

Dear Parishioners,

Many of us have likely struggled with understanding the ways that God answers prayer. We have asked for something – healing for a loved one, freedom from a particular vice, or maybe clarity in discernment – and perhaps God's answer seemed to be no ... or even worse, nothing.

This is a common experience, and the good news today is that our Sacred Scriptures show us that this is a deeply human experience throughout all of time. From the outcries of the prophets, of kings, of Job, the psalmists, and other ancestors in faith, those who have put their trust in God down through the centuries have felt this longing or frustration or confusion again and again. We are not alone in this struggle.

Fortunately, that is only half of the good news. The Bible is *not* the story of those who reached out to God, felt frustrated with the lack of response, and then walked away to live forever in this longing. All of Scripture witnesses to another, much more fundamental truth: God is faithful, God is merciful, God hears our prayers.

In the Old Testament, we see repeatedly how God's people fall short and even complain against God, yet still God is faithful; he responds to our cries when we turn back to him and seek him. Abraham intercedes again and again on behalf of the innocent and God replies with mercy every time. The God of Abraham was radically merciful, and this abundant mercy set him apart from the other deities whom the pagan nations worshipped during that time.

As Christ teaches us how to pray, he likewise exhorts us to be persistent as we ask for the Holy Spirit who guides us. The Father, he assures us, knows how to give good gifts. And so, we can continue to pray with deep trust. Scripture tells us that we may have to keep

asking, but something powerful happens in that repetition. As we ask, as we return to the source of mercy and love, we are changed. We encounter God himself, and this is the best possible gift he could give us. Lord, when I called you answered me; you built up strength within me, says today's psalm.

May this Eucharist help us to be persistent – trusting that Christ, who gives himself to us perfectly in the Blessed Sacrament, will give us all we need.



Gn 18:20-32 | Col 2:12-14 | Lk 11:1-13

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Sounds lovely, doesn't it? I remember understanding this verse as though God is like a genie in a bottle and prayer is like a delivery service. But when I encountered true hardship, this interpretation was tested. I was seeking, but I couldn't find what I wanted. My request seemed to go unanswered. I was asking, but my hands were empty. I couldn't reconcile this. Did this mean God wasn't telling me the truth? Trusting that couldn't be the case, I pressed in a little harder. In time, and through the grace of God, I realized I'd been reading this verse through selfish eyes. I was understanding this passage to say, "ask for whatever you feel like in the moment, and I'll drop it on your doorstep." But what does Jesus actually say? He says that if we ask, he will always give us the Holy Spirit. This understanding can change how we pray. The Lord doesn't promise to instantly cure our maladies, or to remove every ounce of pain on this side of the veil. But he does promise to send his Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with us through it all. And that is far better than any type of delivery service.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's psalm echoes the Gospel message that the Lord never abandons us. In our response, we unite our voices with the universal Church as we say, "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me." We encounter hardship on a daily basis. From the tiny irritations that tempt our tempers to flare to the heavy crosses we carry, we are reminded of how much we need God's help. And yet, how often is our response to turn inward and grow weary, discouraged, or angry? Next time we come eye to eye with a challenge, let's try to respond like the psalmist, and cry out to the Advocate. He is very near. *Come Holy Spirit*.

REFLECT

We are reminded in today's readings that the Lord is always near, that he hears us, and that he responds generously. Thank God this is true even when it doesn't seem like it. As we face our daily hardships, let's not forget to ask Jesus for help. Don't forget that he never rations the Spirit, and though he will never force himself on you, he's waiting eagerly to pour his love into your heart. Ask! Seek! Knock! He knows your voice, and he is ready to respond.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION – NEW CONFIRMATION PROGRAM THIS FALL


Religious Education Classes for children at Saint Anthony Parish start at the beginning of September. Please, sign-up your children.


