

Thoughts from the Second Floor Front XXXII Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 6, 2022

The religious leaders of Jerusalem in this section of Luke's account attempt to incriminate Jesus with the Romans and to discredit him with their own people. They pose a number of questions to Him about His authority, about payment of taxes and about the resurrection. Recall that the Pharisees believed in the spiritual world and recognized the resurrection of the dead and angels, whereas the Sadducees believed in none of that. Through their convoluted arguments the Sadducees were essentially trying to set Jesus up by asking the unanswerable. It would be like asking if God could make a rock so big that even God cannot lift it? There is no way to approach it with reason. It is on a par with: Do you still beat your dog? If you answer no, the next question is: Oh! When did you stop? Or if you answer yes, you appear cruel and violently impulsive.

Both groups rely on Moses and the Mosaic Law for their theology and spiritual lives. Jesus once again bests them by citing Moses as His authority of life after death and the resurrection of the dead. The farcical conundrum that they place before Jesus today is an attempt to put Him in a position in which He either contradicts His own teaching or affirms the position of the questioners, who are showing themselves to be more than a bit sophomoric. At the basis of their problem is that they believe God must act in accordance with their own directives, leaving no room for Divine initiative. The Lord will have none of it. This scene provides an opportunity for Jesus to teach that their expectations, however much cloaked in piety, fall far short of the creative and merciful power of God.

In addition to the Pharisees' desire to trip Jesus up in clever argumentation is their own desire to hold onto the status quo. Their effort to demonstrate that Jesus violates the Mosaic law and upsets the balance of things, especially their own authority, falls flat. The last thing the Pharisees desired would be to have their position in the community threatened, let alone overthrown. However, that is precisely what He does. When Jesus enters our life, He has a way of changing things; changing us. Sadly, not unlike the Pharisees, we resist the change. It may not be the sentiment that "things were better in the good old days" but we human beings do have a tendency to cling to the familiar even if that effort thwarts our growth.

St. Paul is a great one for "going forward," a weak and overused phrase that is regularly employed to accept present situations that are less than ideal, while doing nothing to alter the future. It has the sound of professionalism and gives the mere appearance of control. St. Paul's forward thinking and acting vision is articulated excellently in the reading from Thessalonians today: "*May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father...encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word... so that the word of the Lord may speed forward and be glorified.*" There is nothing weak in Paul's articulation of his hopes for the people of the early Church. He warns them to be careful and encourages them "to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ."

We are fast heading towards the end of the liturgical year. The readings will speak of the end of human existence as it once was and its transformation into an existence within the very Kingdom of God. That change need not wait for the "last days." God can work change within us now. This change will make demands on us as Jesus made demands on His contemporaries. The call is to see the world and human existence in Christ's terms not our own. To look at people as Jesus does. To move away from sin and live in freedom as a disciple of the Lord Christ. This ultimately requires discipline and like the word disciple, they both require effort.

Jesus calls on us to change. As Ferocious Flannery O'Connor once wrote: Human beings vigorously resist Grace because Grace changes us and change is difficult. Jesus calls on us to be made new in His Spirit and to affect the people and the world around us, so that both they and it are made new in Christ.





ANOINTING OF THE SICK



When: Sunday, November 6th at the 9:00 am and 11:00 AM Mass.

Where: Please sit in the 6 front pews all around the front of the church. You may have one other person with you if you wish.

Who: Please let us know if you wish to receive this Sacrament by emailing the PLC at stcorn1@comcast.net or by calling the PLC at 610-459-2502. This will give us an idea of how many people wish to participate and help us to record who has received the Sacrament.

Why: When the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. A person should not wait until they are at the point of death to receive this Sacrament.




