

Thoughts from the Second Floor Front XXIX Sunday in Ordinary Time

October 19, 2025

The readings from Sacred Scripture this weekend address that necessary element in the life of a disciple, an element that demands discipline – persistence. This persistence in prayer seems today limited to the prayer of petition. The woman in the gospel perceives that she has been wronged and she knows who has wronged her. Our stick-to-it-tiveness, our tenacity, our persistence is also to be seen in our life as a disciple in the manner we live the faith. Each week at the Sunday Mass we stand and we recite the Creed; that most basic and clear articulation of what we believe; the basic doctrine of the Church. It is possible to profess the doctrine of our Church without any faith; merely reciting the words week after week without pausing to understand what we say. This of course, leads to the question at the end of the Gospel passage. The question could be, not: “But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?” Perhaps the question should be more pointed: But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith in me?

Moses’ persistence is in standing face to face with opponents in a battle. There are times when it seems that we are battling: in society, at work, in class, at home, with each other. We are not continually called to confrontation. Confrontation is not always a bad thing. One thing confrontation does for us immediately is that it shows us who’s on our side. Look around you at those moments. It can be quite revelatory when you discover with whom you’ve cast yourself.

St. Paul continues this mandate at faithfulness and tenacity even in the face of opposition when he writes: *Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed...* We have been hearing from the Pastoral Epistles for the last several weeks now. They are unique in Paul’s writing; differing from his other writings. His concern is on correct doctrine and avoiding the influence of Gnostics who are trying to introduce teaching other than the gospel into the life of the community. This effort at watering down the message of Jesus continues into our own day. I saw a quote the other day in an article in which a professor of Theology was describing an aspect of the Catholic faith that one student was not willing to accept. The response of the student to the professor, in rejecting this doctrine was something like: You’re a Pope John Paul and Pope Benedict Catholic. I am more a Pope Francis. The response was, in effect, a rending of the unity of the Church by setting up camps the individual asserted was more in keeping with his or her viewpoint.

I think our Holy Father, Pope Leo, would be rightly horrified at such an alignment.

It is not to a political or perceived left or right leaning theological position one espouses in which we make our profession of faith. Our faith rests in the belief that by His dying and rising, Jesus has redeemed all of humanity.

In his recently issued Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi Te* (I have loved you) Our Holy Father, Pope Leo, has written to all Christians on love for the poor. If you are looking to align yourself with something, try taking that one on and, with faith in Jesus Christ, live those words that we heard from St. Paul *Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed...* We do that every time we manifest our care for others.



CRS NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

In a roadside kiosk in the town of Sébougou in Mali's Segou region, three young women serve peanut butter, ginger juice and hibiscus to a steady stream of customers. Just months ago, they were out of school, uncertain of their futures. Today, they are entrepreneurs, learners and leaders. Catholic Relief Services has been working in Mali, together with Development Canada, to enable girls to get back to school and start thriving businesses.

Mali, a vibrant yet deeply challenged nation in West Africa, is home to 22 million people facing persistent insecurity, forced displacement, and a weakening education system. Nearly a third of Mali's population (around seven million people) needed humanitarian aid last year. More than half are children, and education is one of the hardest-hit sectors. Of this population, girls are especially vulnerable. Nearly 1.7 million girls are out of school, almost half of all school-aged girls nationally. To address these challenges, the Girls' Education Challenge Project, funded by Global Affairs Canada and implemented by Catholic Relief Services, is helping children return to school and create economic opportunities for young women through vocational training. 

PERSISTENCE

Today's readings are about persistence, passionate persistence. Exodus tells of a battle won despite weariness because Moses, with help from Aaron and Hur, held his hands raised. Timothy asks that same persistence of his community and us. Luke tells of a court case won by a widow, despite the dishonesty of the judge, because she will not leave him alone. The psalm reminds us that God is everywhere, guarding us from harm day and night, coming and going, now and forever. The readings are about persistence, the relentless, unwavering pursuit of what must not be lost. The readings are about God's passionate persistence in pursuing us, seeking to win our hearts.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short

prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!
