A WORD FROM FR. LEVI

Happy Easter Season! He is risen! On this, the third Sunday of Easter, we reflect on the awesome power of the Resurrected Christ in our midst! For the men who were walking along the road to Emmaus, the recognition of the Risen Christ was a journey! They walked with Christ who chose to walk with them, reveal the Sacred Scriptures to them, and finally made Himself known to them in the breaking of the Bread! This same pattern is the case for all Catholic Christians! The Lord walks with us, reveals Himself to us through His Word, and then opens our eyes to His true presence in the Eucharist!

When I was in the Holy Land in 2016, I had the blessing of going into the tomb which is placed in the same spot that the Lord's body once lay. It was an awesome experience to be there and the holiness of the place was palpable! That being said, the best thing about the tomb was that it was empty! As much as I felt the Lord's presence there, I felt it all the more in the chapel nearby which reserved the Blessed Sacrament! I marveled to myself that as holy and awesome as everything in the Holy Land was, it was not as holy as our Lord, whose presence I had known since I was young.

Through the course of my life, I had come to know Jesus, our Lord, quite personally. As a small child, the Lord showed himself to me through my parents and family in a general way. In my teenage years, the Lord revealed His presence to me through praise, the Sacred Scriptures, and the Blessed Sacrament. When I was in my late 20s, I made a 30 day silent retreat at Sacred Heart retreat center in Denver. It was then that I realized that wherever the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament was, I was home!

I was very blessed a few weeks ago as one of our parishioners left Mass and said to me, "Father, I always wondered what it would have been like to encounter the Risen Christ 2000 year ago, but now I know that it would be just like when I encounter Him at Mass!" He was exactly right! It is the Risen Christ who meets us, intercedes for us, speaks to us, and give us His Body and Blood at every Mass!

Each of us has a unique experience of God and relationship with Him! Each of us is walking on the journey of life together with our Lord! If you have not had a profound encounter with Him yet, ask him for the gift of faith and pray about attending this year's Life in the Spirit Seminar. If you have an active and lively relationship with our Lord, then ask the Lord to bring you to new depths of knowing and loving Him this year!

May our hearts burn within us as we walk along the way and may we always recognize our Lord and greatest love through the Sacred Scriptures and the Breaking of the Bread!

LITURGY PREPARATION

Third Sunday of Easter

Every year throughout the Easter season (Easter Sunday through Pentecost) the First Reading at Mass is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. We will hear small sections from this book in the coming weeks, but if you were to read Acts in its entirety, you would get a glimpse into the ministry of the apostles following Jesus' death and resurrection, as well as a look at the way the early Church functioned from the very beginning.

In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter addresses the Jews and non-Jewish Israelites with the incredible news of Jesus' resurrection. It's hard to imagine how one would explain the news of the resurrection. Jesus was put to death in a very public way and many people witnessed his death, so who could believe that he had risen? All of us have probably grown up hearing and learning that Jesus rose from the dead, so that fact may not strike us very hard, but can you imagine hearing that news in real time? Jesus' miracles of healing and even of raising Lazarus from the dead were one thing, but to have the power to come back from the dead *himself* is something entirely deeper.

In order to explain how the resurrection could be true, Peter uses a two-pronged approach in the passage we hear today: first, he recalls a prophecy given to King David which reveals that Jesus would not succumb to death, but would be raised up, and secondly, Peter and all the apostles present themselves as personal eyewitnesses of Jesus' risen state. Both of these things, the prophecy and the real-life witness, are essential to prove that Jesus is truly the risen Son of God.

Peter begins first with Jesus' humanity and recounted how God had worked through him "with mighty deed, wonders, and signs...as you yourselves know." (Acts 2:22) So far, this statement only proves that God worked through Jesus to perform those mighty deeds, not that Jesus was God himself, so Peter continues with the prophecy from David. This particular prophecy is interpreted as Jesus speaking *through* David and not as David speaking on his own. This prophesy, which you'll hear in the first reading and the responsorial psalm, states in part: "You will not abandon my soul to the netherworld, nor will you suffer your holy one to see corruption." (Ps 16:10)

Peter points out that David is not saying those words because David had died 1,000 years prior and Peter reminds his listeners that, "his tomb is in our midst to this day." (Acts 2:29) David's body did see physical corruption in the form of human decay, which the Jews believed started on the fourth day after death. Jesus, who was raised on the third day, did not see corruption.

Next, Peter presents himself and the other apostles as witnesses to the empty tomb and Jesus' risen body. This account is critical because without the empty tomb and sight of Jesus' body there is no hope of the resurrection. The combination of the fulfillment of every historical prophesy about the Messiah, coupled with the firsthand account of Jesus' apostles, led many to the realization that the Savior of the world had indeed come! The resurrection definitively conquered death and means that one day we too can have a share in the resurrection and one day we'll also be raised up to glory!

