FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It is not uncommon to hear the words *disciple* and *apostle* interchangeably. While both are part of our faith lexicon, they do not mean exactly the same thing. Today's Gospel helps us to understand them and how they relate to our Christian identity. Jesus, having previously called the Twelve and sent them out to preach and heal, is now sending seventy-two more disciples – again with the same message and task.

So, what is the difference between the two? By definition, a **disciple** is one who learns from or follows: a student. It is the root of the word “discipline.” Each of us, by our baptism, is made a disciple of Christ.

An apostle, on the other hand, is one who is sent forth – to preach and share the teachings of another with others. These two titles, or descriptions, are different and yet related – for clearly, one must be a disciple before being an apostle. Otherwise, what would one have to share and preach?

Saint Paul, writing to the Galatians, knew the difference and fully embraced both identities. Having begun as a persecutor, Paul encountered Christ on the road to Damascus and experienced a radical conversion to being a follower of Christ. Through that first life-changing moment and then, through the witness of the other disciples and the community in Damascus, Paul is equipped to be both disciple and apostle.

Historically, the Scriptures – and the Church – have reserved the use of the word Apostle, with a capital “A,” to refer to the Twelve – or, with a lower case “a,” to mean those of Jesus’ time who were sent with the authority of Christ to evangelize. **All Apostles are disciples, but not all disciples are apostles.** More colloquially, many of us may have heard it said that *“we become disciples by our baptism and apostles (lowercase “a”) at our confirmation.”*

Despite this lesson in etymology and historical usage, the focus here is really less on the “titles” and more on the roles. We, too, must first embrace the Gospel and make it our own – become that disciple who not only knows its challenges and joys but is intentional about living out its mandates on a daily basis. Only then can we be prepared to embrace our identity as apostles – who go forth as missionary disciples to share the Gospel with others.

People often ask why being part of a parish is so important to our identity. The answer is simple: **The parish should be a place where every believer finds the resources and opportunities to grow as both disciples and apostles. The PARISH should be a house of prayer, a school of formation, and a refuge in times of need.** It should equip the faithful at all levels to be ready to live and share the Gospel.


This coming week, perhaps we might reflect on our role as disciple and apostle and on how well we are prepared for the mission. May God help us rely upon him for our needs.





GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

So what comes to mind when you imagine your dream road trip? A well-planned route with scenic stops, nice hotels, good restaurants and quirky sights along the way? Jesus may be my copilot, but given his words in today's Gospel I'm not sure I'd want him to be my travel agent! As he sends the 72 ahead of him, he gives them no illusions about the mission that lies ahead: "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." Settle for the first house that welcomes you, regardless of the amenities. Eat and drink whatever they offer. Give those you encounter a greeting of peace and remind them the kingdom of God is at hand. As always, Jesus gives these travelers all they will need to share the Good News with others. They return rejoicing! The early disciples refute my "travel agent" doubts, as they show us by example to place our trust in God and take nothing for the journey except our faith and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, we can rest assured that our "names are written in heaven."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I'm a planner. When we went to Disney World, my sons split off from me after I unveiled an app that would show us exactly which ride or attraction to hit based on crowd numbers, time of day and other variables. I loved that app! So had I been one of the 72 we read about today appointed by Jesus to spread the Gospel in pairs, hopefully my companion would not have abandoned me because of my insistence on planning. Ultimately, our journey of faith - as we share it with others and walk toward the kingdom ourselves - is not something we can choreograph. The more we plan and the more baggage we carry, the less likely we are to hear God's voice cutting through the noise. By stripping away the nonessentials, we can place our trust in the Lord, who will show us the right path. When we place our lives in the service of the Lord, the harvest will be abundant.

PRAY Many U.S. dioceses will be welcoming newly ordained priests this month. Pray for them as they begin their ministry, and pray for more vocations.



