

Dear Parishioners,

Today's Gospel recounts the Last Supper with Jesus and his disciples. Although we are familiar with this story, there is one detail we can focus in on today. **As Jesus is at table with his disciples, he takes the cup and describes it as** *my blood of the covenant*. Covenant is a unique term in our religious language, and one we do not usually encounter in our daily lives. **It signifies a holy agreement between us and God.** It also shines a light on who we are as God's people.

Moses was the leader of the people of the (first) covenant. **Bound to God in love and worship, they were his chosen ones; he was their God.** Today we heard proclaimed that Moses was following the word of the Lord. To seal his commitment to the covenant, he sacrifices young bulls and uses their blood. This was a serious action that showed unwavering commitment. We know how momentous Moses and this moment was in salvation history.

And yet **Jesus goes far beyond this sacrifice**. At the Last Supper, he takes the bread and the cup, blesses them, and gives them to his disciples. **He proclaims that this is the new covenant**. As was proclaimed in our second reading: For this reason, he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance (Hebrews 9:15). **This is the new holy agreement between us and God.** This is what defines us as God's people. This is what we remember and give thanks for with every celebration of the Mass.

As we celebrate **the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, let us reflect on how it defines who we are. It is not just about the sacrifice of Mass we take part in on Sundays, but rather it imbues our whole being. We are a Eucharistic people. We give thanks for the abundant blessings God has given to us, especially the salvation won by his Son. We remember his sacrifice and use it to guide us in how we live in the world. How we see ourselves and how we treat others is rooted in our belief that God loves us so much that he sacrificed his only Son. His Son willingly took part in the sacrifice so that we can be part of his eternal kingdom.

This Sunday, we will once again gather around the table, hearing the words Jesus first spoke at the Last Supper. Let us pray for the grace to grow in understanding of the Eucharist and ourselves. We are a people to whom God gave his only Son to save. We are a people called to be a blessing for all. **Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we remember and give thanks for the new covenant Jesus established with us**. And we will celebrate the importance of that covenant by having a procession to 4 altars after the 10.30am Mass. Let us show that we are Eucharistic people by attending that procession that happens only once a year and let us pray together:

O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, All praise and all thanksgiving, Be every moment Thine!

Now come, all you who labor In sorrow and in pain, Come, eat this bread from heaven, Thy peace and strength regain.

Lord Jesus, we adore thee, Our Victim and our priest, Come, eat this bread from heaven, Thy peace and strength regain.

Lord Jesus, we adore thee, Our Victim and our priest, Whose precious blood and body Become our sacred feast.

O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, All praise and all thanksgiving, Be every moment Thine!

We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?




