REFLECTION FOR JANUARY 8

January 8 ~ Epiphany of the Lord

We know this story so well, it may be easy to miss what God invites us to hear today. The Magi were determined to find "the newborn king" by following the star - "overjoyed at seeing the star... and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother... and did him homage." So, what did you hear as God's invitation in this gospel? Perhaps God's invitation comes in the perseverance of the Magi or in their belief that following the star would lead them to the king. Or perhaps God is inviting you to look for Christ in the ordinary as well as the extraordinary events of your own life. On this feast, take a lesson from the Magi and go in search of Christ.

Dear parishioners,

The Solemnity of the Epiphany we celebrate this weekend sheds light on the very scope of salvation offered to us by God as the church continues to contemplate and celebrate the birth of our Savior. By becoming man, the Son of God did not only come for the Jewish people represented by the shepherds, but also for the whole of humanity represented by the magi. Epiphany, therefore, reminds us of the universality of salvation; all, without exception, are invited to the heavenly banquet that begins here on earth by embarking on the journey of following the Star, Jesus our light. However, just as the magi's journey was strewn with distracting events, our journey can be a challenge. As they were headed to Jerusalem, they encountered Herod. Herod was "certainly interested in the Child of which the Magi spoke; not in order to worship him, as he wished to make them believe by lying, but rather to kill him. Herod was a powerful man who saw others solely as rivals to combat. Basically, on reflection, God also seemed a rival to him, a particularly dangerous rival who would like to deprive men of their vital space, their autonomy, their power; a rival who points out the way to take in life and thus prevents one from doing what one likes." (Benedict XVI) Herod is seen as a wicked and bad man, yet we should ask ourselves: "is there perhaps something of Herod also in us? Might we too sometimes see God as a sort of rival? Might we too be blind to his signs and deaf to his words because we think he is setting limits on our life and does not allow us to dispose of our existence as we please?" When we see God in this way, according to Benedict XVI, we end by feeling dissatisfied and discontent because we are not letting ourselves be guided by the One who is the foundation of all things.

Epiphany also helps us to appreciate one another and not see them who are involved in the same community as us and who work for the same cause, as rivals or unhealthy competitors. Epiphany opens us up to a church that is truly church, that is, a church made up of "people of every nation, tribe and language," all en route toward holiness, toward God's eternal kingdom. Let us join hands together and build up a strong Ste. Anne community in every respect: spiritual, social, moral, and material.

Happy Solemnity of the Epiphany!