This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Isaiah 66:10-14c - Mother Zion
- ▶ Galatians 6:14-18 - The Cross, our true boast
- ▶ Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 or 10:1-9 - Mission of the 72

Twice in the Gospel of Luke Jesus sends disciples out to spread his mission by curing the sick and preaching the Kingdom of God, a realm of peace, justice, and compassion for all. The first time, in the chapter before this reading, Jesus sent out his 12 apostles. In the passage today, he sends out a larger group of 72 others. It seems Jesus realizes that he needs more than 12 helpers in this work!

It's likely that this larger group of 72 included women as well as men. In chapter 8, Luke mentions by name several women who accompanied Jesus in his ministry including Mary Magdalen, Joanna, and Susanna, "and many others, who provided for them out of their resources" (Lk 8:2-3). When Jesus sends out the 72 they are sent out in pairs. In the Acts of the Apostles and Paul's letters, there are references to married couples who work and travel together as missionaries.

Jesus instructions were practical for missionaries of his day when the early Christians relied on the hospitality and generosity of other open-minded individuals who wanted to hear about Jesus' teachings. He did not want them weighed down or slowed down by hauling their material possessions, and he challenged them to stretch to trust in God's care for them provided through others. He also gave them advice about what to do when they were not received well, the proverbial "shake the dust from your feet" which Jesus demonstrated in last week's



reading when he wasn't received in Samaria. Although we may not be full-time Christian missionaries today, all of Jesus' instructions for how to conduct ourselves in our daily lives can still be relevant and offer guidance for our work and personal relationships

July 3, 2022 • 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time • Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus Sends His Disciples

Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples and sends them, along with the apostles, into the various towns and villages. He tells them to carry no money or sack, but to rely on the hospitality of the people in the town. If they are welcomed in peace, they are to stay. If not, Jesus tells them to leave. "...[T]he Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs..." (v. 1).

The disciples were going out to preach on their own. Jesus knew the difficulties they would encounter, and so he sent them out in pairs. This is a really important point. It is so much easier to get things done, to manage difficult situations or to even celebrate our accomplishments with the help of others. We all need support and encouragement. One of the first things Jesus did when he began his public ministry was to gather a group of people whom we call *apostles* and *disciples*. Even Jesus needed a community to walk with.

This is why belonging to a church is so important: Not just to have a group of people with whom to worship, but also to have a community to nurture and support you and your family. The church community is asked to serve as a model for us and our children; sometimes even offering an alternate lifestyle to that of the culture in which we live. We need to surround our children with people who share the same values.

Church is a family, and like every other family, the church is not perfect. Every church makes

mistakes, sometimes really big ones. As we do in our family, we try to forgive and move on. Every church community will have its characters, its misfits and its sinners. We are not expected to like every member, but if we make an effort to get involved in church activities, we often meet people who can become surrogate family and lifelong friends.

FAMILY RESPONSE

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Is the parish community an important part of your life? If not, why? How can you become more involved? If you are involved, what are the fruits of your involvement?

SIGN-UP for Sacrament of Confirmation in JULY.

We accept sign-ups for the Sacrament of Confirmation and encourage the parents to sign up your children ASAP. [Why it is important to be confirmed?](#)

Confirmation is a sacrament of initiation in which the one who is confirmed (confirmandi) receives the gifts of the Holy Spirit through the imposition of hand and anointing with oils by the bishop. This sacrament establishes young adults as full-fledged members of the faith and it is called **confirmation** because the faith given in baptism is now confirmed and made strong. During your baptism, your parents and godparents make promises to renounce Satan and believe in God and the Church on your behalf. At confirmation, you renew those same promises, this time speaking for yourself. During confirmation, the focus is on **the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles on Pentecost and gave them the courage to practice their faith**. We believe that the same Holy Spirit confirms Catholics during the sacrament of confirmation and gives them the same gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. These gifts are supernatural graces given to the soul. It might be a time for your children to experience those graces.

Rehearsals for the 8:30 AM Mass are on Tuesdays at 7:00 PM and Sundays before Mass at 7:30 AM.




