PASTORS PONDERINGS

Dear Family,

This past Wednesday, Victor and I had the opportunity to attend the Golden Jubilee of Fr. Michael Kiernan. It was a beautiful celebration with Holy Mass and a lovely dinner following. It was a great opportunity and I had the chance to visit with many priests whom I don't often see. There were about 300 people in attendance and about 50 priests. We all gathered to give thanks to God for Fr. Kiernan's ministry and to celebrate with him. I was impressed by the variety of people both in terms of age and background, this was reflected in the group of priests as well.

In his closing remarks Fr Kiernan said something which became the foundation of my thoughts for this column. We all know the saying, "when it rains, it pours" and we all have had periods that seemed to be the theme of a season whether long or short. We also have the good times and we need to treasure and celebrate those good times especially in the bad and the difficult. I have found this to be very true as my family and I have grieved the loss of my grandmother. It seems every day I find myself more and more grateful for the gift of her life and presence in my own life.

A few Sundays ago we celebrated the beautiful feast of Corpus Christi, with nearly 200 people bearing a prayerful and beautiful witness to our Lord as we prayed and processed. This celebration was concluded with a potluck. Many hands went into the preparations, including some who didn't or couldn't participate in the procession or go to the potluck. Every aspect, every group of our parish was represented in the attendance. What a beautiful sight to behold! What a marvel for which to thank Our Lord.

We were also confronted with sacrilege and blasphemy as our state government and the L.A. Dodgers honored a group of impious men and their behavior. Our procession, in part, was an act of reparation; on the feast of the Sacred Heart nearly 50 of us gathered in solidarity with Catholics across the country to pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart in Reparation. It was a beautiful experience. As we bring this month dedicated to the Sacred Heart to a close, I believe, as Fr Kiernan, expressed, can we see the beauty and joy despite the difficulties of life?



Today's readings call us to recognize the challenging issues of fear and trust, important considerations if we are to live the stewardship way of life.

In our first reading, from Jeremiah, the prophet expresses sentiments we have all felt at some point in our lives, when he says, "I hear the whispering of many: Terror on every side!" Perhaps today's "whispering" comes from the culture that insists we must think of ourselves, our own interests, our financial comfort first — only when we are certain that our own needs are met can we think of serving God and sharing with others.

Moreover, perhaps when we do consider stepping out of our comfort zones, additional fear-inducing whispers creep into our hearts — "you're too weak, or too broken to really live as Christ's disciple."

Yet, just when Jeremiah nearly surrenders to his interior doubts and fears, he remembers the truth of God's promise, "The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion."

The Lord knows that facing down our fears and choosing to trust Him with all areas of our lives is difficult and challenging in the course of our daily lives. Yet, He is generous with reassurances to us throughout the Scriptures.

Therefore, let's stop wasting any more time with fear. Instead, let's put all our energy, all our time, our talents and our treasure into trusting this great God, and using all that we are and all that He has given us to bring Him glory.



We are a ministry of St. Patrick Church who have



DEACON'S CORNER

"how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one-man Jesus Christ overflow for the many."


The Spirit of truth will testify to me, says the Lord; and you also will testify.

I wrote this article on Thursday morning shortly after morning prayer, and sat for a moment reflecting on the lives of the two saints whose feast day it is, St John Fischer and St. Thomas More. These two great saints lived in the tumultuous era of King Henry VIII, both saints were martyred because of their willingness to continue to be led by the Spirit of Truth. St. John Fischer was a theologian and bishop. And while imprisoned by Henry VIII for refusing to acknowledge Henry as head of the English Church, he was made a cardinal by Pope Paul III. Shortly after his appointment he was beheaded by Henry VIII. St Thomas More, famously known as the "man for all seasons' was a scholastic, lawyer and chancellor of England. Although a layman, the way he lived his life of intense spirituality and faithfulness was recognized by his countrymen. When he quietly refused to recognize King Henry as the head of the English Church, he joined St. John Fischer a few days later in martyrdom for remaining faithful to Church Teaching. Their lives personified the words of Bishop Hugh Latimer who began a homily with King Henry VIII present: "Latimer, Latimer, be careful what you say, the king is here!" He paused, and then as if in response to himself, he continued. "Latimer, Latimer, be careful what you say, the King of kings is here. Unfortunately, he gave into his fears of the king and became the Archbishop of Canterbury in the Church of England. Ironically, it did not spare his life because he was later executed by Queen Mary I.

Three times in today's gospel Jesus says to his disciples and us "do not be afraid" of what can happen to you here on earth. He asks us to put truth first, to put our relationship with God first. Jesus is so aware of how fear impacts us, we freeze, we flee or we fight. And many times the fight response is a fighting against, rather than a standing for. Jesus warns about fear because it stifles our humanity, silences us or can create irrational reactions. The worst aspect of fear is that fear builds on itself. In his book Scared to Life, Presbyterian Pastor, V. Douglas Rumford, shares a study that revealed 60% of our fears are unfounded, 20% have already happened, 10% are petty, 5% are real but there is nothing we can do about it, and 5% are real and they are things we can address.

In C. S. Lewis' book, The Screwtape Letters, "Screwtape" is a devil, a very accomplished tempter. Using any trickery he can, Screwtape turns people away from God. By his letters, Screwtape gives advice to Wormwood, his young nephew and apprentice who is just learning the deceptive ways of devils. In one letter, Screwtape writes to Wormwood, "Keep them anxious, make certain they are worried about something." — Remind people about their fears. Why this advice? Being a devil, Screwtape wants to get people so focused on their fears that they forget God.

A man visited a therapist because he had a fear of monsters living under his bed. He had been seeing this doctor for months. Every time he came in, the doctor would ask, "Have you made any progress?" Every time the man would say "No". The man decided to find another doctor. When he went back to his first doctor, the doctor asked, "Have you made any progress?" he said "Yes! I am feeling all better!" The doctor asked, "What happened?" The man said, "I went to another doctor and he cured me in one session!" The doctor asked, "What did he tell you?" The man said "He just told me to cut off all four legs of my bed and leave no space for the monster!" It is a big step for many of us, especially those of us who need to control our lives, but the most liberating gift we can give ourselves is to Trust in Our Lord. To trust that, in that which is most important, our souls, Christ will never abandon us.
