

PASTOR'S NOTE

July 16 ~ Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings present the image of the Word of God being sown as seeds upon field. "A sower went out to sow...." Listen to these readings with the mind and heart of an evangelizer. Is the soil of your soul receptive to the word of God that you hear? Do you believe that with God's grace, your words and actions can bear fruit and bring someone closer to Jesus? Try to find ten minutes each day to read some Scripture. As you do that, pray that the seed of God's word will bear fruit within you.


The parable of the sower in today's gospel is a clear example for us of how God works in our midst, and it invites us to patience while doing our best. God's ways are not our way; often we want things to happen as quickly as possible, as may be the case with our personal spiritual growth or community improvement. Today's gospel reminds us that God is at work in the midst of his people even if we do not see an apparent or dramatic change. This message applies to our parish family as well.

Challenges are part of life and are sometimes necessary for growth; they are not signs of failure; at least we Christians should not see them as such. At the same time, challenges should be a call to do more and better. Let us keep praying for our parish and for one another. I wish to thank the entire parish community for the slight progress we have started making on improving our finances. The call I made about increasing our weekend collection is still relevant; let's get in that direction and keep it up. I also wish to thank you once again for helping us reach the goal of our assessed Catholic Appeal collection. Seventy-eight people from our parish donated and we reached 103% of our goal. Thank you for your generosity; may the Lord reward you a hundredfold.

Now, I wish to come back to some unfinished business. We can remember that in December 2022, we launched our Grand Annual, late though. Because the Catholic Appeal was also launched shortly thereafter, we had to interrupt our Grand Annual to pick up the Catholic Appeal. Now that we successfully completed it, it is about time we resume with our Grand Annual. This collection is for our parish. On the day the Grand Annual was launched, a number of parish projects were read, which the collection would take care of. Charity begins at home; I would like to earnestly plead that we resume with our Grand Annual collection and close it as soon as possible. Per the archdiocese's recommendation, the Grand Annual shouldn't take so long; it should be completed within 3 months. For this year, as we started late, then interrupted it for the Catholic Appeal, we will just try to round it up as soon as possible. The finance committee will be meeting soon, and they will determine a deadline for the collection. Our goal is to raise \$35,000 and so far, we have raised \$7,555. We are still to raise \$27,445. This is possible. Please, prayerfully consider donating to the Grand Annual to keep our parish materially healthy.

Thanks for the love you have for the Lord and his Church; thanks for your support to Saint Anne, our beloved parish.

Inflame our hearts to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to all we encounter.





GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 16, 2023 ~ 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's not uncommon to hear people complain that we Catholics often fail in communicating our faith. Fair enough. We can and should improve there. But it's interesting to notice that Jesus himself was implicitly accused by his disciples of a similar failure. This week in Matthew's

gospel they are perplexed that he speaks to the crowds in ambiguous parables. The Lord's riddles leave many people more confused than before. He responds by pointing out that his parables have an intentional dual purpose: to hide (for some) and to reveal (for others) his Gospel: "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted" (Matthew 13:11). Is Jesus being unnecessarily difficult, obscurantist, or, worse, elitist?

No. We have to remember that all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge lie hidden in him (c.f., Col. 2:3). He is the word of God from heaven to be planted in the earth of our humanity to bear great fruit. However, like a lover delicately pursuing his beloved, we're dealing with a relationship, not new data. When we aren't willing to personally accept Jesus into our lives, the "info" of the Gospel will simply not make sense to us. It'll seem bizarre, esoteric, or like incoherent religious-speak. But when we are willing to accept Jesus into our lives, everything else starts to make sense. When others don't understand the Church or the Lord, let's be patient. Love is patient. Sometimes it has to hide before it is revealed.
