PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Dear Family,

This past week I was driving back from a hospital call and noticed that the closed end of Mill Street was already decorated for Christmas! I did a double take and even thought to google to see if a Christmas movie was being filmed in Grass Valley! My next thought was that "it's not even Thanksgiving." Personally, some Thanksgiving decorations would have been fun-maybe a big inflatable turkey and some pilgrims... I don't know... I don't decorate the rectory much. Normally I would write this reflection some time closer to Advent but it seems I need to do it in mid-August!

On Epiphany there is beautiful chant which gives the dates of all the coming feasts, it's a lovely chant and while not needed because we all have Siri and Alexa to tell us, or at least a calendar, it gives a connection between the Incarnation and Birth of our Lord and Easter with all the beautiful feasts that follow. We often modify the word "year," we have a liturgical year, we have a fiscal year, what we call the "calendar" year is really a civic year. There is some overlap, Christmas and Easter are public holidays, Thanksgiving has a special Mass, some days while not having a liturgical rank are included in our Mass.

I would propose that the liturgical year becomes the lens for how we look at all the other years. The carol of Good King Wenceslas says he went out on the "feast of Stephen" to give alms to a poor man. The Feast of Stephen is Dec 26th, the second day of Christmas. I am sure you know the old song "The Twelve Days of Christmas." It is not uncommon in church documents to include the feast or saint's day in the date of the document or for important feasts to be chosen for events or special documents.

By using the liturgical calendar as our main point of reference we connect not only the feast days to our lives and the events around us but more importantly the liturgical seasons as well. Next year Ash Wednesday is on February 14th, which will win out for you? All around us we will see people going out to eat nice dinners, drinking champagne and other things and of course the famous boxes of chocolate. It is easy to say "it's only one day." But the Scriptures teach us that today is the acceptable day, today is the desirable day. It will be hard but worth it knowing we place nothing before the love of God and deeper conversion.

How will you keep Advent this year? Will your own life be like Mill St. decked out with boughs of holly to be swept away on the feast of Stephen? Will you keep the 12 days of Christmas? Will you slow down and reflect on preparing the way of your heart for His arrival? How do you keep Easter? Is "Alleluia" only sung in church?

If we can keep the liturgical year and seasons at the forefront, then the Lord's Sacrifice, the work of our Redemption stays at the forefront and we soon see the world and others through the power and meaning of the Cross. If we do this then we can see the world and our neighbor through the eyes of Jesus.

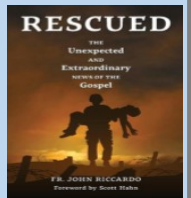

"Abortion Pill Reversal (APR) provides a lifesaving second chance for moms who realize they made a terrible mistake." reports 40 Days for Life. During the 2023 Spring 40 Days for Life vigil, an article detailed the story of a mom named Aniah who after having taken the first dose of the Abortion Pill received help from the campaign leader to obtain Abortion Pill Reversal treatment from an APR doctor 90 minutes away. Aniah returned to the vigil location during the Fall campaign to thank vigil participants and introduce them to her baby Saylah. "The mother admitted that she had regrets immediately after taking the abortion pill. 'I wanted my baby, and I just felt like what I did was wrong and I had to fix it,' she said. 'I thought about the two girls I met [standing vigil in front of the abortion facility], and I looked through the gifts that they gave me and saw the Abortion Pill Reversal phone number...' 'I really appreciate everything that they did for me,' Aniah added. 'Because without them I feel like I would be regretting my decision over and over and over and over again.'"

If California Attorney General Rob Bonta has his way women in California facing this same situation will have nowhere to turn for help. He announced a lawsuit against Heartbeat International and five pregnancy care centers in Northern California. The lawsuit seeks to shut down their *Abortion Pill Rescue Network*. 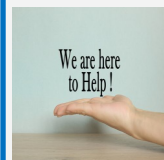

Reflecting on the Gospel

When You Don't Expect Him

- Matthew 24:42-44 NLT -



How can we prepare to wait? This odd question strikes at the heart of today's gospel. Jesus offers the parable of ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom to help his followers imagine what it will be like to wait for the Son of Man to return. First, we see the virgins arrive together and stay

together. If only one virgin had been there alone all night, it would have been much easier for her to give up. Who would have kept her motivated? Who would she have turned to when the waiting got hard? Like the virgins, Jesus wants us to live in joyful hope for the coming of the kingdom as a community. The Church at its best encourages and strengthens the community of believers.

