

Real Presence

Ouestion:

How do you explain "Real Presence" to children?

Answer:

The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he's God. He comes to us in holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.

Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question "why," and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. "Unless you turn and become like children, you will

not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3).

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope this letter finds you and yours well. As we continue to pray for peace at home and across the world, our Combined Collection for World Charities to be conducted in each parish on the weekend of June 17-18, provides each of us with a welcome opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters far and wide. Clearly, the needs are great and remain in flux given the Russian/Ukraine war, other conflicts, poverty, famine and natural catastrophes. We ask your prayerful consideration of the following causes:

Catholic Campaign for Human Development - The Catholic Church's domestic anti-poverty agency which works on solutions that not only address the symptoms of poverty but also the root cause. From this collection 25% of the CCHD money stays in our diocese to empower those living in poverty and to better the community; 75% supports national grant and education programs.

The Catholic Relief Services Collection - The official international relief and development agency of the Catholic community in the United States; helps victims of war and natural disasters receive emergency assistance; assists migrants and refugees who need housing, education, and legal assistance; and supports travelers and people whose livelihoods require special pastoral support and access to the sacraments.

The Church in Central and Eastern Europe Collection – Supports the Church in more than twenty-five countries that are still struggling to recover from former communist rule. Programs covered consist of pastoral care, catechesis, renovations, and seminary formations, education, and poverty outreach. Your support helps the Church bring Christ's mercy to vulnerable people, such as the Ukrainian refugees, the poor, seniors, and people with disabilities.

Holy Land Collection - This collection assists the Franciscan Fathers and the Latin Patriarch in their ministry to pilgrims, in the maintenance of the Holy Places, and in their pastoral, charitable, educational, and social works which the Church supports and provides to native Christians in the Holy Land.

I thank you in advance for prayerfully considering your participation in this very important effort. Any donation is truly appreciated and has the ability to spread God's mercy and love. Please return your completed envelope on commitment weekend, June 17/18 or by the end of June to your parish office. May you be blessed abundantly for your generosity.


