



PASTOR'S NOTE

CHRISTMAS REFLECTION DECEMBER 24-25

Beloved parishioners,

The solemnity of Christmas we celebrate today suggests, among others, some outstanding themes, namely, light, peace, and joy.

Light. On Christmas night mass we hear in the First reading: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone." (Is. 9:2) Christ is our light. He came to dispel the darkness of sin. He will later say in the gospel: "I am the light of the world." (Jn 8:12) Welcoming Jesus, therefore, is welcoming the light, thus turning our back to the works of darkness. Furthermore, Jesus identifies us, his followers (Christians) with the light. He says: "You are the light of the world. A city built on top of a hill cannot be hidden." (Matt. 5:14) Celebrating Christmas therefore is also celebrating our identity as light of the world and behaving accordingly.

Peace. The prophet Isaiah proclaims: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Is. 9:6) Jesus is the Prince of peace who said: "Blessed are the peacemakers" (Mat.5:9); "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace" (Jn. 16:33) and again, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (Jn 14:27). Because we have Jesus in our midst and in our hearts, peace should therefore be our companion. Celebrating Christmas is, therefore, receiving the peace of Jesus and being peacemakers.

Joy. Because of such a divine presence of light and peace in our world, joy should be our leitmotif. One of the recurrent Christmas carols sings: "Joy to the world, the Lord is come!" As Christians, we cannot but be a joyful people. We have the greatest reason of being

joyful: the Lord is come; the Lord is in our midst. Let us therefore behold Him and keep him at Christmas and always. In a consumerist world as ours, the temptation is to drown into the hustle and bustle of the Christmas material preparations time and forget the One who gave us the opportunity to celebrate Him, receive Him and Keep Him: our Light, our Peace and our Joy, Jesus Christ, our Savior.

Let us keep Christ at Christmas. Merry Christmas to all!

EMAIL PHISHING SCHEME

It has come to our attention that several parishioners have received emails that appear to be from Fr. Augustin or Fr. Casmia asking for assistance. Please be aware that these are not valid emails - they are phishing schemes sent to get you to purchase gift cards, to send money, or to otherwise obtain your personal information. You should mark them as spam and block them if possible.

Phishing schemes tend to increase on Fridays, long weekends, and around the holiday season. Be on your guard and follow best practices for evaluating and responding to electronic communications, be it via email or cell phone text message. Follow these tips, recommendations, and suggestions below to help stay safe online:

- Use complex passwords that contain both numbers, characters, capital and lowercase letters
- Do not reuse the same passwords across different portals and online applications (this is how your private data is lost)
- Always use multi-factor authentication when available
- Be wary of links and attachments in emails and text messages
- Do not open what appear to be incorrectly delivered or unexpected attachments, invoices, purchase confirmations, etc., including those from large providers such as Apple, Costco, Microsoft, Amazon, Netflix
- Verify the sender's domain and email address. Hover your mouse over the sender's email address or right mouse click to check the sender's actual email address. Is the domain correct? A bank won't write to you from a gmail account. Check that the name is spelled correctly (i.e., bankofamerica, not bankofamenica) (One email appearing to be from Fr. Augustin spelled his name incorrectly and had revfrpriest19@gmail.com as the email address)
- Do not call phone numbers listed in suspicious emails or letters
- Do not enter any login credentials when prompted to do so via a link in an email or text message. Always visit a website directly and confirm its identity before entering credentials
- Do not initiate any financial transaction based on an email or text exchange.
 Always STOP CALL CONFIRM




