

A WORD FROM FR. LEVI


Grace, joy, and peace to you in Christ! Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! We hear that Jesus was baptized by John in an act of tremendous humility! The baptism of our Lord is significant for a number of reasons. First, it is one of the few times that there is a manifestation of all three members of the Trinity at one time. Second, God, the Father, speaks the identity of his son over him in the presence of all, and thus prepares him for his three years of ministry. Third, Jesus is buried and rises through the waters of baptism in order to make a way for us to be joined to him! What I want to focus on in this article is the identity that Jesus receives from His relationship to His father.

Our identity is often something that we try to create or change through the things we do. If we play music, we can identify as a musician. If we play sports, we might identify as an athlete. That being said, our deepest identity does not come from what we do, but from whom we belong to. Think about it, we are first and foremost children of our parents/guardians. From the moment we were born we took on our parent's name and lived among them. That was not because we impressed them with our baby smiles. It was because we belonged to them and they belonged to us. Our deepest earthly identity is being children of our parents who loved us and gave up their lives for us.

Even deeper than our identity as children of our parents is our identity as children of God! From the moment of our baptism, we are adopted into God's family! We become sons and daughters of God our Father in Heaven, and our relationship with Him is the most defining relationship we will ever have! From the moment of our baptism, it is the love of God that roots and grounds our hearts!

If we have not had good experiences with our fathers and mothers, then relating to God, the Father, can be very difficult. That being said, we can also receive a tremendous amount of healing as we experience God, the Father's love for us. His love touches and transforms the wounds that crippled us into glorified wounds, which reveal his love and mercy to others.

If you struggle to believe that you are God's beloved son or daughter in whom he is well pleased, pray about joining our "Be Healed" series that will be happening the next 6 Thursday evenings. This will be a time of healing and restoration of our identity as beloved sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father!

LITURGY PREPARATION

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

This weekend the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season, although some traditionally orthodox people celebrate Christmas until the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd.

Jesus' baptism can be a bit confusing if you think about it. If baptism is a remission of original sin and the way to heaven, why would Jesus need to be baptized? Even John the Baptist was confused, because if you remember, John preached that he would "baptize you with water, but one mightier than I is coming...He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire." (Lk 3:16) We hear that when Jesus shows up to be baptized, "John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" (Mt 3:14) There are entire books dedicated to the reasons and implications as to why Jesus got baptized, but I'll pick out a few of the big ones.

Firstly, Jesus' baptism marked the official beginning of his public ministry. The same is true for us; we receive the sacrament of baptism before any other sacrament, as an initiation into the Church and life with Christ, and baptism also marks the beginning of *our* life's ministry.

Next, when Jesus came to the Jordan to be baptized by John, He revealed his identity as the Son of God. The three synoptic Gospels all detail a voice speaking from heaven proclaiming that Jesus is the Son of God. It's hard to get more official confirmation than that! As God's son, Jesus claims authority as the one able to take away our sin. And as is typical of Jesus, he teaches by example how we should be baptized.


Another important reason Jesus was baptized was to sanctify the baptismal waters for us. Jesus had no need of cleansing, but the water did. Jesus' sinless body being immersed in the water caused the water to become consecrated, and His Holy Spirit consecrates and sanctifies the water at baptism today.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explains in his book, "Jesus of Nazareth," that Jesus' baptism was the defining moment where he chose to take on our sin and plunged it under the waters. Jesus' immersion is symbolic of his future death and descent into hell where he defeated sin and death, and his subsequent emerging from the water is symbolic of his resurrection.

Each of our baptisms marked a very definitive point in our lives. It was the day that we became eligible to go to heaven and spend eternity with our creator. Go dig out your baptism certificate and check the date you were baptized. We should celebrate our "birth-day" into the Church and eternal life!







GROWING CLOSER TO CHRIST

Have you ever held a newborn baby in your arms? I have held my newborn niece in my arms in the past, but I sometimes imagine what parents must feel when they come to encounter their child for the first time. How precious must that moment be! The loving gaze of the father as he sees his child for the first time, the tears of joy that the mother cries as she embraces her baby after nine months of suffering and hardship, and the rest of the family rejoices at the coming of the newborn baby! This heart-warming scene is surely touching and deeply moving. The moment the child comes out of the womb and enters into the world, there is a moment of profound gratitude and celebration!


Just as parents upon seeing their newborn baby for the first time rejoice and celebrate, how much more did the entire family of God rejoice and celebrate at your baptism? The moment you were baptized, you became a part of God's family! The moment you were baptized, all of heaven rejoiced and celebrated you becoming a member of the family of God! At baptism, you became an adopted son or daughter of the Father. What makes someone a Christian is *divine adoption*. If you have been baptized, not only have you been cleansed from original sin, but you have also been divinely adopted by God!

