Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem.

Someone asked him, “Lord, will only a few people be saved?” He answered them, “Strive to enter through the narrow gate.”

- Lk 13:22-24a

Perseverance that Leads to Salvation

At one time or another, or even more frequently, the question, “Will I ever go to heaven?” must have crossed our minds. In our Gospel today, someone asked Jesus, “Lord, will only a few people be saved?” During her apparitions at Fatima to the three children, our Blessed Mother was asked by Lucia a similar question about them; if the three children would go to heaven when they died. Certainly, God desires that all his children be saved. In our first reading this desire is echoed in these words “I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory” (Is. 66.18). While God desires that we be saved, those who have willingly accepted the invitation must certainly stay awake at all times. In the Gospel today, Jesus exhorts his listeners to “Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough” (Luke 13.24). *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that “Faith is an entirely free gift that God makes to man. We can lose this priceless gift, as St. Paul indicated to St. Timothy: “Wage the good warfare, holding faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have made shipwreck of their faith.” To live, grow, and persevere in the faith until the end we must nourish it with the word of God; we must beg the Lord to increase our faith; it must be “working through charity,” abounding in hope, and rooted in the faith of the Church” (CCC. 162).

Jesus Christ left the sacraments in the Church, sacred and visible signs instituted by him to give us grace. They are signs of his active presence to help us in our daily struggles so that we may persevere to the end. Let us ask ourselves, for example, how often we frequent the sacraments of Confession and Holy Communion – that keep our souls clean and nourished after Baptism? The presence of these sacraments in the Church (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Communion, Confession, Sacrament of the Sick, Holy Orders, Matrimony) should encourage us to remain faithful members of the Church. “All salvation comes from Christ the Head through the Church which is his Body...the Church, a pilgrim now on earth, is necessary for salvation: the one Christ is the mediator and the way of salvation; he is present to us in his body which is the Church. He himself explicitly asserted the necessity of faith and Baptism, and thereby affirmed at the same time the necessity of the Church which men enter through Baptism as through a door” (CCC, 846).

The path to salvation is certainly rough and tough; it requires a great deal of perseverance. At all times, let us implore the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Help of Christians, to obtain for us the grace of final perseverance on the path to salvation. May her prayers also help us to remain faithful members of Christ’s body, the Church that is steadily pointing the path to salvation.



Faith Overcomes Apathy

Today, more than ever, there is a dangerously low level of concern for others, for those who are seen as "different." People often do not even speak to neighbors, as long as they are comfortable and don't need anything. Social distancing has only made that situation more acute. You,

as the parent of your children, are charged with their social, emotional, and faith development, and are responsible for the example you set for them. Faith formation teaches what it means that we are all God's children who love him as our Father; what it means that we are called to reject what is unhealthy and sinful and choose God at all times; what it means that we are stewards of God's creation; what it means to be a good neighbor. The song "Lift every voice and sing" was written in 1899, but its words are fitting for today's world:

God of our weary years

God of our silent tears

Thou who has brought us thus far on the way

Thou who has by Thy might Led us into the light

Keep us forever in the path, we pray

Lest our feet stray from the places, our God, where we met Thee

Lest, our hearts drunk with the wine of the world, we forget Thee

I grew up in a rural area of northern Germany that, to this day, is predominantly catholic. After Catholic high school and mandatory military service I studied History and Latin to become a teacher. While at Tuebingen University in Germany I met my future wife who was an American student studying German during her junior year abroad. I applied for a student exchange program and completed the requirements for a Masters degree in History at Washington University in St. Louis, MO.

In my subsequent professional life I worked as a teacher (at all grade levels over the years, from Kindergarten through 12th


grade) and as a lawyer (Temple Law class of 1991). In 1994 my wife and I moved, with our two year old son, close to her parents in Norwood, Massachusetts. As a result of my divorce I relocated to the North Shore and found a home here in Salem. On my first visit to Ste. Anne in 2017, I felt drawn to the church and the community. I feel honored to have been chosen for the position of Director of Faith Formation, and am awed by the great responsibility. Still, I hope you agree, as disciples of Christ, that we all are called to help root our children in the faith that has sustained us, especially in the more difficult moments of our lives. I ask for your commitment to this joint task, by prayer, and by example, as lay teachers, and as living witnesses of our faith.




GOSPEL MEDITATION**Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

The serious disciple knows the necessity and value of discipline. Thinking of discipline as something punitive in nature, we underscore its place in our spiritual lives. Discipline is really about a radical trust in God and his guidance. "When you are conducted by a guide who takes you through an unknown country at night across fields where there are no tracks, by his own skill, asking no advice from anyone, giving no inkling of his plans, what choice do you have but to give yourself completely to his guidance? If you are convinced that he is a good guide, you must have faith in him and abandon yourself to his care (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)."

If someone wants to be physically fit, they readily find a competent trainer who sets them on a rigorous schedule. Determined to reach their goals, they sacrifice personal pleasure and trust in his guidance. Why should it be any different with God? In order to remain true to the way Jesus places before us, we have to listen, learn, and be willing to change. Falling in love with God and maintaining that relationship requires an investment of time, energy, and hard work. Putting personal preferences aside in pursuit of the Gospel and giving proper attention to our spiritual lives is challenging work. At first, "all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it (Hebrews)."

"What God does is essentially good. It does not need to be reformed or controlled... If you would live according to the Gospels, give yourself completely and simply to the action of God (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." Submission to the holy will of God is not a submission to a set of pre-ordained set of circumstances. Rather, it is an abandonment and trust in God's creative, life-giving, and salvific power. God brings light out of darkness and life out of death. Nurturing this bond of trust and seeking God in all things creates an intimate and particular relationship and bond between our Creator and us. When He comes, there will be no issue with us recognizing Him or Him recognizing us. We will have met before."






