



Dear Parishioners,

With great hope and genuine pride, the Church begins this new year with a celebration of Mary, Mother of Jesus, proto-disciple and model of strength, grace and courage for all believers. Mary's own history was inextricably bound to that of Jesus, and she is portrayed as such in scripture.



Mary's name is first mentioned in reference to Jesus' conception. She is featured, particularly by Luke and John, at each of the significant moments of Jesus' life - from His birth to His ministry, to His passion, death on the cross and burial.

Wherever she is mentioned in scripture, Mary is represented as an exemplary disciple; that is, as one who hears the word of God and keeps it. The process of hearing God's word and translating it into words and actions requires lifelong effort, and the Gospels gives us a clue as to how that effort began for Mary. In today's Gospel, the evangelist tells his readers that, "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." Literally translated, the Greek verb *symballein* means, 'to toss things together in one's heart.'

Let us ask Mary to intercede for each one of us.

Con gran esperanza y genuino orgullo, la iglesia inicia este nuevo año con una celebración de María, Madre de Jesús, protodiscípula y modelo de fortaleza, gracia y valentía para todos los creyentes.


La propia historia de María estaba indisolublemente unida a la de Jesús, y así se la describe en las Escrituras. El nombre de María se menciona por primera vez en referencia a la concepción de Jesús. Ella es presentada, particularmente por Lucas y Juan, en cada uno de los momentos significativos de la vida de Jesús, desde su nacimiento hasta su ministerio, desde su pasión hasta su muerte en la cruz y sepultura.

Dondequiera que se la menciona en las Escrituras, María es representada como una discípula ejemplar, es decir, como alguien que escucha la palabra de Dios y la guarda. El proceso de escuchar la palabra de Dios y traducirla en palabras y acciones requiere un esfuerzo de toda la vida, y los evangelios nos dan una pista de cómo comenzó ese esfuerzo para María. En el Evangelio de hoy, el evangelista dice a sus lectores que "María guardaba todas estas cosas, meditándolas en su corazón". Traducido literalmente, el verbo griego *ymballein* significa "revolver las cosas en el corazón de uno".

Pidámosle a María que interceda por cada uno de nosotros.






