



### PASTOR'S NOTE



# FROM THE PASTOR Walk in the Light of the Lord in Preparation for His Coming

Dear Parishioners,

I welcome you all into the season of Advent. This season opens the Church's new liturgical calendar. So, in this context, it wouldn't be out of place if I were to say: Happy New Year! We celebrate two things in Advent. First, we remember that God fulfilled his promise in history by sending a Savior. Secondly, Advent reminds us of the joyful hope that we Christians are supposed to have that Jesus Christ will come again in Glory to judge the living and the dead.

What is the relevance of this? We must certainly be anxious if his coming will meet us prepared; are we going to be like those who rejected him 2000 years ago? In our own age and time, how should we prepare ourselves to meet the Lord? In the second reading of today taken from the Letter the Romans, Saint Paul wants the Christians in Rome to "throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light" and avoid the sinful excesses of their neighbors. He's no longer certain that Jesus will soon come again in glory, but he wants the church to be ready, and to be more noble than their surroundings. In this season, Godwants us to make a change of heart as we live in joyful hope to meet Jesus. The Church strongly proposes to her children a regular attendance to the

Sacrament of Confession. We must keep our hearts in holiness.

In the Gospel the Lord cautions us: be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come (Matthew 24:44). In order to do this, we must beware that our hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catches us by surprise like a trap (Luke 21:34-36). We are called to live each day in preparation to meet the Lord, I strongly believe that if I am properly prepared to meet him in the Eucharist, when I come to Mass, I will not find any barriers to meet him at the end of time when he comes to call us to himself. Let us have a look at this beautiful prayer of preparation said before Holy Communion, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and I shall be healed." If we are healed and cleansed every day to receive the Eucharistic Lord, wouldn't that be a gradual and perfect preparation to meet the Lord at the end of time, and participate in the marriage feast of the Lamb in the heavenly Kingdom? The sad thing is that many of us come to Mass with hearts not ready and properly prepared to receive the Lord. Advent reminds us to make our hearts ready to meet the Lord at any time when he

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, who welcomed the Lord in her body, pray for us to increase and abound in love for one another, and keep our hearts blameless in holiness before the coming of our God.

## SIMBANG GABI: A REVERED FILIPINO CHRISTMAS TRADITION

We will celebrate Simbang Gabi with a 9-day Novena of Masses beginning December 15th at 7PM.

SIMBANG Gabi, which literally means "evening or night Mass," is a Filipino Christmas tradition. As a devotional practice in the tradition of the novena, it is a series of nine evening Masses usually celebrated during Advent from December 16-24, in preparation for Christmas Day. It is held in honor of the Virgin Mary, which represents the nine-month stay of the Infant Jesus in the womb of Our Lady leading up to Christmas.

Simbang Gabi originated from the Missa Aurea (golden Mass or Angel's Mass) practiced by the Roman Catholic Church. The tradition was introduced by the Spanish friars at the start of the Catholic evangelization of the Philippines, specifically to allow farmers to hear mass before going to the fields in the morning.

Originally, Simbang Gabi masses were held in the early hours of the morning - around 4AM or 5AM - when roosters crowed to announce the dawning of the new day, thus the name Misa de Gallo. Today, it is still celebrated the same way in most places in the Philippines as the Roman Catholic churches across the nation open their doors shortly before the break of dawn and church bells would ring to summon the faithful to the Simbang Gabi mass.

In celebration of Simbang Gabi - which is a preparation for Christmas - most churches are decorated with colorful lights and beautiful parol lanterns to welcome the churchgoers. In addition, a Nativity Scene is displayed in preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day.

Shortly after the mass, traditional delicacies await the churchgoers. There are food stalls right outside the church with popular favorites such as bibingka, puto (rice cakes), puto bumbong, suman sa pasko, suman sa ibos, which are usually served with tea or coffee. Hot pandesal (breakfast rolls) are also very popular.

Today, even in this digital age, the tradition of Simbang Gabi continues not only in the Philippines but also observed in many Filipino communities overseas. Furthermore, this religious tradition encourages community development and camaraderie among parishioners through a common effort of prayer, celebration, fellowship, and charity.

Over the years, Filipino communities in the United States have made changes in the way that Simbang Gabi is celebrated with some parishes observing the tradition around 7 or 8PM instead of during the early morning in order to accommodate the needs of the members of the community. But no matter the language, the place, or the time, this revered Filipino tradition is observed and celebrated. When you pray and attend the Simbang Gabi, you realize how truly universal, significant, and important the Christmas spirit is for every Christian.

### Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
