

Parish Pastoral Council Updates

Dear Holy People of God,

During this very challenging time, it is important to continue to plan for the spiritual development and the future of Ste. Anne Parish. The Parish Pastoral Council met on April 25th via a conference call, a new experience for us all. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we have been discussing the revival of the Bible Study on the last Friday of the month. In the interim, Fr. Maurice will prepare some video recordings of lectures on the Old Testament to assist us, and possibly answer some of our questions, as we read/travel through the Old Testament. The videos will be posted on our website and a notice will be placed in the bulletin.

We are excited to announce that a committee has been formed to plan for Sr. Pauline's 65th Anniversary as a Sister of St. Chretienne. Sister Pauline's "Yes" to the Lord has led her to serve Him in Amesbury, Salem at St. Joseph Academy, Africa for 11 years, and back to Salem where she studied and entered the workplace at Salem State for 24 plus years before her retirement. She has also volunteered with NunsBuild, working in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina to assist with rebuilding homes, and continues to volunteer with Habitat for Humanity building affordable housing. Fr. Maurice appointed Gloria Matton as the Chair of the Anniversary Committee. The date has tentatively been set for **August 16th**, depending on the Governor's directive on the COVID-19. The Special Mass for the anniversary will be followed by a reception in the Parish Pastoral Centre. More details will follow.

Two of the planned retreats for this year have been cancelled due to restrictions on the number of attendees allowed; the Men's Retreat on September 12th and the Women's Retreat on September 19th. We are waiting for alternative dates to allow for more people to attend. Depending on the Governor's directive, the remaining retreats will be held on schedule.

The Archdiocese has developed a plan for Safety & Security of our parish campus. We are in the process of forming a committee to develop a plan for Safety & Security under the guidelines of the Archdiocese's program. The committee will include members of the parish as well as people from the community.

Fr. Maurice appointed Dr. Vivienne Yumasi and Judy Ware to coordinate the parish calendar, which is located on our website (www.stannesalem.org). The calendar will contain all of the events planned in the parish, as well as groups that will be utilizing the Parish Pastoral Centre.

Grandma's Attic update – discussions are underway regarding how we will be handling the sale when the "Stay at Home" order has been lifted, again adhering to the Governor's directive.

Fr. Maurice suggested that we begin publishing Witness Talks in the bulletin, reflections of how our faith has guided us through these trying times. Witness Talks began with the May 3rd bulletin. To date, Diane Charette, Gloria Matton, Bill Kirby, and Marion Blanchette have contributed their reflections. It is one way in which we can share our faith with others.

Other plans include a Spiritual Library, location to be determined and a Little Free Library, located on the grounds of the church.

Keeping the Parishioners of Ste. Anne Parish in our prayers and hoping that you will stay safe during this unprecedented pandemic. We all are looking forward to being together again in church soon.

STE. ANNE'S RE-OPENING PLANS

Dear Holy People of God,

On May 18th the Governor unveiled the Phases to re-open the Commonwealth allowing Houses of Worship to re-open in Phase 1. A joint meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council, Heads of Ministries, Staff and representatives from the Cameroon and Filipino Communities was held on Friday, May 22nd to discuss plans to re-open the Church. After careful consideration, it was decided to begin celebrating Mass with the congregation on **Saturday, June 6th and Sunday, June 7th**.

Following the guidelines of the lesser of 40% of capacity or social distancing of 6 feet apart, there are **54 available seats per Mass**. In order to accommodate as many parishioners as possible each weekend, Mass times are as follows:

Saturday: 4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Sunday: 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 1:30 p.m., and 5:00 p.m.

Going forward, it will be necessary to register for the Mass you wish to attend. Information on how to do this will follow. We will be sending out e-mail blasts to keep you informed, as well as posting the information on our website www.stannesalem.org and on our Facebook page. I encourage anyone who is not receiving an e-mail with the bulletin and the notice of the video-taped Mass to send their e-mail address to Annette in the Business Office at annette.pezzulo@stannesalem.org.

Masks will be required, as well as maintaining Social Distancing. There will be one entrance and exit. The doors of the Church will be opened 20 minutes before each Mass through the Courtyard. If there is a line, please stand behind the tape. An Usher will escort you to a pew; we will begin seating people at the front of the Church.

Daily Mass will be held in the Main Church beginning on June 8th at 9:00 a.m.

While we will be taking all of the precautions necessary, as outlined in the guidelines, people over the age of 65 and people who have underlying health conditions – who are at risk for COVID-19 – should continue to watch the Mass on TV.

Be assured that you have been in my prayers daily and will continue to be as we adjust to a new way of celebrating Mass and interacting with each other.
