

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Interestingly, the Gospel chosen for this feast day does not include a story of togetherness and harmony in the household, but of separation and anxiety. Then again, it is in those moments when the opportunities for reliance on God and the striving for holiness are most visible and appreciated.

We know the story: Jesus remains in the temple when everyone else leaves Jerusalem to return home, and after three days of searching for him, Mary and Joseph find him sitting, listening to the teachers and asking him questions. They have been anxious and concerned.

But Jesus says, *Did you not know I must be in my father's house?* Jesus' utterance of his divine mission shows an obedience to the [heavenly] Father, while not dismissing that which was due to Mary and Joseph. They do not fully understand, but they acknowledge and love. Here, in this very statement, Jesus points to God the Father as his father. It is here that Jesus puts forth his divinity. Jesus, fully God and fully human, lays forth who he is at the age of twelve. Mary took all of this and pondered it in her heart, just as she did the prophecy of Simeon. While this statement of Jesus may not have been known to everyone, there was something in Mary that stirred her to keep it close in her heart, because her son was slowly revealing himself to the world.

Even in the midst of beginning to reveal his divinity to the world, Jesus went home with Mary and Joseph to learn from them. It was under the tender compassion, wisdom, and purity of Mary, and the chaste devotion and loyalty of Joseph that Jesus *advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man*.

Even in those early childhood years, Jesus was about the Father's business. The Holy Family models for us that holiness in families is possible. And that holiness within the home leads each of us to be about the Father's business and will in our lives.

Jesus, though he was God, obeyed Mary and Joseph in the most perfect and pure sense. When reflecting on the evangelical counsels, obedience is one of the vows that religious profess. Humble obedience allows for us to more clearly see the Father's plan for our lives. Jesus models obedience in the home of Mary and Joseph. He models what it looks like to honor father and mother and yet, at the same time, he completes the Father's will.

Mary kept all these things in her heart and pondered them. May we, too, find our hearts constantly pondering the mystery of Christ and his great love for us.



Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14 | Col 3:12-21 | Lk 2:41-52

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. These are the attributes Paul instructs the Colossians in today's reading to "put on" or to "clothe" themselves with. It's quite a list, isn't it? Paul goes on to talk about the virtues of the Christian family, which is fitting for today's Feast of the Holy Family. It is reasonable to expect, then, that the Gospel passage would follow through by expounding on the virtues of the perfect family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Instead, in Luke's Gospel, we have the only story in all of Scripture of Jesus' childhood. The only one that shows the specific interactions of them as a family - it tells the story of Jesus at age 12 who stays in Jerusalem without Mary and Joseph knowing and who are unable to find him for days. Prayerfully reflecting on this unique glimpse of the Holy Family working through misunderstandings, fear, and hurt helps us relate even more to the true humanness of Jesus and the Holy Family.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In the Holy Family, we see a model of relationship in human form. We are part of a holy family as well: we are children of God. And like Mary and Joseph, our family is enriched and strengthened when we are attentive to the presence of Jesus in our lives. Luke writes: "[Mary] kept all these things in her heart." Like Mary, let us strive to hold Jesus' words and commandments in our hearts so we can focus on God's divine plan for our lives. In the next line of Paul's letter offering us the "tools" for loving relationships (compassion ... patience) he adds, "bearing with one another and forgiving one another." In other words: love. We must put Jesus, who is love, at the center of our relationships and do everything in his name. Then our family, and our lives, will be holy indeed.
