

Dear Parishioners,

These last weeks we have joyfully followed the news and the Masses celebrated by our Pope Leo XIV almost forgetting that not so long ago we had enjoyed the "old" Pope Francis. Even though he has returned to his Creator, we still remember him and it is by his words that I would like to start the reflection on the feast of the Ascension:

"The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew" (Evangelii Gaudium 1). These words from Pope Francis, penned in the first year of his pontificate, truly were an apostolic exhortation to all of us in the Church: understand that the Good News of Jesus Christ is one of abundant joy!

We have heard this before, surely. We know we are not talking about an emotion, or a feeling. We are talking about a fruit of the Spirit. A fruit whose seed may be sown through knowledge of Jesus and his mission, but whose growth and flourishing occurs in the rich soil of a life of faith. Through the Holy Spirit we encounter the Divine Person of Christ, who forgives us and sets us free from sin. Our life then takes on a new direction animated by a relationship with God and the resultant pursuit of the good. All of this, together, bears fruit that is joy.

Thus, it is no surprise that, in the Gospel, after Jesus ascended to heaven before his disciples, the disciples immediately went back to Jerusalem with great joy, praising God in the temple unceasingly. After everything they have seen, they are driven to be persons full of joy and praise. They have seen and interacted with the risen Christ and now they have seen him glorified in his ascension, knowing of the promises he has made and fulfilled. Their encounters with – their relationship with Jesus has transformed them, and through the grace of the Holy Spirit this transformation has borne great fruit.

We are also sent forth in this joy. It drives us to accompany those who feel cast in the shadow of sin. It shows us the way to be God's merciful presence in the world. It compels us to be with those who are suffering or in sorrow. It is what gives us strength to be with those who feel emptiness or loneliness for whatever reason. When we do these things, something new is created. To follow God's way is to renew ourselves in the joy of the Gospel. We are disciples with joy to bring. To truly evangelize in this world, we must start by bringing joy to others. This joy is inexhaustible.

We are not alone on this journey. The Eucharist, our holy feast, renews our joy with God's real presence with us. May we give thanks and praise God unceasingly.

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Every day the world urges us to place our trust in countless things: money, brands, self-improvement methods - all with instant results! As Christians, however, we know that only God's promises are worth betting everything on, and they are not fulfilled on our self-determined timelines. Today's readings portray Jesus, the wounds of his crucifixion still visible, accompanying his followers for 40 days after his resurrection. Now the Apostles, some with questions of their own, are asked to wait once more for "the promise of the Father" of which they heard Jesus speak: baptism by the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. For the Apostles as for us, following Christ is not an easy path, the Apostles likely were wondering what to expect in this "baptism." The fulfillment of God's promises doesn't always happen quickly, nor are we usually able to grasp the big picture at the moment of fulfillment. Nevertheless, it is in these periods of waiting that faith takes root and deepens. Uncertainty makes room for faith, and as the Holy Spirit descends into our life and makes things clear, we see the beauty in God's mysterious and loving plan for us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There's a saying, "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." It is often a matter of timing and expectations around life that can sew doubt into our faith. In the first reading, the Apostles ask the resurrected Christ if now he would restore the kingdom of Israel. He responds, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons." We are reminded that our faith never obligates us to know what events are to come, and which date in our calendars to mark. Our role, as the second reading says, is to let our "hearts be enlightened, that [we] may know what is the hope that belongs to his call." We wait in faith for the Holy Spirit to move and enlighten us to what God wills. We can rest secure in the assurance that we will be given all we need.

PRAY

Is your prayer sometimes full of questions about God's timing and intentions, or are you able to wait in faith for God to act? Ask the Holy Spirit for the faith and hope you need to remain at peace as you wait. Then, keep your eyes fixed on Christ, and be not afraid.


