



July 30 ~ Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our first reading we hear that God appeared to Solomon telling him to ask for whatever he wanted. Take note, Solomon does not ask for riches or a long life or an untroubled life. Solomon asks for an understanding heart! Consider - would your answer be like that of Solomon? To help us be clearer about what is important, Jesus gives us two short parables, the pearl of great price and the hidden treasure that is sought after and found. Do you think about your faith as a pearl of great price, or a treasure to seek after? These readings give us much food for prayer - about what we value, what we seek after, and whose we want to be!

PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, we continue our meditation on the series of Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God. The gospel pericope suggests, through the parables of a buried treasure in the field and a pearl of great value, that the Kingdom of God is priceless. Therefore, we should spare no effort in possessing it. The Church teaches that the Kingdom of God is both already in our midst and not yet. In other words, we are all making our way on this earthly pilgrimage to our final destination, which is union with God or eternal life. The Lord has given us the means to attain holiness and get into his eternal kingdom. But our getting there is not disconnected from the type of life we live here on earth. Heaven begins on earth; as you make your bed, so you lie on it. Let us therefore work for the coming of God's kingdom and not against it. In the "Our Father" prayer, we say: "thy kingdom come." In saying this wonderful prayer, I cannot say "Thy kingdom come" if I am not working to bring it about in the here and now. The kingdom of God is a kingdom of peace, forgiveness, joy, love, light and truth. Being children of the kingdom would mean working to bring them about in our hearts, in the hearts of others, in our community, in our society.

Back to parish news, as I announced last Sunday at all the masses, Fr. Gabriel Tokoh Afumbom, who has been at Ste. Anne since December 2022, is relocating to the collaborative of St. John and St. Paul parish in Wellesley. The urgent need in that Collaborative has him move almost immediately as he got the invitation. My immediate feeling is that I will miss him greatly and so will surely the parish. I wish to thank Fr. Gabriel for his services to Ste. Anne, for his thought-provoking homilies, gentleness, and availability. He has been a great collaborator and a generous priest. Fr. Gabriel asked me to convey to the entire community his gratitude and will miss the Ste. Anne community. I am sure he can count on our prayers for a successful mission in Wellesley.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 30, 2023 ~ 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from

wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.
