Dear Parishioners,

This liturgical year is very special for me. (Tomorrow, on Monday, I'm celebrating my 53rd birthday – I know, many of you still tell me that I'm a young boy.) This weekend we are celebrating the great Solemnity of **PENTECOST**. **Why is it so important for us? Because Pentecost is celebrated as the birthday of the Church.** When the Apostles were gathered together, the Holy Spirit came to them as a strong wind, descending upon them as tongues of fire. Inspired and empowered by the Spirit, Peter and the others began preaching the word. We are told later in this chapter, in Acts 2:41, that *about three thousand persons* were baptized that day. The Church was born.

Over 2000 years later, **Jesus is still alive in the world and the Spirit continues to work through us, his followers.** It must have been something to be in that room when the Holy Spirit entered into the midst of the disciples gathered there! Though that must have been amazing, **the truth is that the Spirit is still present today. He comes to us as well.** You and I are ordinary people capable of extraordinary things because of the power of the Spirit in us and in the world. **His grace inspires us to spread his word, care for those in need, comfort those who suffer, and to live as believers in this world in need of God's love.**

Birthdays are often an occasion for gift-giving. Pentecost is no exception. **The Holy Spirit bestows abundant spiritual gifts on believers.** These gifts may not come in a brightly wrapped box, but their worth is beyond measure. They give us strength when we are weak and courage when we are afraid. We are granted **wisdom** to inform our judgment and **understanding** to help us see God in what surrounds us. The **gift of counsel** allows us to be directed by God in matters necessary for our salvation. **Fortitude and fear of the Lord** give us a firmness of mind to do good and avoid evil and help us understand God's power as we hold him in awe and adoration. We are granted **knowledge** to correctly judge matters of faith and right action (*for that we have to pray constantly in our community*), and **piety** to devote ourselves to God and open ourselves to his will.

These gifts are freely given and provide all we need to live as children of God. We are called to use these gifts to fortify our faith and serve the Father. If someone gave us a new phone, we would not keep it hidden in its box. A new bike would not be left unused in the garage. Instead, we would put them to good use and likely think of the person who gave them to us whenever we used them. In the same way, **the Holy Spirit remains with us and wants us to use his gifts to help us grow in our faith and become closer to God.** His gifts can also help us call others to join us on our journey. These gifts are not meant to be kept hidden or to be used only for our own needs. They are meant to be shared. They are meant to inspire others and invite them to join us in the family of God. Happy Feast-Day!

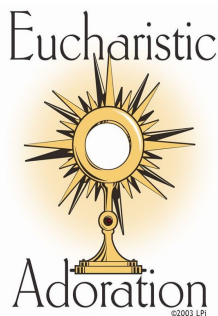
You are invited to come before Jesus in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Come to quiet your heart that you might hear his heart speak. All are welcome.

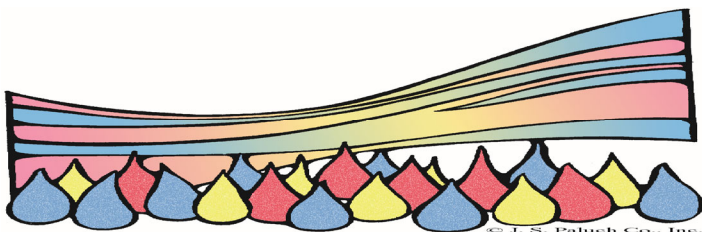

Pentecost Sunday

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“Peace be with you.” On hearing those four simple words, the fear that had paralyzed the disciples gives way to rejoicing. We, too, can feel paralyzed at times – by fear, yes – but also indecision, conflict, negativity, and perhaps even headlines that remind us how fractured our world has become. Yet here is Jesus, wishing us peace and giving us the gift of Pentecost: our Advocate, the Holy Spirit. As Jesus breathes on the disciples, he confers upon them a Spirit of peace that will allow them to push past their fears and build up the Church. “Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” We, too, can turn to the Holy Spirit in times of trouble to help us move forward in faith, sharing peace and reconciliation with those we encounter.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Sometimes after a tiring or stressful day, I head up to my room, kick my feet up, and mindlessly scan social media or whatever other distractions might pop up on my smartphone. A friend read somewhere that doing so amounts to effectively putting your time in the shredder! Today’s readings challenge me and all of us to dig deeper. Why not, instead, find a quiet place to pray, asking the Holy Spirit for a refresh as we move into the next part of our day, which is indeed the first minute of the rest of our lives. There’s nothing wrong with downtime! But in the Holy Spirit, we can find a source of inspiration, energy, and creativity. As St. Paul writes to the Corinthians, “There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.” Just as Jesus sent out the disciples, he sends us out to share our gifts to build up the Church.

PRAY *We thank you, God, for the ways your Holy Spirit helps us see your love through the people and world around us. We thank you for the gifts of the Spirit within us and for the gift of your Son, Jesus Christ. Holy Spirit, open our hearts as we listen to your word. We ask this in Christ’s name.*

To Retain or Not Retain?

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Acts 2:1-11 - Descent of the Holy Spirit
- ▶ 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 - Many gifts, one Spirit, and the analogy of the body
- ▶ John 20:19-23 - Appearance to the disciples
- ▶ or John 14:15-16, 23b-26 - The Advocate

Scripture gives us two different accounts of the coming of the Holy Spirit to read from today. One is from the author Luke in the Acts of the Apostles, which we hear in the first reading. The second is from John's Gospel. How the apostles historically received the gift of the Spirit (tongues of fire or Jesus' breath) is less important than what resulted when the Spirit filled them.

