Three years ago, I was alone in a Mexican restaurant in Manning, South Carolina. And I froze. I just sat there in my booth, overwhelmed, and feeling a type of panic I haven't experienced before. I had a lot going on in my life, and I felt like I was drowning.

The waitress must have sensed something was wrong with me. She came and sat across the table from me in the booth and just looked at me for a moment. Then she spoke. 'Not doing so well today?' she asked.

'No ma'am, I've got so many things going on in my life and I'm feeling so overwhelmed right now, this booth feels like a safe, peaceful place that I just don't want to leave.'

'I understand. Well, here's the deal. You're not going to fix and overcome everything at once. It'll take some time to sort through things. So what if we just focus on what needs to be done the next hour? What do you have to do next?' I told her about a hospice visit I needed to make.

'Ok,' she replied. 'Here's what I want you to do. Just focus on living one hour at a time for the rest of today. If you start thinking about everything at once, you'll stay overwhelmed. So it seems to me that in order for you to calm down and breathe, you just need to have little, short-term goals. That'll work best for you.'

'Yes ma'am,' I said. 'I see your point.' 'Now, it's time to pick up those keys, walk out of here, and do what you need to do for the next hour. Then, when that hour ends, just focus on the next hour. Remember, one hour at a time.'

I stood up. She gave me a friendly hug. And she gave me a reassuring smile that seemed to say, 'It's going to be ok.' That talk helped me. It slowed me down. And it helped me deal a little better with the anxiety I was feeling. It turned out, she was right. Attributed to David Richardson

Maybe life for you feels like a smothering avalanche. Let me encourage you to slow up, whisper a prayer to God for peace, and focus on one hour at a time. Just think small right now. That'll make things seem a little more manageable for you mentally and emotionally. You can't deal with all things at once. Only God can do that. But what you can do is deal with one thing at a time, one hour at a time.

May the peace of God soothe your heart, mind, and soul today. May you feel the nearness of His presence, the warmth of His love, and the blessing of His grace. May you know He's got you in His hands, by His heart, under His eye.

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7.

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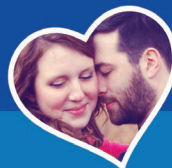
