Advent 2021 and the Three Comings of the Lord And Praying for our World the 7 Penitential Psalms

Dear Holy People of God,

As we continue this season of Holy Advent, I wish to remind us of the great truth of Advent: interior conversion of heart! True religion is always leading to conversion! We cannot say that we have become converted enough, and hence, no room for progress or growth in the spiritual life. Advent, with its call to prepare for the Lord's coming, offers us a unique opportunity to ask, like Peter and the others around the Lord at the Last Supper, is it I, Lord? One can never be assured of one's innocence before God. There are hidden sins, sins unknown to us, sins of omission, sins of neglect and indifference, sinful thoughts that do not wish others well; and so on, and so forth. Who can stand before the judgment of God without feeling afraid?

The Holy Season of Advent gives us the opportunity to look back with discernment and forward with hope. But hope only comes about after we have examined our past, after we have made straight the crooked pathway of sin that is hidden in us. And that is why Advent is really a time of conversion, of making ourselves ready, not only to celebrate the first coming of the Lord over 2000 years ago, but two other comings: the second, the daily coming of our Lord at Holy Mass and in the neighbor; and the third, the coming of our Lord at the end of age. Summarily, therefore, Advent reminds us of these three comings of the Lord: in history (Galatians 4:4), which is what we celebrate at Christmas; the second coming in our daily lives; and the third and final coming, when history will come to a close, and the Angel of the Apocalypse will sound the trumpet, and the voices in heaven will declare, "The Kingdom of the world now belongs to our Lord and to his Anointed, and he will reign forever and ever" (Revelation 11:15).

In order to help us prepare spiritually, I wish to propose the following: Prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please, do not allow Advent to pass by without going to Confession. This is the most important sacrament that prepares us for the Lord's coming. Secondly, to pray, I wish to propose that together as a parish, we pray, at home and in our private moments in Church,

DAILY, during this Holy Season, the Seven Penitential Psalms, for our world. Many of our contemporaries are frightened. The news fills us with frightening stories about our world. I wish to invite us to pray the Seven Penitential Psalms during this entire season. If you can't pray the Seven, at least, pray One each day, with the intention of lifting the whole world to God:

How to Pray the Seven Penitential Psalms this Advent

1. Begin: The Sign of the Cross.
2. Invitatory Antiphon: Listen to Me, O Lord, and show me your mercy, for I am a sinner before You.
3. Read the Psalm slowly, listening with your heart as you read them.
4. Observe some silence after reading the Psalm.

Link each Psalm with each of the Seven capital sins:

After Praying Psalm 6, add: From the sin of Pride, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 32, add, From the sin of Avarice, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 38, add, From the sin of Envy, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 51, add, From the sin of Wrath, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 102, add, From the sin of Lust, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 130, add, From the sin of Gluttony, O Lord, deliver me;
 After Praying Psalm 143, add, From the sin of Sloth, O Lord, deliver me.

5. Conclude with the Glory be to the Father and the Hail Holy Queen.

God bless you, and I wish you a holy season of Advent.

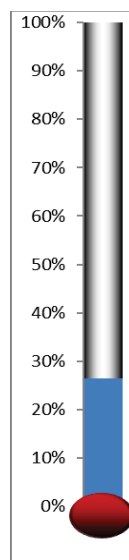
FINANCIAL UPDATE - SUPPORT YOUR PARISH

Society of St Vincent de Paul - Once again this year, we have been blessed with an anonymous donor who will match all donations made to the Salem St. Vincent de Paul Society during the month of December. This is an opportunity for members of the Salem community to double the value of a gift to help Jesus and his poor. What better way to celebrate this Christmas season, especially in this second year of the pandemic, than to help the needy in our own city? All donations made in the month of December will qualify for the match. We can't be at the church doors for our regular collections, but you may place your donation in the collection box any time during the month of December. You may also mail checks made out to St. Vincent de Paul at 158 Federal Street, Salem, MA 01970. For the fiscal year ending September 30th, your donations helped to fund \$110,349 in assistance to the poor in Salem, including \$58,891 for overdue rent to avoid eviction; \$19,663 for past due electricity and fuel bills to avoid shut off of those utilities; \$23,609 for food vouchers; and \$7,046 for miscellaneous items such as beds and bedding, car repairs, diapers and medical expenses. Because we are a volunteer organization, our operating expenses were just \$1,140 for the year. We gratefully acknowledge your generous contributions which help the needy of Salem. Two of our valued team members died during the last year and another valued member moved out of state. We are therefore very much in need of new members. If you would like to join in Jesus's call to help those in need, please consider joining our team. Our next meeting will be on **Monday, December 13th at 6:30PM** in the St. James conference room, which is below the MQOA office - entrance is from the large parking lot behind St. James church, at the corner of Flint St and Bridge Street. Thank you again for your generosity, which helps the needy of Salem.

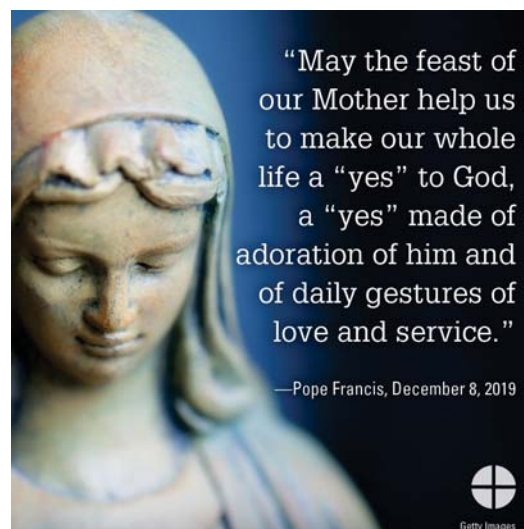
