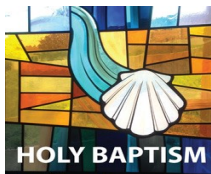


Prayer for Thanksgiving

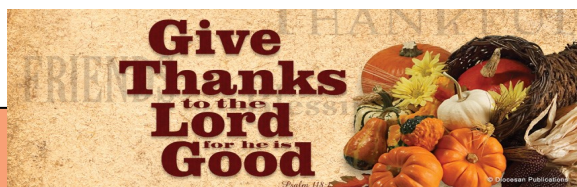

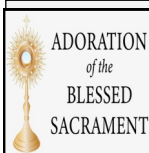