GOSPEL

LUKE 24:13-35

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described,

but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

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FAITH IN FILM MINISTRY

In today's Gospel, the disciples are on the road to Emmaus and spend time with a man who they initially perceive as a stranger. But in the breaking of the bread, their eyes are opened and they recognize Jesus, their risen Lord.

As we move through our days, where do we recognize Jesus? Do we see Him in our family members and friends? Do we see Him in our fellow parishioners? Do we recognize Him present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist?

Our Formation Team's hope is that the programming we develop will bring you closer to Jesus and help set your heart on fire.

This week, I'm sharing my column with Helen Bednarczyk who will tell you about our Faith and Film Ministry. I've had parishioners tell me how participating in the ministry has deepened their faith and gave them a new perspective on the Gospels.

The Chosen is much more than watching a movie. The episodes are meant to introduce you to both the human side of Jesus and take you into the eyes and ears of those people who have chosen to follow Jesus.

In Season 1 which we will be finishing at the April meeting we were introduced to the beginning of Jesus' ministry, the choosing of His disciples (Andrew, Simon, James and John, Mary Magdala and Matthew) and their witnessing His miracles (Mary cured of 7 demons, the wedding at Cana, changing of water into wine, the cleansing of the leper and the curing of the paralytic) and His teachings of love, prayer, justice, compassion, faith and wisdom to the children.

The belief is while watching the Chosen you too will be changed or impacted just like those who chose to follow Him. The more time you spend with Jesus the more you get to know him.

The Chosen is filled with key Scripture passages that will take you deeper into your faith. Wherever you are spiritually on your journey, an observer, a skeptic, a learner, a seeker or a follower we hope that you will join us as we begin our second season of episodes and become one of His Chosen. The second DVD is called "Hope for the Lost."

ADDICTION RECOVERY MINISTRY

Hello! My name is John Dimoff, and I have been a member of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish since 2021. I was excited to learn that our parish was starting an Addiction Recovery Ministry because this is a topic that's near and dear to me. As background: I completed a bachelor's degree in Psychology from the University of Pittsburgh in May of 2007 and, one week later, began working as a research assistant in an alcohol and smoking research laboratory. I worked in that role for over five years, after which I applied to the University of Pittsburgh's joint Ph.D. program in Clinical and Biological-Health Psychology. Happily, I was admitted into the program in 2012 and completed my Ph.D. in 2019 (which, believe it or not, is considered "on time" for that kind of Ph.D.!) Since then, I have been working at Chatham University as an Assistant (soon to be Associate) Professor of Graduate Psychology.



It is fair to say that I have spent the past 19 years researching, teaching, and treating addictions. As a researcher, I have worked on projects funded by such federal agencies as the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism and the National Institute on Drug Abuse. As a practitioner, I trained at such sites as UPMC Western Psychiatric Hospital's Addiction Medicine Services Dual Diagnosis Unit and the VA Western New York Healthcare System's Substance Abuse Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program. To say that I am thankful for those opportunities would be an understatement, as they taught me an incredible amount about addictions (although I also recognize that there is always more to learn!). With that in mind, the Addiction Recovery Ministry team (Father Levi, Seminarian Mark, Nancy Cole, and Deacon Tim Noca of the Diocese of Pittsburgh) has kindly invited me to share some information about addictions in an upcoming series of articles, which I'm grateful for & excited about!

Now that I've introduced myself, I'd like to focus on a (deceptively) simple question: *What is addiction?* My favorite definition comes from the American Psychological Association's Dictionary of Psychology, which defines *addiction* as "a state of psychological and/or physical dependence on the use of drugs or other substances ... or on activities or behaviors. The term is often used as an equivalent term for substance use disorder or substance dependence and can be applied to non-substance-related behavioral addictions." It's not a long definition, but it gives us a lot of information to unpack! Most notably:

- Addiction is more than just physical dependence. Yes, that's often part of an addiction, but it's rarely the only part.
- People can be addicted to more than just drugs. For example, gambling has a compulsive quality to it that can also feel outside our control.
- "Addiction" is an everyday term, not a formal diagnosis. Examples of formal diagnoses include "alcohol use disorder," "gambling disorder," and "opioid use disorder," among others.

I really like this definition because it casts a wide net, so to speak. The only thing I would consider adding to it is that addictions are highly (and harmfully!) stigmatized, which will be the focus of my next article...

FAMILY CONNECTION

Families are often called the *domestic church*, and one simple way to live this out is by making time together—especially meals—a moment to grow closer to one another and to Jesus. Around the table, we share our stories, listen to each other, and can begin to see how God is present in our everyday lives.

