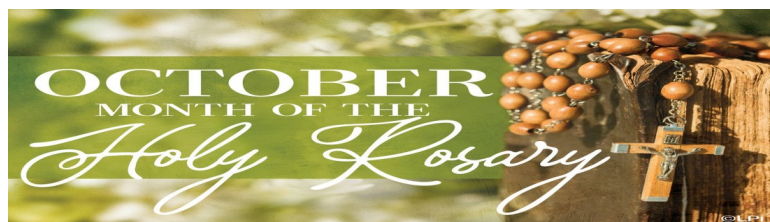

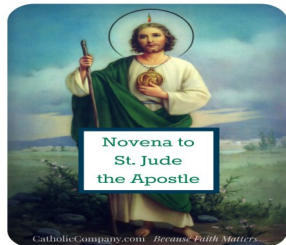
During the month of October please pray the Rosary for PEACE.

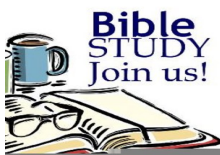
