Thoughts from the Second Floor Front IV Sunday of Advent

December 24, 2023

On this fourth Sunday of Advent we stand at the close of that season and at the threshold of the celebration of Christmas. The fourth week of Advent begins today and ends today. It all goes by too quickly. The Church gives us the Annunciation scene from Luke's account as our gospel passage. That is followed by our Lady's great prayer. The Magnificat.

If Advent is about preparation and transformation that prayer is about the reversals that God can accomplish in our lives and has accomplished in our world. Mary announces that in His goodness God has looked upon his lowly servant and has raised up the lowly. This is not simply an articulation of her humility. St. Luke uses words that carry with them the connotation of having little if any social status and implies being pressed down by forces beyond the control of the individual. Her condition is not humble; her condition is of no social value. Yet God has raised her up for all generations to call Blessed.

God continues this reversal throughout all of society. This is good news for the poor, who have nothing on which they can depend for their security; God will raise them up. It is bad news for the rich, the power brokers and those on thrones; they are about to be cast down. But the prayer is not about the vengeance of the disenfranchised; the 'have-nots' finally get a hand up not a hand out and the "haves" finally get what's coming to them. It is not about revenge. Anyone who uses Sacred Scripture as a club against someone misuses the gifts of God's word and is guilty of assaulting the Kingdom itself.

Mary's prayer is a call to every believer to pay attention to the work of God in the world and in your life. In the upcoming days of the Christmas celebration engage in a little reflection. Reflect on the enormous joy children can have at this time of year. Consider the good people in your life. Ponder what it would mean to you if you did indeed let the Lord have His way rather than yours. We know that Christmas is more than the gifts, the decorations, the carols or the lights. Mary's prayer is a profound recognition that, against all odds, God has worked a wonderful thing in her life. The same can be said by every disciple.

The season of Advent moves too quickly and in our culture, Christmas seems to last just the one day. When I was living in a parish in Bethesda while I was a student at Catholic University, I became friends with a couple from Ireland. We explored aspects of our own homeland, the similarities and differences between the Irish and American cultures. They reported two characteristics about the States that were both a source of surprise and puzzlement. The first was our fascination with the weather. That we have a television station which reports on the weather all day, every day simply astounded them. In Ireland, if you don't like the weather, just wait fifteen minutes and it'll change.


The other matter that confounded them was the way we celebrate Christmas. We do it all in one day. By the time dessert is served at the Christmas dinner we are talking of disassembling the decorations and packing the tree up for another year. We all go back to work the next day like nothing has happened. What is the rush? Take time after Christmas Day to be still and quiet and pause.

Seize the opportunity that Grace has given you in this season of goodness and good wishes. If you do not find the peace and goodness of the season readily at hand, ask yourself what you are doing to bring it about. Turn to the first chapter in St. Luke's gospel and pray on that.

Give it 15 minutes; you won't regret it.






Monsignor's Thursday Email



BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS TREE

Christmas is almost here! Have you blessed your Christmas tree yet?

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of Epiphany. The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

In the home the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent or another family member, in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time on Christmas Day.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.

[The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."]

[The leader may greet those present in the following words]

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.

[One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, **Titus 3:4 (lines 4-7)** or **Ezekiel 17:22 (lines 22-24 4**; I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel.)]

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

[The intercessions are then said. The leader says]

Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts. That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

[After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer. *Our Father who aren't in heaven...]*

[The leader says the prayer with hands joined]

Lord our God,

we praise you for the light of creation:

the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night. We praise you for the light of Israel: the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son: he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fills us with the wonder of your love. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The lights of the tree are then illuminated. The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

[The blessing concludes with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"]

O come, thou dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night and death's dark shadow put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