The coming of the Holy Spirit sparked a tremendous change in the lives of the disciples. Whether they received the Spirit when Jesus breathed on them (just as the first human came to life when God breathed into him) or when a great wind brought tongues of fire to them, they became the best versions of themselves. Before the coming of the Spirit, they were a fearful, closed group, hiding out, paralyzed to continue Jesus' ministry of healing and teaching. Once Jesus came to them and offered them his peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit, they immediately transformed. Rejoicing replaced fear, and the willingness to move outward to minister to others replaced their desire for safety.

The beauty of the Spirit's working in the disciples' lives is that God didn't need them to become different people. They were still a motley crew of illiterate fisherman from an area of the country not known for anything of significance. What they learned is that regardless of their

lack of education, wealth, or social status, God could do incredible things with and through them. Jesus didn't ask them to continue his work of building the Kingdom of God by themselves. From the day of Pentecost on, they had an Advocate to teach them, strengthen them, and embolden them.

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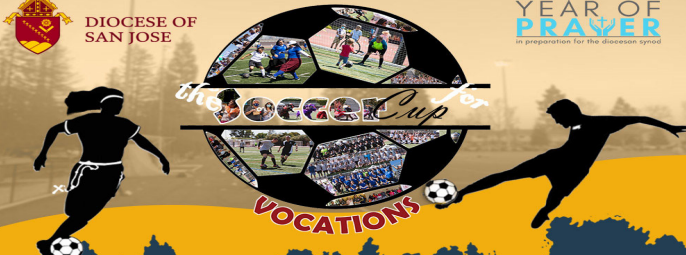

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2022 Mass Intention Book

The 2022 Mass Intention Book is now available to accept requests for prayer intentions. *Just a few reminders:*

- A \$10 stipend (offering), as determined by diocesan policy, is requested for each Mass intention.
- Mass intentions must be paid BEFORE the day the Mass is said.
- You are permitted to put down up to TWO individual names per intention.
- There is availability for ONE intention per Mass time.
- Please be mindful of others who are trying to reserve Mass intentions. We, therefore, ask you to practice prudence in reserving your Masses, being mindful that others may have the same date in mind.
- Intentions cannot be made on Holy Days and some parish feasts days as these are Masses that are offered 'Pro Populo' (for the people of the parish).
- You may submit your Mass request by mail, drop it off in person, or drop it in the collection basket.

A request may be made for: a person who is living, a person who is deceased, members of a family, in Thanksgiving, etc.

CELEBRATION OF LIFE - FRIENDLY REMINDER

As Catholic Christians, our funeral and memorial celebrations enable the Christian community to mourn, as well as to hope by focusing on the mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ.

Please, first contact the Parish Office or Fr. Tad if you are planning a Funeral Mass or a Memorial Mass for a loved one at St. Anthony Church.

You will be provided with our necessary guidelines which are established to assist in effectively preparing the funeral rites with individuals and families.

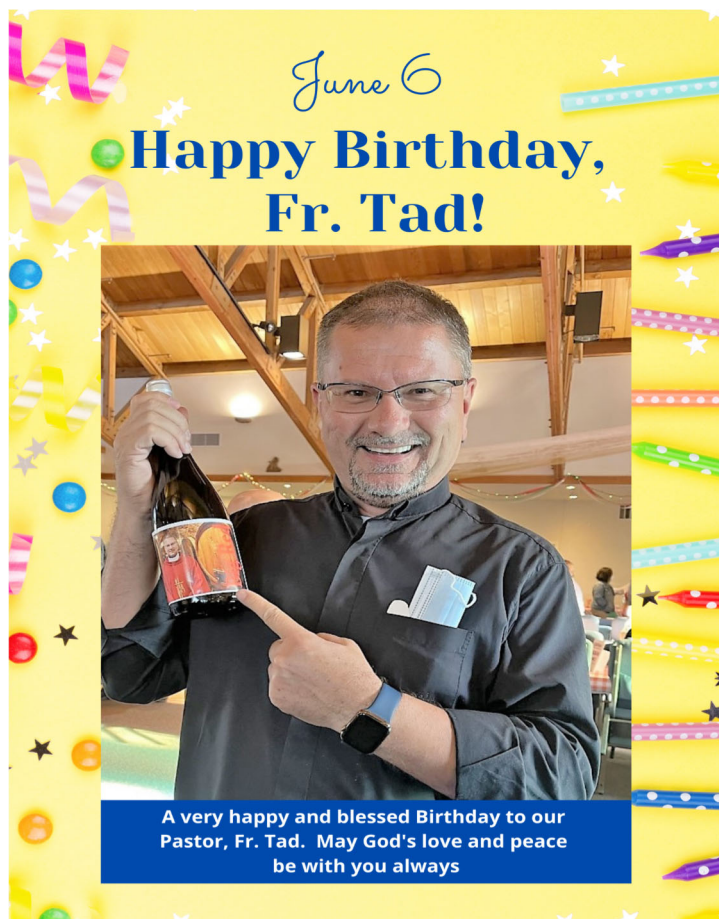
