PASTOR'S NOTE

December 31 ~ The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph In today's Gospel, Simeon and Anna make a startling prediction about Jesus and the life that awaits him, a life that would hold both joy and suffering. Mary and Joseph held in their hearts all they heard and remained faithful to all that God asked of them as parents. St. Paul gives powerful recommendation for parents and children alike for how to imitate the Holy Family — "Put on kindness, humility, gentleness and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another."

Because Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived in this way, they are the model for our families. Pray for your family, that God will give you the grace to grow in these beautiful virtues.

Dear parishioners,

Today, the Church puts before us the Holy Family of Nazareth to both celebrate and emulate their example. They inspire us by their love, care, hard work, and trust in God. They are called "Holy" not because they did not have difficulties but because they trusted in God and did everything with Him. From Joseph we learn the value of silence, contemplation, obedience to God, hard work, honor, justice and the protection life. From Mary we learn to say YES to God, to his plan for us, meditation, purity, prayer and deep love and trust in God. From Jesus we learn being united to God in prayer, obedience to God, to parents and to authority, perseverance, sacrifice, love and faithfulness to God's will for us. These virtues of the Holy Family which are not exhaustive, can equally be lived out in our parish family/community.

January 1 is new year's day and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Reflecting on this Solemnity, Pope Benedict XVI says: "Mary is the mother and model of the Church, who receives the divine Word in faith and offers herself to God as the "good soil" in which he can continue to accomplish his mystery of salvation. The Church also participates in the mystery of divine motherhood, through preaching, which sows the seed of the Gospel throughout the world, and through the sacraments, which communicate grace and divine life to men. The Church exercises her motherhood especially in the sacrament of Baptism, when she generates God's children from water and the Holy Spirit, who cries out in each of them: "Abba, Father!" (Gal 4:6). Like Mary, the Church is the mediator of God's blessing for the world: she receives it in receiving Jesus and she transmits it in bearing Jesus. He is the mercy and the peace that the world, of itself, cannot give, and which it needs always, at least as much as bread." (January 1, 2012)

May the mother of God and our mother help us to bear Christ her son in our heart.

January 1 is also World Day of Peace. Let us pray for peace in the world, especially in war-torn countries. Let us pray for peace among nations, in our families and in our hearts. At the beginning of this new year, I wish you the Lord's blessing from the Book of Numbers:

"The LORD bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace. (Numbers 6:24-26)

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 31, 2023 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

I remember the first time my older sister asked me if I wanted to hold her newborn son. Terrified, I told her I didn't think it was a good idea. My résumé had nothing to suggest I would be a qualified baby holder. But she warmly told me, "I'll help you hold him." It struck me that she is baby's mother. She is the one who decides who is qualified to hold him. I took him in my arms and soon I began to feel comfortable with that tiny little warm cooing creature in my arms, and soon I no longer feared holding him. Now, twenty-seven nieces and nephews later, holding a newborn child is one of the great joys of my life.

Do we sometimes think that Jesus is given only to the highly qualified, special religious people? In the Gospel of Luke today we hear about the presentation of the Lord in the temple. The newborn son of God is passed around like a baton in a relay race, not guarded like a precious jewel or a breakable china dish. We can see him going from the arms of Mary to Joseph, then to the priest performing the ceremony, then to Simeon the old man, then to Anna the old widow. Each one receiving him and then handing him to the next. A tidal wave of joy and thanksgiving follows wherever he is placed.

Believe me, you are qualified to hold Jesus in your arms. How can I say that with such confidence? Because the mother decides who is qualified. The Blessed Virgin, embodied in the Church, holds him out to you and me. She rejoices to place him in our arms to hold, and to hand him on, too.


Consider a Priestly Call...Take a risk for God!


Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
