself fully and completely in Jesus Christ so that we can know with certitude of His love and presence in our lives. God has done everything in His power to communicate His love and presence to each of us in Jesus Christ. And Jesus is not a mere concept or an idea, but a real and living *person*.

The heart of our Catholic faith is our relationship with Jesus Christ! To describe what it truly means be in a relationship with Jesus Christ, Father Mike Schmitz says, "Faith is not a feeling... it's more like surrender, it's more like trust... it is saying yes to God. That's what it is, it's a relationship... It has to be a real relationship with a real God. Not a God of my own invention and not my own version of God." Because God has fully and divinely revealed Himself in Jesus Christ and through teachings of the Catholic Church, we no longer need to guess who God is and how God wants us to love Him. Everything that we need for our eternal salvation has already been revealed by God. Now is the time to respond to the invitation of being in a relationship with God as He has revealed Himself to be! Father Mike Schmitz speaks about this, saying, "This is the call of Christianity: God declares, "I am going to love you as you, not a different version of you, not a better version of you, not a holier version of you, I'm going to love you as you and I am going to ask you to love Me as Me." Who is God? God is love. God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. By having a real and personal relationship with Jesus Christ, the Son of God, we have the privilege of entering into the most beautiful and intimate relationship we will ever have and experience!