The wise virgins came prepared with flasks of oil but not infinite amounts. Similarly, Jesus calls us to be ready to wait for the coming of God's kingdom with humility and patience, recognizing that we do not yet have the fullness of faith, hope, and love in our lamps. But we do have something. Our lamps need not run empty if we steward our oil well. Like the wise virgins, we are called to wait with anticipation. Surely the bridegroom will come back!

If the wise virgins had no faith in the bridegroom's return, why would they have continued to wait? Something likely those spiritual gifts of faith, hope, and love-convinced them to keep vigil. We too receive spiritual gifts through the sacraments and the life of the church that empower us to keep waiting and to keep believing that what has been promised by God will one day be fulfilled.

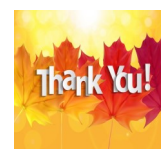

DEACON'S CORNER

Resplendent & unfailing is wisdom & she is readily perceived by those who love her, & found by those who seek her.

O God, you are my God whom I seek; for you my flesh pines & my soul thirsts, like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water.

Behold the Bridegroom! Come out to meet Him.



A preacher at a military prep school for young men ended his sermon on today's Gospel with a rhetorical question for these young men: "Men, I ask you, where would you rather be? Here in the light at the Feast of the Bridegroom or out there in the darkness with a group of foolish girls?" Without a moment's hesitation & almost in perfect harmony the students responded: "Out in the darkness with the foolish young girls, Sir!"

In the following 3 real life stories the meaning of Jesus' words will take a modern revelation. Also, as you reflect back on this Gospel, read it with the understanding that oil is a biblical symbol for the Holy Spirit.

As the Titanic was sinking, a frightened woman found her place in a lifeboat that was about to be lowered into the raging North Atlantic. She suddenly thought of something she needed, so she asked permission to return to her stateroom before they cast off. She was granted three minutes or they would leave without her. She ran across the deck that was already dangerously slanted. She raced through the gambling room with money, ankle deep. She came to her room & quickly pushed aside her diamond rings & expensive bracelets & necklaces as she reached to the shelf above them & grabbed 3 small oranges. She quickly found her way back to the lifeboat & got in. Thirty minutes earlier she would not have chosen a crate of oranges over her smallest diamond. But death had boarded the Titanic. One blast of its awful breath had transformed all values. Suddenly, priceless things had become worthless. Worthless things had become priceless. At that moment she preferred 3 small oranges to a crate of diamonds. What or who would you run back for? Who in your life gives you life?

When Mt Vesuvius erupted in Italy, the city of Pompeii lay buried under 18 feet of volcanic ash. The city remained that way until modern times, when archaeologists excavated it. What they found amazed everyone. There were carbonized loaves of bread, fruit still retaining its flavor, & olives still swimming in their oil. The volcanic ash had frozen people in the exact position they had occupied when the disaster struck. The bodies of the people decayed. As they did, they left behind hollow cavities in the hardened ash. By pouring liquid plaster into these cavities, archaeologists were able to make casts of the victims. Some of the casts evoke an emotional response. One is of a young mother hugging her child tightly in her arms. A 2nd, that of a Roman sentry still at his post, standing erect, fully armed. He had remained calm & faithful to his duty to the end. A 3rd, that of a man standing upright with a sword in his hand. His foot is resting on a pile of gold & silver. Scattered about him are five bodies of the looters he had killed. What would the mold of your life look like if Jesus came tomorrow?

Fr. Jerry Fuller shares this story. A little girl lived near the beach. She had a grandfather she loved very much & always looked forward to visiting him. Her grandfather had a collection of hourglasses & always had fun turning them upside down & watching the sand sift through. She asked her grandpa why he had all of those hourglasses. He said they reminded him that time was the most precious thing in the world. It was close to Christmas & the little girl had not seen her Papa for weeks. Eventually her mother explained to her that Papa was in the hospital & he was very sick & might die. The little girl wasn't sure what death was. Her mother said that life was like one of grandpa's hourglasses & that he had very little time left. One day, her mother told the little girl that they would be going to visit her papa that afternoon & asked her to make some kind of special Christmas present for him. The girl excitedly went to work on her gift. When they got to the hospital, the little girl gave her Papa a beautifully wrapped box. He slowly unwrapped his gift & looked inside & smiled. He understood immediately. His granddaughter had filled the box with sand. How do you use the most precious gift you have, Time? How will you share God's love for you? Is there anything more important or precious for you?

"Lord, teach me to know you more, love you more, and serve you more faithfully in my life."
