

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin



THE DESTINY OF ALL MORTAL FLESH. The celebration of today's feast on a Sunday is unusual on our Roman Catholic calendar. Our observance of the Lord's Day is held in such high esteem that few other feasts replace it. Occasionally there is a feast—usually of one of the saints—in which the saving power of God in Christ is so uniquely focused that the Roman rite deems it worthy of celebration on the Lord's Day.

Today is such a feast. Yet some are surprised at the brevity of the dogma in its entirety: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The Roman Catholic Church never defined any specifics or particulars about the event itself. It is not in the scriptures. There are no verifiable eyewitness accounts. At its core, the dogma reveals in Mary the destiny of all mortal flesh, and reinforces our creedal belief in resurrection of the body. This feast strengthens our faith, defined last week in Hebrews as the realization of things hoped for. We find, in Mary, that realization of what we all hope for, what Paul today affirms: "In Christ shall all be brought to life" (1 Corinthians 15:22). Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

History & Purpose of the Senior Luncheon Ministry

The Senior Luncheon Ministry Program started four years ago in June 2017. It was started by our coordinator, Suzanne Gooch, as a social program for senior members of our Parish, 60 years and older. The purpose was to have a monthly social and luncheon for our seniors so they could get out for a luncheon and not have to pay a large amount for their meal. We offer a 'full lunch' consisting of an appetizer, main (meat and two vegetables), dessert and beverage—all for a donation of \$3.00 per person!

We meet the third Tuesday of each month, after the 12 noon Mass. At that first luncheon in June 2017, we had 28 seniors in attendance. Now we serve between 28 to 35 seniors each month. Reservations are required, so that we may purchase enough food to serve everyone, including members of our office staff and volunteers who help prepare and serve the meal. If you are interested in volunteering for this ministry or you would like additional information, please contact Suzanne at (803) 298-5038.

To help us enjoy the luncheon, a special theme is chosen each month by Suzanne and her team, and the tables are decorated in colors and décor to represent that theme. Once in a while, Suzanne will test our 'memories' with trivia questions about 'School Days of Old' or 'Do You Remember' unusual information about such subjects as our past presidents of the United States! Occasionally, she may ask everyone to bring a memorable item or picture to share with the group. For designated holidays, there is always a special program and a sharing of small treats.

All meals are prepared fresh that morning in the parish kitchen located in Saint Ignatius Hall by Suzanne and the volunteers. They are mindful of diet restrictions, so if you have a specific need please be sure to let Suzanne know. Also, a monthly door prize is handed out and Suzanne gives everyone a 'poem of the season' to take home. She calls this our 'food for the mind and soul'! Hope to see everyone at our Senior Luncheon—the third Tuesday of each month—for our 60 years and older parish members! 
