
## PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Family

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! Once more this joyous Easter greeting resounds around the world as we bask in the glory of our Lord's triumphant victory over sin and death. Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! Even though we have been back in our renovated church for a week I can scarcely take in the beauty. This week has been a busy week for us. Last Saturday our bishop consecrated our church in a beautiful ceremony. The next day was Palm Sunday and now Easter, our beautiful church adorned even more for His glorious Resurrection.

Our church, like Catholic churches throughout history, is full of beautiful and sacred imagery that is meant to help raise our mind and hearts to God. Over time I will explain the meaning of these symbols and images, and hopefully these will become an aid to your prayer. There have been two main questions that have been asked over the last week.: What is that bird on the front of the altar? And whose relics are in the altar?"

We are blessed to have multiple relics in our altar: St. Lucidus, St. Donata, the Holy Roman martyrs and St. Miguel Augustin Pro. St. Lucidus is also known as St. Lucido of Aquara, his feast day is Dec 5<sup>th</sup>. He was a monk of St. Peter's Abbey in Aquara, Italy and died in 938. St. Donata was martyred along with Saints. Hilaria, Nomiflonda, Paulina, Rustica, and Serotina. Their relics are enshrined in the Via Salaria Catacombs, in Rome and her feast day is Dec 31. The Holy Roman Martyrs are those who were martyred by the Emperor Nero in the 1<sup>st</sup> century. While these martyr are unknown and unnamed, their veneration has been an ancient part of our history as Catholics. These martyrs are celebrated on June 30, following the solemnity of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, principal patron of the Roman Catholic Church.



Bl. Miguel Pro is a modern martyr from the persecution of the Church in Mexico by the then communist government. Bl. Miguel Pro was a Jesuit Father who very cleverly deceived and eluded the government as he carried out his priestly ministry. He was later caught and shot to death, his arms extended out in a cross. His feast day is celebrated on Nov 23.

But... what about that bird??? The bird is a pelican and has a beautiful symbolism. The pelican is in the middle stained glass window on the left side, as you face the altar, it is also featured in the medallions on the same side. In the ancient world, it was believed that when the pelican could not find fish to feed its young, it would pierce its breast and feed them its very blood. The early Christian understood this as a sign of our Lord, who was side was pierced so that we might be nourished with His Body and Blood. While modern science has disproved this idea, the symbolism remains a beautiful part of our sacred art and imagery. The mosaic of the pelican on our altar is meant to remind us that in every reception of Holy Communion we are feed with the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord.

Christ is Risen, He is Risen indeed!

### Matt 28: 1-10

The empty tomb narrative has more drama than any of the others. Rather than quietly finding the stone already rolled away, the women feel an earthquake and actually witness an angel descent to move it aside. They also get to see Jesus as they leave the tomb, another departure from the other Synoptics that leave Jesus's appearance for later. The women leave the tomb feeling both fear and joy; there is room for both of these in a response to the resurrection. This drama is appropriate in this great narrative that changes the whole world.

### John 20:1-9

John's empty tomb narrative is mysterious. We do not see Jesus here, and not even the angel of the Synoptics reassures these witnesses about what is happening. There are only oblique signs: a moved stone, burial cloths, and no body.

The gospel ends without understanding and there is still a journey ahead of coming to understand what God has done here. Our Easter joy is not always immediate; we cannot start it on demand. But God remains with us in the journey of coming to share in this joy more fully.



## DEACON'S CORNER

Like a deer that longs for running streams, my soul longs for you, my God.  
Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near; let him turn to the LORD  
for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving.

**"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said."**

On this Easter Sunday I would like to share with you a story of hope and a short reflection.

The roots of this story come from a reflection by Craig Barnes. On Friday, an elderly couple on social security received a phone call from their son who lives far away. The son said he was sorry, but he wouldn't be able to come for a visit over the holidays after all. "The grandkids say hello." They assured him that they understood, but when they hung up the phone they didn't dare look at each other. They were heartbroken because it would be at least another year before they might see their son and grandchildren. And all they could say was "It is Friday now, but Sunday is coming." Earlier this week, a woman was called into her supervisor's office to hear that times are hard for the company and they had to let her go. "So sorry." She cleaned out her desk, packed away her hopes for getting ahead, and wondered what she would tell her kids. All she could think was: "It is Friday now, but Sunday is coming." Earlier this week a young man's car erupted in smoke as he turned onto the highway. Slumped in his seat, head down, he wondered where he would sleep now. But the man who stopped to help, reminded him: "Its Friday now, but Sunday is coming. Earlier this week, someone received terrible news from a physician. Someone else heard the words, "I don't love you anymore." Earlier this week, someone's hope was crucified. And the darkness is overwhelming. No one is ever ready to encounter Easter until he or she has spent time in the dark place where hope cannot be seen. Easter is the last thing we are expecting. This day is not about bunnies, springtime and girls in cute new dresses. It's about more hope than we can handle. Without Good Friday there cannot be an Easter Sunday. In our lives, it may feel like Friday for us but Sunday is here. **He is Risen** and there is hope in the midst of our struggle, loss, or pain.

The Scripture verses above are from the Easter Vigil, when we welcomed 5 men and women who received the Sacraments of Initiation and joined themselves to the Body of Christ. At the Vigil, each with great and tender reverence, received the Body of Christ for the first time. I hope as we join them each week, we will receive His Body with the same reverence; for the reverence we have in receiving the Body of Christ is the source of reverence we have for our own lives. Paula Darcy in her book Stars at Night shares this reflection.

"I was once insistent how my life should unfold and how God ought to be. How dearly I cherished my points of view and my chosen images. Then the wind came and blew my house down, and I no longer knew anything. But something within me did. The mind could not teach me about the wind that blows your house down and then opens your eyes. It offered little more than platitudes. It did not hear the song being sung as we walked barefoot on a labyrinth in the great stone cathedral. It could not explain why our feet burned, even though the stones were cold. It did not tell me that everything is lit from within. When the darkness came, I wondered where courage and strength for the journey were to be found. Eventually I took a first step, even though my heart was still hurt and I was unsure. Just once, I thought, just once, to look without obstruction, to see what has been there all along. To sing, as my own words, the lyrics of Bude Van Dyke has written: 'Like a morning mist/ in a waking forest/ wrap this Love around me.' It is said that in Gothic cathedrals two architectures come together, one in stone and one that creates the void. In life the difficult and the beautiful come together.... Both able to break open the heart. 'What do you hold sacred? If your innermost heart were a temple, what would be behind the curtain in your holy of holies?' (Tom Barrett) We are creating the life we live. We are shaping our reality by what we are paying attention to. All crises bring us to the same question. Will I consent to know Love, whatever form it takes?"

***This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Alleluia Alleluia***
