Thoughts from the Second Floor Front VI Sunday of Easter

May 14, 2023

This weekend Jesus tells us that He loves us. That is not only good to know; it is good to be reminded of that reality. In his first encyclical, Our Holy Father wrote the following

There is an urgent need, then, to see once again that faith is a light, for once the flame of faith dies out, all other lights begin to dim. The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating every aspect of human existence. A light this powerful cannot come from ourselves but from a more primordial source: in a word, it must come from God. Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals his love, a love which precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives. Transformed by this love, we gain fresh vision, new eyes to see; we realize that it contains a great promise of fulfilment, and that a vision of the future opens up before us.

Lumen Fidei § 4

Love is a word that is used for all sorts of things. It is the subject of tinny sounding songs on the radio and the theme of sometimes-sloppy sentiment found in greeting cards. The sort of love to which Jesus refers today is unique. It is called unconditional or disinterested love. There are certain qualities to this love. St. Paul goes on beautifully with his descriptors of love as patient, kind, long suffering and gentle in the first letter to the Church in Corinth.

Our Holy Father lands on the key point about Jesus telling us that he loves us. That love is transformative; with the confidence that the knowledge of God's love for us gives we are empowered to live in manner that is foreign to those who do not know God. When I was Academic Dean at St. Charles Seminary I would regularly meet with the faculty for a variety of reasons. On more than one occasion I would challenge the individual professors with the question: What difference will the treatment make? In other words, when those seminarians walk into your classroom in September at the start of the semester and then walk out at the end of the term in December, what difference will be achieved because of the learning experience? How will they be changed?

So, to you I put the question: What difference will the love of God make in you? Will it be transformative as Pope Francis asserts in his encyclical? Will you have fresh vision and new eyes to see? Will you recognize the future opening up before you? We can all certainly be weighed down by the burdens that seem to be so much a part of our lives. But the Light, which is Jesus has come into the world. Jesus also said: I am the way and the truth and the life. There are some ancient manuscripts that have that verse this way: I am the way to truth and life. Know Jesus, know truth. No Jesus, no truth.

Recently I once again picked up C. S. Lewis's work Mere Christianity. Lewis has a terrific ability to present complicated theological issues and through a series of analogies probes and explains some of the essential aspects of what it means to be a Christian in language that makes Christianity accessible. He begins, as all good theological reflections begin, with philosophy. The philosophical school that drives most of Catholic theology is based on the teaching of Thomas Aquinas. Aquinas, unlike an increasingly larger number of people today, even believing Catholics, recognizes the existence of objective reality. There was a time, and it was not centuries ago, when people were fairly able to recognize something that is true and something that is not true. In the homily he delivered before the conclave that elected him pope, Cardinal Ratzinger, warned of the dangers of the moral relativism that has been creeping into our culture, society and even our families. I regularly assert that because we know Jesus, we must live in a manner that is different than those who do not know Jesus.

Reflections on Jesus' Ascension

On the feast of the Ascension, we are called to rejoice both in Jesus' victory over sin and death and in the glorious life that he has secured for us. We pray that we would experience the new life that is ours in Christ.

Three aspects of that new life stand out in the Second Mass Reading for the feast: "May you know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19).

As Christians, our hope is secure because it rests in Jesus' death and resurrection. Because Jesus has overcome sin forever, we can live in freedom and peace, no matter what situations we may face. We have been reconciled to God. We are no longer strangers. Every day, we can live in confidence, knowing that our God is with us to strengthen and comfort us.

Our hope is also founded in the inheritance Jesus won for us—none other than being with our Father forever, knowing him intimately, in all his splendor and beauty. In his ascension, Jesus has opened the door for us. Though we are sinners, we have been forgiven and redeemed. We are now fully loved and accepted as God's children, and we will live with him forever.

As we live every day in the hope of our eternal inheritance, however, we can begin to taste these blessings here and now. This is part of the "immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe." Before he returned to his Father, Jesus promised his disciples that anyone who believed in him would be able to cast out demons, heal the sick, and perform signs and wonders in his name (Mark 16:17-18). How? By the power of the Holy Spirit, who lives inside of us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is in our hearts, inviting us to yield to him and empowering us to live in the victory of the resurrection. No challenge is too great for a child of God!





Easy to operate: put 2 batteries in and you are good to HEAR!





St. Francis De Sales once observed that there is nothing small in the service of God. Over the past 40 years, Monsignor Diamond has humbly dedicated himself to embracing each call to serve our Lord by His grace, both in and Sincerely, through his vocation.




