Tuesday, December 12th:

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe is a Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with a series of five Marian apparitions in December 1531, and a venerated image on a cloak enshrined within the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site. She is the patroness of the Americas as well as the patron saint of unborn children.

Wednesday, December 13th:

Memorial of Saint Lucy, Virgin and Martyr

Saint Lucy was a Christian martyr who died during the Diocletianic Persecution. She is venerated as a saint in the Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Eastern Orthodox churches. She is one of eight women (including Saint Mary) explicitly commemorated by Roman Catholics in the Canon of the Mass. She is the patron saint of the city of Syracuse (Sicily) and of virgins. Today's feast can easily be harmonized with Advent themes. The very name Lucy pulsates with light, a living symbol amid the season's darkness.

Thursday, December 14th:

Memorial of John of the Cross

Priest and Doctor of the Church

The church celebrates today the memorial of Saint John of the Cross, a priest as well as a doctor of the church and is most known for the profoundly beautiful poetry and spiritual canticles that he wrote. The fire of his passion for the Lord is recorded in some of the most beautiful words ever written about a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. He has been nicknamed "the most mystical of all poets, and the most poetic of all mystics." Saint John of the Cross was beatified by Pope Clement X in 1675, and canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726. He is the patron of contemplatives, mystics and Spanish poets.
