I have some news to share with you and, as the saying goes, I've got good news and bad news. I always recommend to people in the confessional that they start with the stuff they really don't want to say first and get it over with, so I'll begin with the bad news.

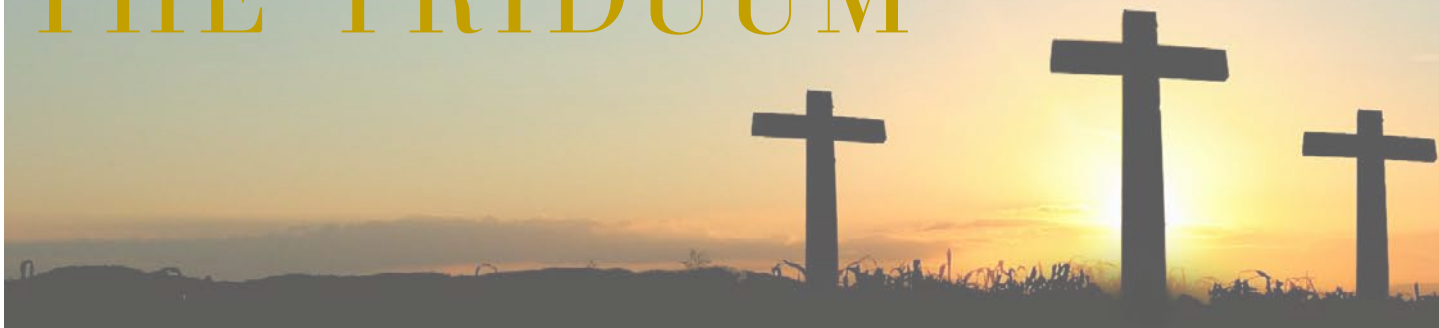
I received word from Bishop Thomas this week that my time in Sandusky as associate pastor of our three parishes and priest leader of our catholic school will come to an end on June 30 this year. I am heartbroken to leave Sandusky and words cannot express how much I will miss seeing you all on a regular basis. I am so very grateful to God that he brought me here and brought me into your lives. Being your priest is not just a job, and so my pastoral care and affection for you doesn't stop just because my assignment here has ended. I learned after leaving my first assignment at St. Rose that the whole situation is like welcoming another child into a family. You don't stop loving one parish just because another parish comes into the picture. My priestly heart is not divided, but rather expands in love to welcome in even more of the family of God. And the Catholic world is small enough that I'm confident that we will continue to be connected long after my assignment is over.

So now, the good news. I am thrilled that the Bishop has assigned me to be the Pastor of St. Thomas More University Parish on the campus of Bowling Green State University starting July 1! Diocesan priests are ordained with the goal of becoming pastors... so this is what I have been preparing for during my time as a parochial vicar these last 6 years. I was a student at BGSU only for my freshman year of college, but that is where I had a profound experience of conversion and first discovered my vocation to the priesthood. I know first-hand the powerful impact that Catholic Campus Ministry can have in the lives of college students and I can't tell you how excited I am to be part of that.

I look forward to continuing my ministry here in Sandusky for the next three months, virtually over coming weeks and hopefully in-person sometime soon. Let's all keep each other in prayer during this time of pandemic and during this time of transition. God is in control and he always has good things planned for those who put their trust in him. 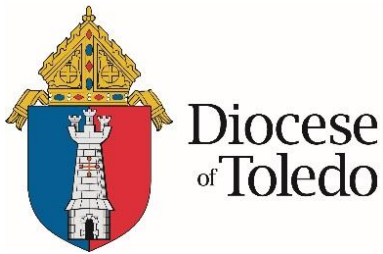
1 Make an act of faith

Pope Francis has granted a special plenary indulgence to the faithful suffering from the coronavirus. A plenary indulgence is an opportunity for the faithful to live in a spirit of personal conversion during these trying times, removing temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence is granted to those suffering from the coronavirus who, detached from sin:

- Participate spiritual through the media in Holy Mass, pray the Rosary, practice the Stations of the Cross or other form of devotion, or
- Recite the Creed, Our Father, and piously invoke Our Lady
- To receive the indulgence, the faithful must also plan to fulfill the usual conditions of an indulgence – confession, reception of the Eucharist, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions – as soon as possible.

Health care workers and those who expose themselves contracting the virus to care for people infected by the coronavirus will also receive the indulgence under these conditions. It is also offered to the faithful who have not fallen ill to the coronavirus who:

- Visit the Blessed Sacrament or read Sacred Scriptures for at least half an hour, prays the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet, practice the Stations of the Cross, and asks God to end the epidemic, relieve those afflicted by it, and eternal salvation for those who have passed away from it.

