

CLERGY

A WORD FROM FR. LEVI

Grace and peace to you in Christ! I pray you are well! This week Jesus says to each one of us, “You are the salt of the earth,” and “you are the light of the world.” What a power thing for him to say! We may hear that and say, “surely not I?” Jesus must be talking about other people. Me, the light of the world?

In the first reading we hear, “Share you bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; your vindication shall go before you, and glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard.” This list does not seem overwhelming, but the results of doing it sound amazing!

The Responsorial Psalm for this week says, “The just man is a light in the darkness to the upright.” My whole life I always looked to surround myself with people who were all in for Jesus; people who sought to live the ideal and were willing to sacrifice everything to follow the Lord! These were the people that I found not only illuminated the way, but also encouraged me to take the steps forward that I needed to!

Reflect on someone in your own life who has brought you closer to God. Can you see how the Lord’s love shown through them? Perhaps this week you could reach out to that person and thank them for their faithfulness to Jesus and let them know that their example has been a blessing/inspiration to you!

The Gospel says, “your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.” We love it when other people shine and inspire us, but many of us struggle to allow God to put us on the lamp stand. We may say to ourselves, it is humbler not to shine before others, but that thought goes directly against this Scripture passage. Remember that you are made in the image and likeness of God and as a baptized person you are a temple of the Holy Spirit! That means that Christ who is the perfect light is shining in you and through you everywhere you go! Don’t be afraid to let the light within you shine! As a child of God, you reveal to the world a unique and wonderful aspect of our Heavenly Father that no one else can share with the world, so do not be afraid to shine!

Live in service to God and your neighbor and you will shine! Feed the hungry, shelter the oppressed, clothe and naked, and do not turn your back on your own! Do these things and you will shine with the radiance of God’s own glory! May this week be filled with the goodness and glory of God! May you know your own goodness in Christ and may your light shine before others that they might glorify our Heavenly Father.

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time


When I was a freshman in college there was a bible study group I joined that was led by a female upperclassman. I remember looking up to her, thinking she was so confident, she was always so kind to everyone, she was smart, quick witted, driven, and had such a strong, beautiful faith. This girl was also an athlete, and I remember her talking about how she would sometimes come across hard situations with her teammates, like if there was inappropriate talk in the locker rooms, or if she saw her fellow athletes partying and engaging in dangerous behaviors, or if a teammate wasn't giving their all at practices or in the classroom. She was always there to encourage them to stay on the straight and narrow, and to witness to the beauty of what it means to follow Jesus. I remember being struck by how she so skillfully balanced evangelizing to everyone around her without making them feel any shame. She was so effective at drawing people to Jesus because no matter how many times her friends messed up and made bad decisions, she was always there ready to love them anyway. I'm sure she made a lasting impression on many of the people she encountered in college and she may have changed the course of a number of her friends' or teammates' lives with her example and witness. She really was a light to everyone who encountered her.

In our own way, Jesus calls all of us to be a light in this world. That can seem like a huge responsibility, and it is, but it doesn't necessarily mean we have to go out into the world and become missionaries in far off lands. If we focus on becoming a light that reflects God's love even just to those within our homes, families, and workplaces, imagine how we could evangelize to those within our sphere! The responsorial psalm refrain this weekend reads, "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright," (Ps. 112) and the Gospel says, "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." (Mt 5:16) There is so much dysfunction in the world, in our families, and even within ourselves, that it can feel like an uphill battle to do anything except sink into the darkness with everyone around us. Yet, we have the hope and joy of the Lord! We're called to be counter cultural and set an example that others will want to follow. If we are joyful amidst the drudgery and trials of life, people will want to know why, and how they can find what we have.

In order to live as a light in the world, look to the first reading today from Isaiah. Jesus, speaking through Isaiah, gives us instruction on how to allow our light to be seen. The light of Christ is given to us at baptism, but if we're to unveil it and allow it to shine brightly, Jesus says we must care for those in need, and then, "your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed." (Is. 58:8) The reading continues to instruct us that we must root out sinful habits and behaviors, while aligning our priority on others as opposed to ourselves, and then, "light shall rise for you in darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday." (Is. 58:10) Christ is the answer to all of the world's darkness, so do your part in bringing about the light!



TEMPORALITIES & STEWARDSHIP

A Night of Gratitude: 1st Annual Food Bank Honors Night Celebrates Service, Partnership, and Community

The parish hosted its first annual Food Bank Honors Night this past week, and the evening was nothing short of extraordinary. More than a celebration, it became a heartfelt expression of gratitude for the volunteers, partners, donors, and community leaders who make the Food Bank ministry possible. The room was filled with warmth, joy, and a deep sense of shared purpose as guests gathered to reflect on how far the ministry has come—and the incredible people who have carried it forward.

The program opened with a look back at the Food Bank's humble beginnings more than twenty years ago in a priest's garage at the former St. Anthony's Church in Monongahela. From those early days, the ministry has grown into a lifeline for more than fourteen hundred neighbors each month. Volunteers were honored for their tireless work—sorting food, stocking shelves, packing boxes, carrying bags, and supporting two monthly distributions that now serve hundreds of families. Special recognition was given to those who prepare food packages for children to take home from school and those who helped supplement the district's Harvest Bounty program.

The evening also highlighted the generosity of donors such as St. Vincent de Paul, Emanuel Baptist Church, and Deacon Mark Niscosky, whose ongoing support strengthens the ministry's reach. Strategic partners—including the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, 412 Food Rescue, Catholic Charities, Hunters Share the Harvest, and the Washington Area Humane Society—were celebrated for expanding the ministry's capacity in transformative ways. Representatives from these organizations were present and received warm applause for their leadership and collaboration.

A special moment of gratitude was extended to the Mon Valley Independent and reporter Taylor Brown, whose coverage has helped tell the story of the Food Bank's growth and impact throughout the valley. Community leaders in attendance, including Kristin Hopkins of the Borough of Charleroi and Heather Redd from Washington County's Department of Human Services, were also recognized, along with several elected officials who expressed their support from afar.

The highlight of the evening was the presentation of the first-ever Rick Puskar Award, created to honor an individual whose service reflects the humility, leadership, and deep faith exemplified by Coach Puskar.
