

Monday, November 10th:

Memorial of St. Leo the Great Pope & Doctor of the

Church -- He was a great defender of the orthodox teaching of the Catholic Christian Church and protected the full deposit of faith. The whole Church is still indebted to him for this. He was Bishop of Rome from 29 September 440 and died in 461. Pope Benedict XVI said that Leo's papacy "...was undoubtedly one of the most important in the Church's history." He was a Roman aristocrat, and was the first pope to have been called "the Great".

Memorial of St. Martin of Tours

He was the third bishop of Tours and became one of the most familiar and recognizable Christian saints in Western tradition. He became a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers, establishing the monastery at Ligugé. He was a soldier in the "Army of God" and is the patron saint of soldiers.

Wednesday, November 12th:

Memorial of St. Josaphat, Bishop and Martyr

His ministry included profound preaching and an intensive campaign to educate clergy and laity alike on the importance of unity with the Church in Rome. Many of his flock came into the full communion of the Catholic Church, and St. Josaphat was murdered by a violent mob while preaching his ecumenical message, becoming a martyr for Christian unity. He was canonized in 1867 by Pope Pius IX, becoming the first saint of the Eastern Catholic Church to be canonized by the Roman Catholic Church.

Thursday, November 13th:

Memorial of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, V

Also called Mother Cabrini, she was an Italian American Catholic religious sister. She founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a religious institute that was a major support to her fellow Italian immigrants to the United States. She founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. She was the first U.S. citizen to be canonized a saint by the Catholic Church, on July 7, 1946. Beatified: November 13, 1938, by Pope Pius XI. Patron saint of immigrants and hospital administrators.