Connecting During COVID

How Diocese of Toledo priests have connected using social media

In these days of stay-at-home orders and social distancing, priests have had to come up with innovative ways to reach their flocks. Since the initial temporary dispensation from attending Mass, the list of parishes live-streaming their Sunday Mass has grown each week. It's new territory for priests and parishes. Just as the list grows, so does the streaming expertise. That's not to say there haven't been hiccups now and then - from audio issues to upside-down videos and even to accidental filters! But the response from the faithful has been a resounding thank you. Fr. Matt Rader, pastor of St. Mary in Tiffin and St. Pius X in Sycamore, remarked that his parishioners have been "hugely appreciative, people are thankful that I am remaining connected and providing them the variety of opportunities." Fr. Rader is one of the priests who have branched out to share videos beyond Masses. He live-streams rosary and Stations of the Cross (often with associate pastor Fr. Manoj Mammen appearing). But his most successful video has been a light-hearted attempt to make people smile. The video is Fr. Rader's Neighborhood, a light-hearted parody of Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood, with thousands of views. The Sandusky parishes had success with a unique video, as well. Cooking with Fr. Hoyles was a live-stream video featuring Fr. Monte Hoyles, with the help of Fr. Jeff Walker and Fr. Chris Jesudhasan, cooking dinner and dessert and inviting the viewers to cook along. Fr. Hoyles explained, "We can't be together physically, but we can bring pastoral care and enjoy good human interaction by undertaking things like evenings where the priests just sit down and interact on Facebook Live, or by having an evening where the people can join me in the kitchen through social media to cook a meal."

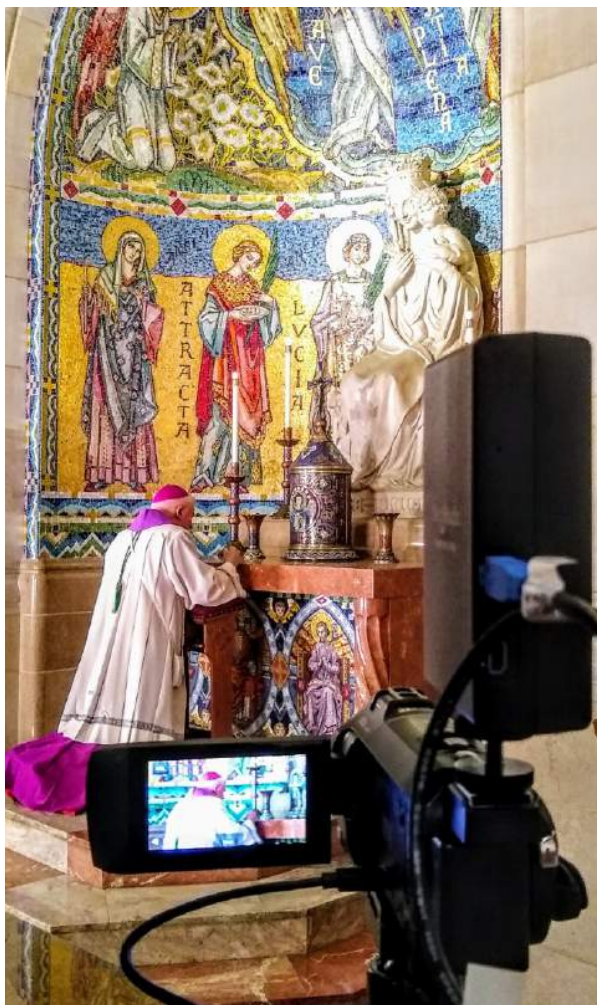
The impact has reached far beyond parish boundaries. Fr. Eric Mueller, pastor of St. John the Evangelist in Defiance, said, "People have appreciated our social media presence. It has helped them to feel some connection. I have heard from people outside of the diocese and the state as well." The Diocese of Toledo has been sharing one Mass and one or more devotions each day from parishes live-streaming all across the Diocese of Toledo with great success. "Love seeing all these parishes and getting to know new priests," said one commenter. The connection is what the faithful craves. Bishop Daniel Thomas has posted a Message to the Faithful each week. The videos are to "ensure each one of you of my support and closeness in prayer." That goal underlines the reason so many priests and parishes have increased their social media presence and found new ways to connect with the faithful. "Life in Christ isn't simply about weekend Mass, but being a member of a community. Our goal was, is and will remain—even after the pandemic—to be a Catholic community; to remain in as much contact with our parish family as we possibly can," said Fr. Hoyles.

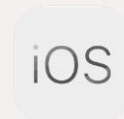