In the Gospel reading, we hear that Our Blessed Lord has been baptized in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist. And after Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him like a dove (Matthew 3:16) and the Father's voice was heard, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). Before Jesus did anything in His earthly ministry, He received His *identity* from the Father. While Jesus was the Son for all eternity, He is now set to go on mission to save the world from sin and death as the Father's beloved Son. But the second part of what the Father says over His beloved Son should also strike us and challenge us. Jesus is always pleasing to God the Father. There was never a moment where Jesus was not pleasing to the Father. Jesus is the Son of God and Jesus is perfect love. Therefore, Jesus is the One with whom the Father is well pleased. The reality is that even though we are baptized, we have to ask ourselves, "Am I truly seeking to please God in everything I think, do, and say?" If we die in a state of unrepentant mortal sin, we will go to hell for all eternity. It will not matter if we are baptized or what we call ourselves. At the end of the day the only thing that matters is where we spend eternity. Who do we choose to serve? St. Paul makes it clear that "Those who are led by the Spirit of God are the sons of God" (Romans 8:14). Those who belong to God are those who do God's will and are led by the Spirit of the living God. What's amazing is that at the moment of our baptism, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit! We have everything we need for our holiness and sanctification, but we must decide today who we belong to and who we will serve.

Our identity is rooted in the Father and what He says about us. Jesus was so rooted in His identity as the beloved Son of the Father that He did not care about the opinions of others. Jesus' main priority was pleasing the Father and doing the Father's will. We are called to imitate Jesus in not seeking the approval of the world, but in seeking God's approval and doing God's will, since "The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever" (1 John 2:17). At the end of our lives, we will be judged by the living God naked and alone. Therefore, do not seek to please people, but rather, strive to please God only and do His will in everything you think, do and say. Stay close to our Blessed Mother and the sacraments of the Catholic Church. If you persevere until the end, all of heaven will rejoice over you once more just as a family rejoices over their newborn baby!

So how will The Loreto Project be involved at Saint Andrew the Apostle Parish practically? The last couple weeks we've shared a bit about who we are personally, about how our ministry was given to us by the Lord, and a bit about our mission. This Sunday we want to briefly share with you how we will be a part of your parish community practically.

To start, we will be providing contemporary music week in and week out for your community's 6pm Sunday mass. This style of music will provide another option for you and your community when it comes to liturgical expression. The Church is filled with many forms of beautiful music that serve the liturgy, and we will be pulling from this long tradition of music as well as modern contemporary music.

Our music has a very particular purpose, and that is to help your community to pray the mass. To fulfill this purpose, we will be carefully selecting music that helps point to the spiritual realities taking place and that helps your community sing and praise together. Many parts of the mass are physical signs that point to spiritual realities. Music in a special way is a sign of our unity in praising with the angels and saints in heaven. They are truly present with us at every mass praising the Lord. Through our music and invitation to sing along, we will help elevate this sign so that this spiritual reality becomes more apparent. There is a true spiritual beauty in a parish that sings together, and we look forward to helping foster that through another opportunity of liturgical expression within your community.

Later this year we will also introduce monthly times of Eucharistic adoration. During these times of adoration, we will provide music, exhortation, and reflection that guides the community in prayer - especially praise. We will share more about those evenings later this year.

So how will The Loreto Project be involved at Saint Andrew's practically? The short and sweet version of it is we will be providing music for your 6pm Sunday masses, invite you to sing with us, and start up monthly Eucharistic adoration. 



11:30am (Incense and Adult Choir regularly)


6:00pm (Contemporary Music)

The 7:30 will also be a bit shorter because there will be less music, so if you have a crazy schedule or are working on Sunday, this might be the perfect Mass for you!

The 9:00am Mass will focus on the family! We will have children's liturgy every week where young children can learn at their level downstairs in Marian Hall and parents will be able to focus more on the liturgy of the Word during that time. The children will be dismissed at the opening greeting and they will return to the Mass at the offertory. Patty Baker's group will play for these Masses once a month and we will also have the children's choir, the Laudate women's group, and the adult choir present at these Masses throughout the year.

The 11:30 Mass will have incense throughout the liturgy and the adult choir every other week! This Mass will also have adult servers who will add a certain dignity to the liturgy each week! The 6:00pm Mass will have contemporary music provided by Joseph and Mary from the Loreto Project! They play so beautifully and have a special gift from the Lord that helps others enter into a place of deep prayer!

While it will certainly be strange to depart from our old schedule, I hope and pray that the new experiences of the liturgy we step into will open our hearts in new, unexpected, and profound ways and lead us all closer to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus!




