

Dear Parishioners,

Before ascending into heaven, Jesus asked his disciples to remain in Jerusalem and await the coming of the Holy Spirit. This they did, and today we hear an account of that powerful day when the Holy Spirit descended upon those first disciples. With a noise like a strong driving wind, and tongues as of fire that came from the sky, the Holy Spirit transformed the disciples and gave birth to the missionary Church. This Church would go forth to the ends of the earth proclaiming that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God, through whom God offers us salvation and forgiveness of sins. From this day forward, the Apostles would go on to courageously and boldly preach the Good News, no longer afraid they might be arrested or executed for their efforts.

And because those first Apostles responded to the working of the Spirit within them, the Church grew. And because of the response of countless Christians over the ages, the faith has been handed on from generation to generation, making it possible for us to gather today to hear this message of salvation, to celebrate the liturgy, to receive our Lord in the Eucharist.

And today, it rests on our shoulders to respond to the promptings of the Spirit in our lives and contribute our part in the building up of the kingdom of God. Lest we feel inadequate or not up to the task, Paul reminds us that we have all received the same Spirit the Apostles received. At our baptism, we received that same Holy Spirit who filled those first Apostles with seemingly superhuman courage and zeal for the Gospel. At confirmation, we received the fullness of the gifts of the Spirit to better equip us to fulfill the particular service to which we are called.

And when we think about that service, let us remember that we are not just talking about work and volunteering at the parish and helping our loved ones and neighbors in need. We are talking about all those things but in so far as they are oriented toward the spiritual, as a means through which the Holy Spirit sanctifies us and can bring about the sanctification of others.

So, on this day of Pentecost, let us ask the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts and transform us so that all we do may be oriented to our sanctification and for the benefit of those around us.

June 8, 2025 Pentecost Sunday Acts 2:1-11 | 1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13 | Jn 20:19-23 or Jn 14:15-16, 23b-26

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's first reading, we join the Apostles in the Upper Room. These individuals had accompanied Jesus to his death and been witnesses to his resurrection and ascension. Can you imagine the throes of emotion accompanying each experience? Now, they gather together, perhaps discussing what to do next. They wonder where they should go, and who they should listen to, since Jesus was no longer there: "And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind." In a moment swelling with grace, tongues of fire descended upon each person present, "and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." What might this moment have sounded like? Looked like? Felt like? The Apostles were weary and grieving, but Jesus made a promise he intended to keep — that he would send an advocate in his name to teach them everything. That same Spirit now waits to guide and empower us if we are willing to receive him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Jesus' death left his followers grieving and disoriented. They had left everything to follow him. And now, he was gone. What would become of them? Jesus said: "I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." On this feast of Pentecost, Jesus' promise is fulfilled. When the Father sent down the Spirit, it was not just for a singular, grand moment in time; the Spirit came for good. In the same way the Apostles were strengthened by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, so were we strengthened at our confirmation. We were commissioned, as were they, to live out our faith in the world. When we need strength in this mission, let us remember that the word advocate comes from the Latin word advocatus, which means "one who draws near." Come, Holy Spirit, come!

REFLECT

Read the Veni, Sancte Spiritus ("Come, Holy Spirit") prayer that we heard before the Gospel today. Each line, laden with powerful imagery, invites us to understand the Spirit more intimately. Reflect on where you experience the Holy Spirit in your life today, and where you long for a greater outpouring of his fire.
