








FIRST HOLY COMMUNION MAY 14TH

INSIDE THE CHURCH- GUS LLOYD

Catholic churches come in many different styles and sizes. Some are centuries old with soaring ceilings and lots of stained glass. Some have a much more modern look and don't resemble at all the churches of old. As architectural styles have changed, so have church buildings. But all Catholic churches share some common elements.

May churches have a narthex. This is the entry area, like a foyer. Often the priest will greet parishioners after Mass in the narthex. From the narthex you enter the main worship space, which consists of the nave and the sanctuary.

The nave is the main body of the church. This is where the people attending Mass sit, stand and kneel. The word nave comes from the Latin word for ship. Early churches often resembled a ship, reminiscent of St. Peter's boat, from which Christ sometimes taught. The sanctuary is the other part of the church, where the altar is. The word itself means "holy place," and this is where most of the rites of the Mass take place.

Some people prefer one style of church over another. The important thing to remember is that, no matter what the building looks like, Jesus is present at every Mass.

THE TABERNACLE- GUS ILOYD

Along with the altar, the most important object in a Catholic church is the tabernacle. The tabernacle is the repositor where the Eucharist is kept—Jesus truly present in the consecrated hosts. Some of these consecrated hosts are for Communion to the sick. As God made himself present to the Israelites in the desert in a tent, the word tabernacle literally means "tent."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in paragraph 1379 says that the tabernacle "should be located in an especially worthy place in the church." In most Catholic churches, the tabernacle is located just behind or near the altar. Some churches have a small chapel reserved for the tabernacle.

A tabernacle must be made of non-transparent material. It must also be immovable, and be kept locked so that the Blessed Sacrament cannot be stolen or desecrated.

The Catechism number 1183 tells us that "The dignity, placing, and security of the Eucharistic tabernacle should foster adoration before the Lord really present tin the Blessed Sacrament of the altar."

Because we believe that Jesus is truly present, Catholics should genuflect or bow before the tabernacle, as a sign of reverence.