Set aside one meal this week to be a little more intentional. You might invite everyone to help plan or prepare the meal. Begin by reading **Luke 24:13-35**, the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus.

As you eat, talk together about the Gospel:

- What were the disciples feeling as they talked about what had happened in Jerusalem?

How did their understanding change when Jesus explained things to them?

Then invite each family member to share something from their own week—something joyful, challenging, or meaningful. As each person shares, take a moment to wonder together:

- What might Jesus say if He were sitting at your table?
- How might He help us see things in a new way?

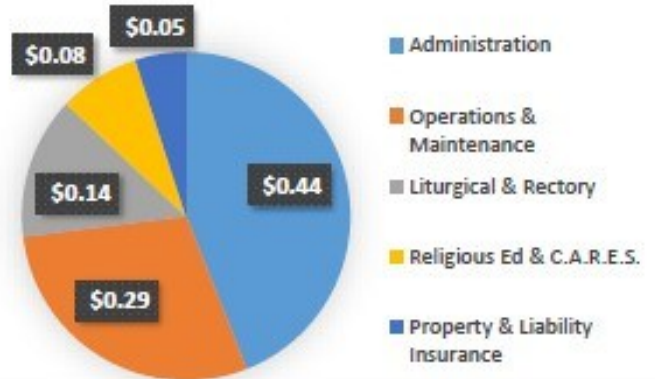

Fiscal Year to Date Financial Highlights

We ended the third fiscal quarter (7/1/2025-3/31/2026) showing an operating surplus. Fish Fry net profits contributed to our revenue (by ~\$65K net profit) in addition to other extraordinary inflows, including the ERC or Employee Retention Credits received from CARES Act relief (\$104K) and generous bequests to the parish (\$339K). Additionally, monies from the building improvement campaign are also accounted for in these figures. It's important to note that some of this money is allocated, including: building improvement (\$190K), Food Bank (\$22K), Haitian Outreach (\$29K), & Social Ministry (\$32K). Our deposit accounts include: Savings (\$129K), Church Alive Campaign (\$194K), and the parish common fund (\$102K).

It's important to note that we continue to have need for an increase in regular offertory and fundraising remains more critical to operations than ever.

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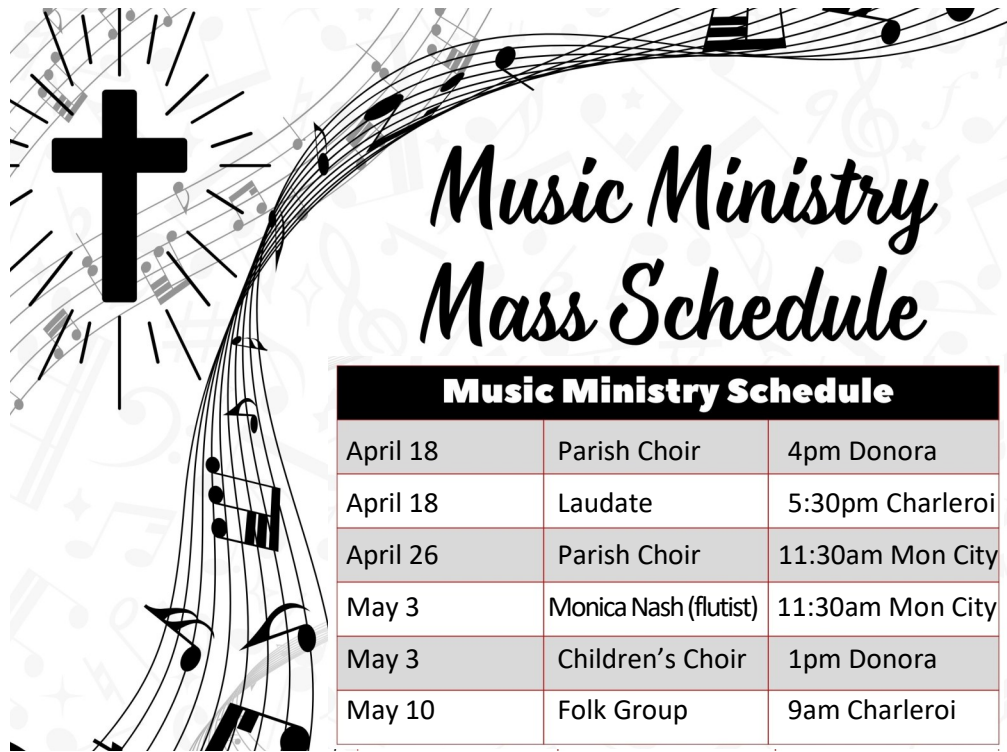
